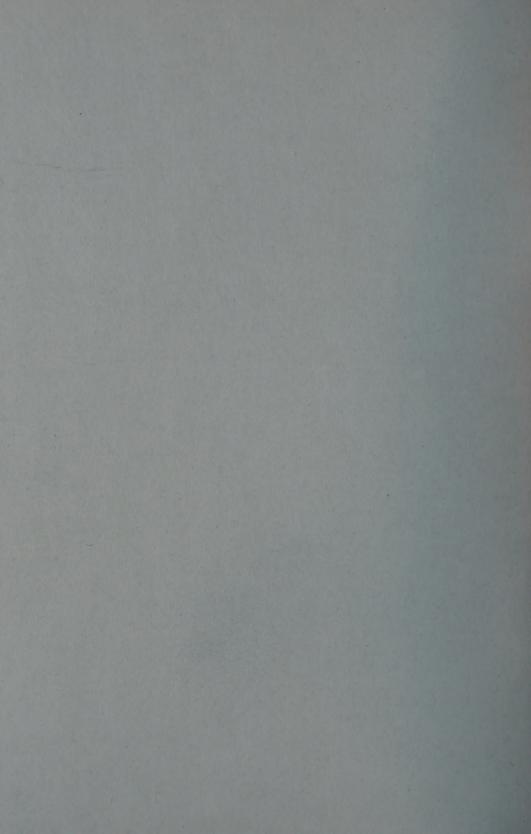

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WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

The Polls will be open from 10:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Bremer Pond Auditorium in said Pittsburg on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- To bring in your ballots for the election of one Selectman, for three years; one Road Agent, for one year; an Overseer of Welfare, for one year; a Trustee of Trust Funds, for three years; a Moderator, for two years; a Town Clerk, for three years; a Library Trustee, for three years; a Supervisor of the Checklist, for six years; and three Auditors, for one year.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to appoint all necessary Town Officers not listed under Article 1.
- To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to observe Old Home Day and elect a committee to set a date and manage the Old Home Day observance.
- To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for the Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) for the Vershire Center.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for the operating expenses and matching funds for Northern Coos Community Health Association.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) as the Town share of the operation of the North Country Council, Inc.
- 9. To see if the Town of Pittsburg will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600) for the support of the Community Action Outreach Program.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum

- of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) for the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund and authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund and authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) for the Ambulance Capital Reserve Fund and authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nine thousand dollars (\$9,000) for hot-top on Town roads and authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to replace the sidewalk between the town hall and Dalton Road with hot-top and authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for general repair to the sidewalks and authorize the withdrawal of this sum for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund.
- 16. (BY PETITION) Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:37 for the exemption for the blind from property tax? This statute provides that every inhabitant who is legally blind shall be exempt each year from the property tax on a residence to the value of \$15,000.00.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to oppose the burial, storage, transportation and production of high level radioactive waste in the Town of Pittsburg and State of New Hampshire; and to call upon Congress to conduct an independent investigation with full public participation into the feasibility and prudence of the US Department of Energy's (DOE's) present plan to dispose of radioactive waste and into the DOE's competence to carry out such a plan.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into an agreement with Phillip Fauteux to purchase his front-end loader and to use monies out of the road maintenance budget, total to be \$25,000, of which \$12,500 is to be paid in 1986 and the balance in 1987.

- 19. To see if the Town will vote to re-activate the Planning Board.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to establish a capital reserve fund for the Town Sewer, pursuant to RSA Chapter 35.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the Town Sewer Capital Reserve Fund.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to turn over the sand shed lot on Hall Stream Road to Alcide Beloin.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for the perambulation of the Town line.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the state, federal or another governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in RSA 31:95-b.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget and raise money for same.
- 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Polls will not close before 6:00P.M.

AMBULANCE CORPS REPORT

In 1985 the Pittsburg Ambulance Corps had a total of 22 members. Twelve of these are EMT's, six, advanced first aiders, and one R.N.

This past fall there was a new course given in Pittsburg, instructed by Mrs. Madelene Judd. Every Tuesday and Thursday evenings this class was held for three hours at the Pittsburg School, starting in September and going through until December. This was a First Responder course and also included training in Advanced First Aid and C.P.R. The program required a total of sixty hours of book work and station training. It brings our total membership up to 12 EMT's, 18 First Responders, and one R.N. This course was also given to the Advanced First Aiders as their refresher. All EMT's were recertified in 1985, for two more years.

First Responders are required by law to be recertified every 3 years, and EMT's, every two years.

C.P.R. training is required each year for the members of the corps to keep them up to date on their knowledge and skills.

All new ambulance attendants will be receiving "jump kits" which are carried with them in their vehicles. These kits are equipped with enough first aid material to treat an immediate injury until the ambulance arrives.

