TOWN WARRANT
The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Ipswich in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs

You are hereby notified to meet at Appleton Academy in said New Ipswich on Tuesday, the Fourteenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects: *

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget and to raise as estimated therein the necessary funds to transact the business of the Town for the ensuing year.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money, when necessary, in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

5. To hear reports of any officials or committee and take any action relating thereon.

6. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget of the Electric Light Department.

7. To see if the Town will vote that beginning with the annual town meeting of 1968, and thereafter, the Road Agent shall be elected for a one year term by ballot. (By petition.)

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$6,500.00 for a dump truck for town road work or take any action relating thereto. (By petition.)

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$901.65 so as to receive \$6,011.01 from the State, for use in Class IV and V highway construction, reconstruction or betterment as provided under N. H. RSA Chapter 241.

10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$7,000 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town; King Road #87 and Wheeler Road #73, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of New Ipswich.

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600.00 to rebuild, as necessary, cap and oil the so-called playground road leading up to the Marvin Salmonson place, or take any action thereon. (By petition.)

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 (Two Thousand Dollars) each year for Capital Reserve Replacement Fund for replacement of Highway Department equipment. This money to be expended only on vote by the Town.

13. To see if the Town will vote to change and extend the hours of balloting at all elections, so that balloting will begin at 11 o'clock a. m. and closing at 7 o'clock p. m. (By petition.)

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,143.55 to be used in the development, maintenance and supervision of the Recreation Field, or take any action thereon.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 (Two Thousand Dollars) each year for a period of seven (7) years to be put in a Capital Reserve Fund to be used for a filtering system and deep well at the town swimming pool, or take any action thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$343.28 (six cents per thousand dollars of equalized valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of southwestern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

17. To see if the Town will establish a Town Conservation Commission as set forth in R.S.A. 36-A.

18. To see if the Town will vote to do one or more of the following:

- a. To close to public travel, and to abandon as a highway, that piece of road between Ashby Road and Rte. 123 & 124. This piece of road runs in front of Joseph A. Gill property and is already closed to traffic.
- b. The same to be conveyed by quitclaim deed of all the Town's right, title and interest therein, if any, to said abutter.
- c. To authorize the Selectmen to execute, acknowledge and deliver such deed or other instruments as may be necessary in the name of the Town.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

In making our report to the people of New Ipswich for the year 1966 we take much satisfaction in being able to tell you that our Town has never been in a better condition financially.

We have a Town debt of \$2600 and a savings account of \$2000 currently drawing 5% interest. This is, of course, the Capital Reserve Replacement Fund of the Fire Department as authorized by the passage of Article No. 14 presented last year by Chief Karnis.

The method of borrowing on the tax anticipation notes was changed and showed an income instead of an outgo. The money was borrowed in full and invested at once. The rate was $3\frac{1}{4}\%$. One third of the money was placed in a savings account to keep available for current needs: on this we received $4\frac{1}{2}\%$. the rest was invested in government bills and we received $4\frac{3}{4}\%$ and $4\frac{7}{8}\%$ interest.

All articles voted in by the Town at the March meeting, if not fully expended during the year, have to appear in the balance sheet to be held over until the following year.

We appreciate the cooperation of all departments and personnel concerned. Without this cooperation we would not have been able to accomplish such a successful year's business.

The scheduled summer season ran a period of 10 weeks with facilities being used by various organizations within the town throughout the season.

Edwin coached the Girls' Softball team with Ann assisting. The team is sponsored by Mr. and Mrs. Paul F. Cooper.

Water Show — This program is put on to give those who participated in various classes a chance to compete and display their talents to parents and friends, and to receive individual Red Cross Badges, certificates and awards.

The committee wishes to thank the citizens who donated money, time, labor, and equipment. It was deeply appreciated.

The \$2,130.69 in the expended budget of 1966 total includes the donation which is listed at the end of the actual 1966 budget.

I am grateful to the people in New Ipswich for being fire conscious, thereby keeping our fire losses at a minimum.

Calling for Emergency Service

Know your emergency number 878-1611. It is better to call this number 878-1611 because it is the emergency number of our Town that is manned 24 hours a day in the emergency communication center. This emergency number 878-1611 serves you better than the telephone operator because when you give your *Name, Street or Road, and Town Name*, and what your emergency is, the communication center knows who to contact in your Town — whether it's Fire, Police, Light Department, etc.

