To the inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, 1980, next at 12 of the clock noon, to act upon the following subjects: (Business meeting at 7:00 p.m.)

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2.To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$949.38 (For Town Road Aid).

4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance and sealing of roads in summer.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the plowing and sanding of roads in winter.

7. To see if the Town will vote to open the so-called "Fletcher Farm Road" to the Burr Property.

8. To see if the Town will vote to accept a road approximately 2200 feet on the former Karl Gorden property for Chellis and Cushing.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be added to the Capitol Reserve Fund.

11. To see if the Town will vote to name the Road from John Pynes' house to Bog Schoolhouse bridge "Town Pound Road."

12. To see if the Town will vote to name the Road from Kelly Corner to the Junction of Brook Road and Welton Falls turn "Fowler River Road."

13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 154:30 commonly known as the Mutual Aid Law and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,738.00 for the purpose of becoming a member of the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Association, giving the Board of Selectmen the authority to enter into a contract with the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Association for a term of five years beginning on April 1, 1980 which would provide a full time communications service to the Fire Department. [Explanatory Note: For the first year of the contract, the amount the Town would raise to pay its share of the cost of the communications service would be used to buy radios and other equipment for the fire department so that it can fully use the service offered. During this time the communications service would be provided free of charge to the Town. Annual assessments to cover the cost of the service are based on the total equalized valuation of all members of the Mutual Aid System.]

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

This warrant contains only articles prior to going to press and may be subject to additions.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST FIRE SERVICE

Prevention and control of forest fires is handled through a cooperative effort between town/city fire organizations and the State Forest Fire Service.

Since 1903, when the first forest fire laws were passed by our Legislature, the State Forester has appointed someone in each municipality as a Forest Fire Warden and charged him with the responsibility of forest fire prevention and control within his town/city. This person may ask the State Forester to appoint as many Deputy Forest Fire Wardens as may be necessary to efficiently carry out his charge.

The State Forester has divided the State into ten forest fire districts with a full time District Forest Fire Chief in each district. The State organization is charged with assisting the municipal forest fire organization in any way possible.

State personnel conduct fire training schools, assist with forest fire suppression, fire cause investigation, prosecution of fire law violators and forest fire prevention programs. Forest fire suppression equipment is purchased through State bulk purchasing ability and sold to local forest fire organizations at one-half cost. Excess military property is obtained and turned over to town/city fire departments at no cost to local departments for conversion into fire suppression units. This cooperative arrangement between State and municipality has resulted in one of the best forest fire records in the United States with less than one-half acre of woodland burned in each fire reported.