In 1985, the ambulance corps purchased two 2-way radios that are used by the corps for field work. These radios are kept in the ambulance at all times.

A blood pressure clinic is sponsored by the Pittsburg Ambulance Corps with Madelene Judd as co-ordinator. The clinic is held at the school library, and will be held on the first Tuesday of each month, from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

The four portable oxygen units are still available for use at any time. These units are located at Robert Gray's (Indian Stream), Paul Cote's Garage (Canaan, Vt.), Bert von Dohrmann's (First Lake), and at the Pittsburg fire station on one of the fire trucks.

A reminder: we do have equipment to loan to the people of Pittsburg; namely, wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, hospital beds, canes and commodes. Just ask any member of the ambulance corps.

During 1985 we had a total of 36 emergency runs, 7 motor vehicle accidents, 2 snowmobile accidents, and 6 transfers.

Because the ambulance corps is a non-profit organization, we do accept and appreciate all donations. These donations are used by the corps for updating and buying new equipment. This past year money was spent in building cabinets in the ambulance station to store all the supplies and equipment. Money is also being spent to buy more "jump kits" and "emergency jackets" for all new members of the corps.

I would like to thank the officers of the ambulance corps, Bert von Dohrmann, Vice-President; Marjorie Straw, Treasurer; Lou Young, Secretary, and all of the corps members for their time and support.

We would also like to take this opprotunity to thank the people of Pittsburg for their support during the year.

POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Pittsburg Police Department received 1,126 calls through the Colebrook communications center in 1985, as well as numerous calls at the officers' homes. The department prosecuted sixty-two court cases, twenty-seven motor vehicle accidents and six burglaries. Many warnings for minor violations were also given out through the year.

All officers became certified in the use of a PR24(night stick) in 1985, and passed the state firearms qualification test. In addition, the Chief attended crime scene investigation classes in Berlin, and held regular meetings with the specials to keep them up-to-date on changes in law and procedures.

When requested, we assisted other law enforcement agencies in the area, including N. H. and Vermont state police, fish and game, and the U.S. border patrol, secret service and FBI.

On behalf of the Department, I would like to thank the people of Pittsburg for your support and cooperation this past year.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Pittsburg Fire Department held its usual monthly meetings and three drills. There are twenty-eight members in the department. On the third Friday or Saturday in October the department holds "pay night" for the year, providing the firemen and their wives a dinner out. At the dinner in 1985 the members received certificates for years of service. A total of 220 years of service were recognized, with Floyd Howe, Gordon Covill and Carl Carlson having the longest continuous service with twenty years each.

Firemen's pay is based on attendance at monthly meetings, the maximum being \$100 for those attending ten or more meetings per year. There is no hourly pay given Pittsburg firemen.

We would like to remind everyone that all new homes or multi-dwellings are required by law (RSA 153:10-a) to have smoke detectors.

All persons installing or modifying oil burning equipment in any structure must have a permit from the Chief of the Fire Department (RSA 153:5) and meet NFPA 31 (1983 Edition) standards.

Any person constructing, installing, repairing chimneys, fire-places or solid fuel burning appliances (wood or coal stoves) shall comply with all NFPA 211 standards (RSA 31:117 & RSA 14:18).

All persons installing or using unvented space heaters or storing fuel for said heaters must have permits from the Chief (RSA 31:60-a and RSA 158:28).

These regulations have been adopted by the state as part of the New Hampshire State Fire Code and represent a minimum level of fire safety requirements.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

Between July 1984 and June 1985, we experienced more forest fires throughout our state than in any year in the last 50. Two of the leading causes of the 1,605 fires were children and fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden. Both causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden.

If you own forest land, you will become responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.

We were all saddened on the tragic event this past January that claimed the lives of seven astronauts. Christa McAuliffe, who was to become the first Teacher-In-Space astronaut, became a student again -- she met a difficult challenge, she learned and she exemplified what it means for one always to be open to learning and to teaching. She has indeed left a lasting tribute to teaching by bringing national recognition to teachers everywhere on their dedication to the teaching profession and instilling in students the motivation to "reach for the stars".

Meeting the educational goals of our public schools and providing a sound and realistic educational system is an ever present challenge that must be addressed and met. Our students must have the opportunity to achieve their personal goals in education and to pursue their life goals, either in the academic or vocational fields.

It is the responsibility of your elected school board officials to make you, the citizens and voters of the School District, aware of the challenges that need to be met. Addressing these challenges and providing solutions requires many long hours of work, investigation, and dedication. It is accomplished in most instances with little or no pay and often at the sacrifice of personal and family life. COORDINATOR OF SPECIAL SERVICES REPORT

As a result of the on-site evaluation conducted by the State Department, special education services within S A U #7 received five-year certification. The commendations expressed by the onsite team clearly reflected the commitment to special education on the part of staff, administration, parents and voters. As a result of this commitment, programs, services and student progress have improved significantly while every effort was made to keep costs at a minimum.