While your telephone operator gives you excellent service, it is impossible for them to know always who to get. The operator may have several emergency situations at the same time because the operator is the focal point of many Towns calling the "central" in Peterborough.

In addition, when you dial Operator, you're actually dialing four different towns that have people with names that are similar to yours, streets and roads with same names as in your Town, and etc. What the operator does know definitely is that the trunk line your message came in on is from the one that serves 878

numbers in four towns. To save time and frayed nerves, help the telephone operator and the emergency services for New Ipswich by dialing 878-1611 giving your name, road or street, name of your Town, and type of emergency.

This past year out-of-town departments have been called three times on fires that were in New Ipswich that the local Fire Department was not aware of until some lapse of time and monitoring of fire radios. These were alarms called in by dialing operators. One was a chimney fire, one was a roadside fire, and one was a barn and house fire.

Again, I repeat that fire losses in New Ipswich were held at a minimum with the cooperation of the townspeople, assistance from your neighboring town's Fire Departments, and the work of your local Fire Department.

FIRE RECORD

Fire records are made by people — those who cause fires and those who control them. Your forest fire warden, deputy wardens, fire chief and firemen have, in spite of a prolonged drought, made one of the best fire control records in recent years. Despite a very dry spring, we in New Hampshire working together, have substantially reduced our fire incidence (885 in 1965 to 595 in 1966.)

This enviable record is largely due to two factors:

1. A closely coordinated and integrated state-town organization jointly carrying out programs of forest fire prevention, training and suppression with dedicated personnel.
2. Your appreciation of our forest fire control program and your individual effort in practicing fire prevention.

Statistics show, however, there is room for improvement. Major problems are still with us: (1) the careless disposal of cigarettes; (2) the householder's carelessness in burning rubbish; (3) the failure of woodlot owners and contractors to completely extinguish their brush burning fires; (4) failure to extinguish camp fires; (5) unsupervised children playing with matches.

New Hampshire has 4,339,000 acres of woodland to be protected. In 1966 we experienced 595 forest fires on this area and restricted acreage burned to 395 acres — a fine testimonial to the efficiency and dedication of the men who make up our forest fire control organization.

1. If you must burn you will need a permit. Permits are not issued between 9:00 a. m. and 5:00 p. m. except on rainy days. Permits are not needed when the ground is covered with snow. To minimize risk the best way to dispose of rubbish is at your authorized town or municipal dumping area.

2. Be sure all discarded smoking material is out.

3. Don't leave a live camp or cooking fire.

4. Most important — instruct your children that matches are not play things.

ELECTRIC LIGHT COMMISSIONER'S REPORT

Our method of bookkeeping has been revised to proper perspective and adjustments made accordingly. An examination of our Annual Report by the Public Utilities Commission indicated very high depreciation expenses. Assistance to the Secretary was given by the Accounting Department of the Public Utilities Commission in posting the journal entries to adjust the plant accounts according to the study by the Staff Engineers.

In addition a complete set of plant accounts was set-up with the accrual for depreciation for each account.

Superintendent Fred Somero retired on January 3rd and at the presentation was given an engraved watch in appreciation for his many years of service to the department. Earl Dane was promoted to carry on the duties of Superintendent. After a reviewal of several applications, Richard Putnam was hired as permanent line-man.

We are in negotiations with Greenville Lighting Company to see if any change can be made in our wholesale rate. They are willing to review this matter as soon as their 1966 operating figures are available. This would further aid us in establishing a heating rate to the Town.

Continuation of our street lighting program with installation of the Mercury Vapor Lamps to areas where improved lighting is required is contemplated. Results of this type of lighting can be observed through the center of Town.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

This past year has been one of hard work for your school board and the special committees appointed to assist it. It has also been one of extremely significant developments which are bound to have lasting effect on the education of our children. Finally, it has been another year of improvement at Central School.

After hundreds of man/woman hours of work, plans and cost estimates are in hand which should result in an economical, useful, and infinitely expandable school building to house the fine new generation of children with which we are blessed. All possible sites for the new building have been carefully surveyed for present and future advantages to the town. This has proved to be a tremendously complicated subject, involving as it does a long, hard look into the future of our school system. The final decision was made on the basis of availability, size for future expansion, low development cost, and a location which will place New Ipswich in a good bargaining position should some alignment with our neighboring towns become necessary.

