THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**TOWN WARRANT**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal for the ensuing year.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for general expenses of the highway department for the ensuing year.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Home Day.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred twenty-three dollars and forty-one cents (\$223.41) for T.R.A.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of forty-eight dollars (\$48.00) to advertise the Town.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for street lights.

13. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of Municipal Accounting and raise the money to cover the expense of such audit.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

15. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of the land and buildings within the Town to equalize valuation in accordance with the law and to raise money for this purpose.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the upkeep of the Library.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) toward the support of the Elliot Community Hospital in Keene.

18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the necessary improvements of the Town Dump.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise any sum of money to be used toward the construction of a dam at Island Pond.

20. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the following sections of the former Franklin Pierce Highway, for which the relocated and reconstructed sections of highway have been substituted, as shown on map on file in the State of New Hampshire Department of Public Works and Highways entitled F.A.P. Project No. 319(2).

 Between Station 55-80 and Station 62-45.
 Between Station 65-20 and Station 72-00.

21. 22. To see if the Town will vote in favor of the purchase of a road scraper, new or second hand, with rubber tires, suitable for use behind a truck or tractor, and raise the money for the same.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
