CONWAY TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF CONWAY, County of Carroll, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Karl Seidenstuecker Auditorium at Kennett High School, Conway, New Hampshire, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, 1986, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects hereinafter set forth. Voting on Articles 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 will be by official ballot and the polls shall open for balloting at nine o'clock in the forenoon or as soon thereafter as the Moderator calls the meeting to order and declares a quorum present. The remaining articles of the Warrant shall be acted upon at seven o'clock in the evening or at the closing of the polls if the meeting shall vote to keep the polls open to a later hour.

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary officers.

- ARTICLE 2. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt Amendment No. 1 as proposed and recommended by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance creating a Mountain Conservation District.
- ARTICLE 3. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt Amendment No. 2 as proposed and recommended by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance redefining "Home Occupation" and the permitted uses under a home occupation.
- ARTICLE 4. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt Amendment No. 3 as proposed and recommended by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance defining setback and frontage requirements of lots abutting lakes and rivers, and redefining building heights.
- ARTICLE 5. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt Amendment No. 4 as proposed and recommended by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance allowing modification of non-conforming commercial uses in the Agricultural/Residential District as special exceptions subject to conditions.
- ARTICLE 6. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt Amendment No. 5 as proposed and recommended by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance making miscellaneous changes in many sections of the code by adding, deleting or changing a word, phrase, sentence or small part of a provision.

ARTICLE 7. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt Amendment No. 6 as proposed and recommended by the Planning Board for the Town zoning ordinance allowing charitable fund raising events in the Agricultural/Residential District as a special exception subject to conditions.

ARTICLE 8. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt Amendment No. 7 of the Town zoning ordinance changing a section of land on both sides of the Fryeburg Road (Route #302) northerly of Maine Central Railroad and south of Saco River from the Agricultural/Residential District to the Highway Commercial District. This is a petitioned article not recommended by the Planning Board.

ARTICLE 9. To see whether or not the Town will vote to adopt the BOCA Basic Building Code 1984, as amended, (to be added as Chapter 89 of the Conway Code) which will apply to all non-residential and multi-family dwelling units, but excluding all single family dwellings from its provisions. This is proposed and recommended by the Planning Board.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) for the purpose of improving the CRANMORE LAKE SHORES MAIN ACCESS ROAD under the petition for conditional road layout (and with repayment to be by assessment of those served by said road in this development) and authorize the Selectmen to borrow up to said sum under the Municipal Finance Act with the Selectmen to arrange all terms and conditions of such borrowing and its repayment to be acted on by ballot of the Town. Recommended by the Budget Committee (10-0-0).

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) to be used for reconstruction of approximately 4,000 feet of SOUTH CONWAY ROAD. Recommended by the Budget Committee (9-0-0).

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) to provide HANDICAPPED ACCESS to the Town Hall and the Police Station as mandated by Section 51.55(c), (d), (e), and (k), (5), of the Federal Revenue Sharing Act, 1983: the above improvements to include entrance ramps at both buildings, doorway and bathroom changes, and a lift to the second floor at the Town Hall; and to authorize the withdrawal of that sum from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. Recommended by the Budget Committee (8-0-0).

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Sixty Five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000.00) to purchase rights of way, preliminary survey, design, cost estimates and environmental assessments of a TOWN

ROAD BETWEEN ROUTE 302 AND OLD BARTLETT ROAD, and authorize the withdrawal of that amount from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (4-5-0).

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) or such other sum as may be necessary to fund the cost items relating to INCREASES IN POLICE OFFICERS' SALARIES and benefits for 1986 attributable to the Collective Bargaining Agreement being entered into by and between the Conway Police Commission and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, Council 93, Local 859, as the result of negotiations on behalf of certain employees of the Conway Police Department. Such sum of money represents the additional costs attributable to an increase in salaries and benefits over those obligations payable in 1985.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Twenty Five Dollars (\$425.00) for telephone line installation for a 911 SYSTEM, to be operational in 1988, said system to be located at the Conway Police Department. Agreeable to a petition signed by Raymond E. Lowd and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (10-0-0).

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) to UPDATE THE 1982 WASTE-WATER FACILITIES PLAN, inventory of current conditions and need, said study to inventory present and future population, land use, wastewater and septage production, and to propose alternatives, including financing, preliminary design and implementation procedures, said study being a prerequisite to any future federal and state construction financing. Recommended by the Budget Committee (9-0-0).

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) for a RECREATIONAL SWIMMING AREA ACQUISITION AND DEVELOPMENT CAPITAL RESERVE FUND, with authority for the Selectmen to authorize the expenditure of the funds if such property becomes available. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (2-7-1).

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Four Hundred Thirteen Dollars (\$3,413.00) to provide POLICE SERGEANT DAVID BENNETT WITH PRIOR CREDITED SERVICE under the New Hampshire Retirement System because of employer oversight between 1968 and 1970. Recommended by the Budget Committee (9-0-0).