This last point brings us to the subject of the break-up of Supervisory Union No. 63, of which we have been a part. With the withdrawal of three member-towns who are joining the new Conval Cooperative District in Peterborough, Union No. 63 is no longer a viable unit and the school districts remaining are expected to be reassigned to the Jaffrey-Peterborough Union or the Milford Union. The problems this will bring to our District are as yet unclear, but it is safe to say we will have to be quick on our feet to maintain our identity and keep costs within reasonable bounds.

The New Ipswich School District's relationship with Appleton Academy is subject to high personal feeling within the town, but one or two hard facts concerning the future of this relationship must be faced by all:

1. In spite of the temporary easing of the overcrowded conditions at the Academy, due to moving 7th and 8th grades to the new middle school and the withdrawal of Temple students to the new Conval Cooperative, Appleton will still need new core facilities such as library, science laboratories and a new gymnasium.
2. To borrow money for these new facilities, the Academy must have 15 year contracts with *at least* the New Ipswich *and*

Greenville districts. Indeed, to provide secondary education at a price within reason Appleton must have the numbers of students represented by both the New Ipswich and Greenville enrollments. This is a requirement set by the Appleton Board of Trustees. Even so, the per pupil cost of this education is likely to be substantially higher than the state average.

The last bit of available space at Central School was converted into a temporary classroom during the summer and another teacher added to our staff, in order to keep up with ever increasing enrollment. Special recognition must be given to the entire teaching staff for their wonderful work under trying circumstances.

We feel that this year's teachers' salaries will justify their efforts on behalf of our children, as well as place New Ipswich in closer alignment with teacher salaries in this area.

There have been several successful meetings of the teaching staff with the school board in an effort to provide an atmosphere of mutual understanding and cooperation.

This year the board called for regular assignment of homework in reasonable amounts, for grades 4 through 6 to foster the habit of responsibility for study away from school. Further use of creative writing in various subjects was also stressed in preparation for the demands of junior high school.

The Central School building, while strained to the utmost, is in relatively good condition, thanks to the repairs to the plumbing system and roof, and to the good work of Mr. Kesti.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and citizens of New Ipswich, I respectfully submit my ninth annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

Staff and Instruction

Very fortunately, only one change in staff was necessary in New Ipswich Central School this year. Mrs. Aini Howe of Leominster, Mass., a teacher with many years of experience, was hired to teach the Sixth Grade in the new room that was provided. Mrs. Howe brings with her many, many years of elementary experience and certainly has been a welcome addition to our staff.

The Title I money which started the Reading Assistance Program last year, taught by Mrs. Ann Read of Milford, continues this year and proves again the worth of this offering. The test results have shown this program really makes a difference in the ability of youngsters to read effectively and efficiently, and more importantly, it seems to change the attitude of children towards school and reading to one that is far better.

Now that schools are in satisfactory operation, time has dimmed the anguish that this superintendent, and many other superintendents in the state, experienced in finding teachers for the current school year. This year the teacher shortage was even more severe than in any year in the past and it can be expected that the situation is going to become more of a problem with each coming year. This is not a situation which is peculiar to the state of New Hampshire but is a nation-wide problem.

There are several reasons for the unusual teacher shortage:

First, increased elementary and secondary enrollments; second, new educational programs stimulated by Federal financial assistance and local interest that have drawn off a number of teachers; third, migration of teachers to higher salaried positions in industry and also to other nearby states; and fourth, the inability of our state education training institutions to accept all those who are interested in going into teaching, because of the lack of sufficient facilities. These situations are not going to be immediately resolved.

New Ipswich was very fortunate in havtng a full complement

of teachers, as were all the other towns of the supervisory union, since a report issued by the State Department of Education indicated that as of August 30, 1966, just prior to the opening of school, there were still 158 classrooms that had no teachers. 96 of these vacancies were in the elementary school, 44 in the secondary school, and 18 in special classes.

The simplest way to solve this problem is to use every means available to the local district to encourage the present staff to stay in their positions and continue as teachers in the New Ipswich school. One of the best ways of doing this, is to try and insure that there will not be a migration of teachers into other communities, by providing salaries which meet the competition in the area. Within the budget presented to the district this year, fair salary increases are being requested to meet this need.

