



The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said state qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for construction of the Class II road known as School Street and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$1,069.50.

Or will accept State Aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$462.92.

- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town highways.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$924 for street lighting.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to install three electric street lights on Highway No. 202 from Baptist church to foot of Drake's Hill and raise and appropriate money for the same. (By petition.)
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50 for the care of cemeteries as provided in Chapter 55, Section 4, Laws of 1925.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate in excess of that required by law for the Northwood Public Library.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to give 2 per cent. discount on property tax paid on or before July 15, 1936.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100 for water holes.
- 14. To see what action the Town will take in regard to leasing the School Lot to J. J. Carter.
- 15. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Citizens of Northwood:

At the last School District meeting, a committee consisting of John S. French, Chester W. Doe and Edward A. Lord presented a report on the Northwood School Survey under the headings of Nature and Purpose of Education, Constitutional Provisions, State Board, District Organization, School Board, Standard Schools, Calendar, Teachers, Buildings, Supervision, Health, Finances, and the history, status, curriculum, and outlook of Coe's Academy. Supplementary material included Graphic Reports of Intelligence and Achievement Tests, Classroom Time-Tables, Transportation Detail, Table of Teachers Employed, October Budget, Financial Estimate, Statistical Report, Financial Report, Report of Treasurer and Auditors, List of the Seven Cardinal Principles of Secondary Education, Contract between Northwood District and Coe's Academy, and charts showing the subjects covered in each grade of each of the elementary schools. This survey, as well as corresponding current material for any year is on file at the office of the Superintendent of Schools.

For many years the School District of Northwood has been carrying out the purposes and spirit of the new Municipal Budget Act adopted at last Town Meeting. Early in February a careful "estimate" of amounts required for the support of schools and other statutory obligations is drawn up by the School Board, including both expenditures and income expected for the year beginning the following July 1. This estimate is presented to the District Meeting as the basis of appropriations. In October, when the necessary expendi-

tures and actual income are more exactly known for the current year, a "Budget" is drawn up in detail and submitted to the State Board of Education as a basis for the state-aid of the following year. After acceptance, this budget must be adhered to by the Board, unless permission for deviation is obtained by the State Board. Any balance of appropriations found not to be needed is listed under expected income in the "Estimate" of the following year to be re-appropriated toward the budget and deducted from the amount to be raised at the district meeting. Mr. Roger D. Hutchins. Chairman of the School Board, was appointed to represent the School Board on the town budget committee. both the School Board and the Selectmen being entitled to one representative each, according to the terms of the act.

During the year a new and uniform reading system has been introduced throughout grades I-VI. This system has produced enthusiastic comments from parents and teachers wherever it has been used under my observation. Rational emphasis has also been given to oral reading. Reading ability is the principal basis of promotion in the primary grades and increased comprehension of silent reading is cultivated in the middle and upper grades as a tool for effective study in the grades and in high school and as a means of enjoyment and general culture. It is significant that reading is the only educational qualification required for voting. Parents wishing to cooperate in increasing the reading ability of their children can do so by talking with them about their experiences before they begin to go to school, also by furnishing them the opportunity to read good books and magazines and encouraging them to read aloud.

Under the direction of the school nurse, Miss Margaret Macdonald, two dental clinics were held during the last school year, with the cooperation of the Fed-

eral Child Health Recovery Program, the Red Cross, and the Harvey Lake Woman's Club. The Woman's Club has also furnished milk for several pupils during part of the present year, following the withdrawal of federal funds for this purpose.

New chimneys at both schools and a new porch at the Narrows School increased the safety and usefulness of those buildings.