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Forty Dollars (\$5,040.00) for a HOUSEHOLD HAZARD-OUS WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM with \$1,150.00 of this amount to be reimbursed by the State of New Hampshire, Division of Public Health Services. Recommended by the Budget Committee (6-3-1).

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 72:37 for the EXEMPTION FOR THE BLIND from property tax. This statute provides that every inhabitant who is legally blind shall be exempt each year from the property tax on a residence to the value of \$15,000. Agreeable to a petition signed by Curtis H. Lunt and others.

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to waive the fee to be charged for A PERMIT TO REGISTER ONE MOTOR VEHICLE OWNED BY ANY PERSON WHO WAS CAPTURED and incarcerated for thirty (30) days or more while serving in a qualifying war or armed conflict as defined in RSA 72:28, IV, and who was honorably discharged, provided the person has provided the Town Clerk with satisfactory proof of these circumstances, in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 261:157-a, there currently being three (3) such persons identified in the Town of Conway. Recommended by the Budget Committee (9-0-0).

ARTICLE 23. To see whether or not the Town will VOTE TO INDEMNIFY and/or save harmless any person, from time to time, employed by the Town, including but not limited to its Town Manager, Assistant Town Manager, and/or Appraiser, any member of its board of Selectmen, any administrative staff members, and any member of agencies, boards, committees, commissions, all of which may include, but are not limited to, the Board of Adjustment, Planning Board, Trustee of Funds, Trustee of Libraries, Park Commission, Conservation Commission, Municipal Budget Committee, and/or any elected or appointed Town officials, all acting for and/or to the benefit of the Town of Conway from any personal financial loss or damage

and/or expense including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any, arising out of any claim, demand, suit or judgement from any of the following:

- A. By reason of any act or omission constituting a violation of the civil rights of an employee or any person under any federal and/or state law or constitution if such act or omission is not committed with malice and the indemnified person at the time of such act or omission was acting within the scope of his/her employment or office, and
- B. By reason of negligence or other act resulting in accidental injury to a person or accidental damage to or destruction of property if the indemnified person at the time of the accident resulting in injury, damage or destruction was acting in the scope of his/her employment or office:

This vote to remain valid until revoked or modified by subsequent vote of said Town.

ARTICLE 24. To see whether or not the Town will authorize the Selectmen to create and administer a REVOLVING LOAN FUND with an agent or agents to be contracted by the Selectmen for the Town so as to continue to re-administer and loan the monies received back by the Town through loan repayments previously had and expended under the Block Grant program through the State of New Hampshire with the Administrative Plan, Credit Policy, Contractual Management Agreement and all other terms and conditions of such fund and/or its management to be from time to time determined by the Selectmen in behalf of the Town with this vote to continue effective until subsequently modified and/or amended by later vote of this Town, provided that such subsequent modification and/or amendments hereunder shall not affect existing and outstanding loans then held and/or committed by the Town under its then fund.

ARTICLE 25. To see if the Town shall establish an HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION, consisting of seven members to be appointed by the Selectmen, pursuant to RSA 673:4. Agreeable to a petition signed by William R. Maryel and others.

ARTICLE 26. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a Town road SARGENT ROAD, said road being 988 feet in length, including cul-de-sac, and constructed to Town Road Standards, thereafter to be maintained as a Town road. Agreeable to a petition signed by Robert L. Burns and others.

ARTICLE 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept as a Town road WHITELAW DRIVE, being 1050 feet in length, including cul-de-sac, upon completion to Town standards, including paving, said road to be thereafter maintained as a Town road. Agreeable to a petition signed by Arthur R. Hill and others.

ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a Town road the portion of LEDGEVIEW DRIVE that connects Town roads Acorn Link and White Horse Drive in the Birch Hill Development, thereafter to be maintained as a Town road. Agreeable to a petition signed by Nancy J. Stedman and others.

ARTICLE 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) in support of the CONWAY HISTORICAL SOCIETY to be used toward external repairs on the Lord House for its 25th Anniversary. Agreeable to a petition signed by Suzanne C. Levesque and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (10-0-0).

ARTICLE 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000.00) for hot bituminous paving for the VILLA PARKING LOT subject to a 25 year lease agreement for public parking with Our Lady of the Mountains Parish, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Manchester. Agreeable to a petition signed by H. Edmund Bergeron and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (5-3-2).

ARTICLE 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) to support the services of the MT. WASHINGTON VALLEY CHAPTER OF THE AMERICAN RED CROSS. Agreeable to a petition signed by Kathryn A. Burnell and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (7-2-1).

ARTICLE 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$3,300.00) to assist the ADVOCATES FOR SPECIAL PEOPLE, to be used to provide a recreation program for the special needs children that live in the Town of Conway. Agreeable to a petition signed by Lisa Parent and others. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (2-6-2).

ARTICLE 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) for the CONWAY AREA BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION (CABDC) to be used in conjunction with other funds to support the CABDC's economic development activities. Agreeable to a petition signed by Gerald I. Coogan and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (3-2-2).