Building and Grounds

The building is not in bad condition, and this year we have had fewer difficulties than have been experienced in some years past. The new room location has not developed the problem some feared and it has turned into a pleasant satisfactory teaching area.

The only problem in the building is caused by the steadily increasing enrollment which reduces the amount of space available per pupil, in and out of the building, causing harder wear and making caretaking an increasingly difficult problem.

A Study Committee formed last March to look into a new building has been working long and conscientiously to come up with some reasonable plans for a solution to the space problem. I don't know of any committee that has worked with more diligence and investigated so many areas seeking a solution to this problem which New Ipswich faces. Before the regular School District Meeting, a hearing or hearings will be held in the town to make all citizens aware of the recommendations of this committee to the town. An Article will appear in the Warrant to provide funds for the construction of the "Middle School" which is being proposed. With the construction of this school, many of the problems being faced each day at Central School will be relieved and solved, until the next buildup of enrollment which is bound to occur as New Ipswich continues to grow.

Finance

There are several changes in the budget being proposed from the budget for the current year. In the No. 190 Item, a reduction of about \$3500 is shown since this amount was provided in the current budget to support the activities of the Study Committee. In the No. 210 Series, an increase of about \$7,000 is shown to provide for the increases for teaching staff previously referred to. Of this amount, \$100 was included to provide for psychiatric services for children in need of this kind of help. In Item No. 230 an increase of approximately \$700 is shown to provide for additional costs for teaching supplies and increased enrollment. In the No. 500 Series, an increase of about \$500 is requested to provide additional money for children attending the retarded class and also for additional children along the High-bridge Route and the back road to Greenville Route. Item No. 735 a decrease of \$2100 is shown since just about this amount was budgeted to provide for adequate roof repairs this present year. In the No. 1200 series, a decrease of \$2300 is shown since money was provided here for the construction and equipping of the new classroom. The \$385 in this Series requested this year is for additional chair and desk units for increasing enrollment. In No. 1477.1 an increase of about \$5000 is required to pay for increased costs per pupil at the junior and senior high schools of Appleton Academy. In Item No. 1477.3 an increase of \$1000 is requested to provide for a Superintendent's salary increase and increased salaries and expenses at the Supervisory Union Office.

On the income side of the ledger, a very sizeable balance of \$4931 was on hand at the beginning of the present school year; but, this coming year such a large balance (\$1500) is not anticipated. This difference reduces income by about \$3400. In Item No. 31 under Foundation Aid, the two factors which control this support will be changing, namely, the equalized valuation of the town of New Ipswich, and the amount of money that is raised for Foundation Aid by the Legislature. As long as these two factors are changing, it is almost impossible to accurately estimate the income to be received, so very conservatively, we are estimating \$33,500 which is some \$7000 less than was received in the current year. These two decreases in income result in a Total decrease of approximately \$10,400, which when combined with a Total Appropriation request that is increased by some

\$7200 results in a New Assessment to meet the School Board's Budget of \$160,089.88, some \$17,800 more than was asked for to support the present year's program.

Special Articles

A Special Article appears in the Warrant to give the District an opportunity to act on the formation of an AREA Study Committee. This type of study committee allows opportunity for a local committee to investigate an AREA Plan or a Co-op Plan with surrounding towns. This kind of study should be going on in New Ipswich until the junior-senior high school problem for New Ipswich has been finally solved.

An Article will also be found in the Warrant requesting money for a bond issue to support the construction of a new MIDDLE SCHOOL, and a related Article to provide for the interest for said bonds during the first year.

Conclusion

I want to compliment the teachers of the New Ipswich School for the excellent job they have been doing this year in meeting the needs of the children. Their efforts, along with the efforts of Mrs. Davis and the Noon Lunch Staff, Mr. Kesti, the custodian, and Mrs. Allen, Teachers' Aide, have provided an excellent school program and atmosphere for school life.

The New Ipswich Board has been most understanding of school problems and has worked hard and intelligently to solve them. They have been actively involved with the workings of the Study Committee, and have devoted many hours of time and expended much effort to further the progress of this group.

Citizens of the community have, as they have in the past, shown a sincere interest in the activities of the school and supported their programs in many ways, giving encouragement to the staff. A good educational program is being carried out and I feel sure that every thoughtful citizen fully appreciates the quality of the educational offering. The easy working relationship between staff, Board and citizens, has made possible a school program in which all can be proud.
