THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriation for the same.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$619.69 for Town Road Aid, the State contributing \$2,478.74.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Class V roads.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

- 9. By request. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital of Plymouth, N. H.
 - 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of old cemeteries.
- 11. By request. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of the New Hampton Village Cemetery.
- 12. By request. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$160.00 to the Lakes Region Association, which is one one-hundredth of one percent of the assessed valuation. For the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, together with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.
- 15. To see if the Town will accept, and appoint three trustees to administer the Trust Fund for the perpetual care of the family burying ground of the David H. Smith family; one trustee to be appointed for three years, one for two years, and the third trustee for one year.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to patch and oil the road leading from the main highway to power plant of the Public Service Company of New Hampshire, and make appropriation for the same.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

- 18. To see if the Town will vote to buy a truck to be used on the town roads and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 19. By request. To see if the Town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.
- 20. To transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
- 9. To see if the district will give the School Board the authority to sell the Winona schoolhouse.
- 10. To act upon any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Again New Hampton is fortunate in having a teacher for each of its schools, when so many schools in New Hampshire this year have had to be closed and pupils transported to other schools in town, because teachers could not be secured.

At the present time it appears that the teacher shortage next year will be more critical than it has been at any time previously. If so, it is quite probable that one or more schools will have to be closed in New Hampton next September for want of a teacher. Every effort will be made, of course, by the board and superintendent to secure a teacher for each school now being maintained. If impossible to do so we ask you to graciously accept conditions over which we have no control and cooperate with us in whatever arrangements seem best to make to provide schooling for your children.

This year we have new teachers at the Fiske and Hanaford schools. Mrs. Maude Ware is at the Fiske, and Mrs. Thelma Bosley at the Hanaford. Mrs. Ware consented to take the Fiske school after it seemed we might have to close it for want of a teacher. Her consent to take this school is very much appreciated by the board and superintendent.

Mrs. Bosley was secured at the last moment, after Sanbornton had voted to close one of its schools to which Mrs. Bosley had been elected.

The total enrollment for all schools last year was 101. At the close of the year there were 92 enrolled. Nine had moved away from town.

At the beginning of the present school year in September the enrollment was the same as at the close of last year in June—92.

I am satisfied with the work being done in all our schools this year. The teachers are conscientious and

untiring in their efforts to give helpful service. The pupils for the most part, are interested.

You will notice from the Roll of Honor for Perfect Attendance that only two pupils had perfect attendance, both from the Hanaford school.

I trust you will read the report of Miss Heney, the school nurse, that you may better understand what her work is with the school children.

Visit the schools oftener that you may know what is being done there. Remember they are your schools and your children. It also would be encouraging to both pupils and teachers if you would show your interest in them by visiting them.

Two children were taken to Dr. Hernandez in Laconia.

One child was taken to the Orthopedic Clinic in Laconia.

The Red Cross has furnished cod liver oil in the rural schools for several years. This year they are using cod liver oil tablets, which the children think is a great improvement.

The audiometer was used. Of the 69 children tested four children were found to have a slight hearing defect.

I wish to express my appreciation to all those who have assisted in carrying out the health program.