Several changes have taken place. There is now a full-time associate school psychologist employed by S A U #7. Her job is to do both testing and counseling for Colebrook, Pittsburg, and Stewartstown Schools. The speech services have improved as well. Colebrook has a speech therapist three days a week, as does Pittsburg. Stewartstown has a qualified aide who works directly with the speech therapist to provide services two days a week. Pittsburg now has two special education classrooms. One which is for students requiring special education fifty percent or more of the day and the other for students who need services less than fifty percent of the day. Colebrook has added a self-contained classroom for grades one through five and, by doing so, has been able to bring two out-of-district placements back to their local school.

There are approximately one hundred students in S A U #7 who are receiving special services. Of these, only four are in out-of-district placements, while the rest receive services within their local school districts. The services these students might receive include: time in the special education classroom, speech, counseling, transportation, occupational therapy, physical therapy, consultation for vision and/or hearing, as well as others.

Now that the special education programs are within compliance of Federal and State mandates, there will hopefully be time available to develop long-range plans which will provide the best services possible which insuring that that which is being provided is cost-effective.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

The professional school nurse, in the educational setting, provides health care for school-aged children. This primary health care includes the initial assessment, management of minor illness and/or referral to other health professionals, monitoring of chronic diseases, health counseling, promotion of healthy lifestyles, disease prevention, and the coordination of services when specialized care is required. The availability of health services in the schools can improve the ability of students to make responsible decisions related to their health needs and to use existing community health services.

Our school physician, Dr. Marjorie Parsons, retired in June, 1985. We would like to express our sincere thanks to her for all of the invaluable guidance and support she gave to the school nurses during her years as school physician. We would also like to thank Mary Sasser, F.N.P. for her help in assisting Dr. Parsons.

In October, 1983, the State Board of Education required scoliosis (lateral curvature of the spine) screening for grades 5, 6, 7, & 8 in all schools. Training and preparation for compliance began in November, 1984, and lasted through January, 1985. Required implementation of this program followed in our public schools. Yearly scoliosis screening is now required.

In May, 1985, the school nurse, along with several teachers, attended a three-day workshop in Concord in preparation for the formalized implementation of a health curriculum in the elementary grades.

The State Department of Education still requires each child entering our school system to have a physical exam and mandatory immunizations.

CHAPTER I PITTSBURG - CLARKSVILLE

In Pittsburg and Clarksville, Chapter I, a federally funded program is responsible for providing extra help in reading and math for children who need it in grades $1\,-\,3$. It also sponsors a pre-school program for children who will be eligible for Grade 1 the following September.

Selection for these programs is determined by national testing results, teacher referral and parental requests.

The children in the above programs have been introduced to the computer world. The Chapter I teacher, Mrs. Andrea Young, became certified in computer literacy during the past year.

In December, 1984, three members of the Parent Advisory Group, Mrs. Brenda Dorman, Mrs. Gerri Lefebvre, and Mrs. Carlene Fish along with the Chapter I teacher, Mrs. Andrea Young, attended the state Sharing Conference in Manchester. It proved to be very interesting and worthwhile.

I would like to take this opportunity to express thanks to the Parent Advisory Group, chairpersoned by Linda and Melvin French, to all parents and teachers involved, and to the administration for much help both morally and financially. Two very successful raffles provided money for supplies.

We have examined the general purpose financial statements of the Pittsburg School District as of and for the year ended June 30, 1985, as listed in the table of contents. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

The Student Activity Funds do not maintain control over revenues and in accordance with the terms of our engagement, we limited the scope of our examination of the Student Activity Funds to the custodianship of the fund's assets from the point of depositing cash receipts to the time of cash expenditures.

The Pittsburg School district has not maintained a record of its general fixed assets, and accordingly, a statement of general fixed assets, required by generally accepted accounting principles is not included in the financial report.

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in conformity with the accounting practices prescribed by the Department of Education and other regulatory authorities. These practices vary in certain respects from generally accepted accounting principles as explained in Notes 1 of the financial statements.

In our opinion, except for the effect of the statements of the matter referred to in the three preceding paragraphs, the financial statements referred to above present fairly the combined financial position of the Pittsburg School District as of June 30, 1985 and the results of its operations and changes in its financial position for the year then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding period.

Our examination was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements. The information included in the supplementary schedule of federal assistance listed in the table of contents is presented for purpose of additional analysis and is not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of the Pittsburg School District. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the examination of the general purpose financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements of each of the fund types and account groups included in the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole.