ARTICLE 34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Thousand Three Hundred Twenty Six Dollars (\$8,326.00) to assist the CARROLL COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE. Agreeable to a petition signed by Cathy Hansen and others. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (3-5-0).

ARTICLE 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum

of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) in support of CARROLL COUNTY AGAINST DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND RAPE. Agreeable to a petition signed by Jan Kisluk and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (5-2-0).

ARTICLE 36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Sixty Dollars (\$2,060.00) for the CONWAY VILLAGE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE. Agreeable to a petition signed by Ruth J. Brown and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (4-3-0).

ARTICLE 37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Sixty Dollars (\$2,060.00) for the Mt. Washington Valley Chamber of Commerce. Said funds to be dedicated to the Chamber's Visitor Information Services. Agreeable to a petition signed by Barbara M. Lynn and others. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (1-4-2).

ARTICLE 38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirteen Thousand Dollars (\$13,000.00) for the CENTER OF HOPE, INC. Agreeable to a petition signed by Mark H. Tripp and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (6-1-1).

ARTICLE 39. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$9,400.00) for support of the GIBSON CENTER FOR SENIOR SERVICES, and One Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$1,400.00) for the GIBSON CENTER MEALS PROGRAM, a total of Ten Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$10,800.00). Agreeable to a petition signed by Glenna Mori and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (8-0-0).

ARTICLE 40. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars for the 1986 Capital Budget of THE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL, North Conway, N.H. Agreeable to a petition signed by Elizabeth Kench and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (8-0-0).

ARTICLE 41. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Six Hundred Twenty Five Dollars (\$2,625.00) to assist the Carroll County Family Planning and Prenatal Program (FAMILY HEALTH CENTER). Agreeable to a petition signed by Linda Fox Phillips and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (8-1-0).

ARTICLE 42. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirteen Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty Three Dollars (\$13,723.00) for the VISITING NURSE SERVICES OF NORTHERN CARROLL COUNTY, INC., said sum being equal to \$1.80 per person in the Town of Conway. Agreeable to a petition signed by William J. Fowle and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (7-1-0).

ARTICLE 43. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) to assist the CONWAY VILLAGE RECREATION COMMISSION and the NORTH CONWAY COMMUNITY CENTER; Twenty Five Thousand Dollars to the Conway Village Recreation Commission and Twenty Five Thousand Dollars to the Board of Directors, North Conway Community Center. Agreeable to a petition signed by Sharon M. Fisher and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (9-0-0).

ARTICLE 44. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$2,100.00) for support of the COMMUNITY ACTION OUTREACH PROGRAM. Agreeable to a petition signed by Gloria Luken and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (8-0-0).

ARTICLE 45. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for the support of the EASTERN SLOPE AIRPORT AUTHORITY. Agreeable to a petition signed by Jesse E. Lyman, III, and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (7-0-1).

ARTICLE 46. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for capital improvement to be made at the EASTERN SLOPE REGIONAL AIRPORT. Agreeable to a petition signed by Richard T. Brunelle and others. Not recommended by the Budget Committee (1-6-0).

ARTICLE 47. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for the NORTH CONWAY DAY CARE CENTER. Agreeable to a petition signed by Sister Marjorie Moon and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (5-4-0).

ARTICLE 48. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Thousand Dollars (\$9,000.00) for the purpose of providing services for the YOUNG MOTHERS PROGRAM of the Children & Youth Project of Mt. Washington Valley. Agreeable to a petition signed by Genevieve Murray and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (8-0-0).

ARTICLE 49. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$9,200.00) for the support of the CHILDREN & YOUTH PROJECT of Mt. Washington Valley. Agreeable to a petition signed by Evelyn B. Dole and others. Recommended by the Budget Committee (6-2-3).

ARTICLE 50. Are you in favor of authorizing the Tax Collector to accept prepayment of Resident Taxes prior to issuance of the Resident Tax Warrant, such payments not to be received before April 1st of any given year, in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 80:1a.

ARTICLE 51. Are you in favor of authorizing the Tax Collector to accept prepayment of property taxes prior to issuance of the Tax Warrant, such payment not to be received before April 1st of any given year, in accordance with New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 80:52a.

ARTICLE 52. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the Town such sums of money as may be needed, such sums not to exceed the combined school, town and county tax budgets, in anticipation for town, county and school purposes.

ARTICLE 53. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, in behalf of the Town of Conway, N.H. to accept gifts and/or federal or state aid in the name of the Town of Conway, N.H. applied for, and to receive and expend them in accordance with the purposes thereof.

ARTICLE 54. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw Capital Reserve Funds established by the Town from time to time and disburse the same in accordance with the purposes for which such funds were created respectively.

ARTICLE 55. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell, at their discretion, at public auction, any real estate in the Town to which the Town has title by Collector's Deed; except when it is being sold back to the former owner, or to a party who has succeeded to the title of the former owner, in which case private sale may be utilized; any such real estate to be sold and conveyed on or before the next annual Town Meeting.

ARTICLE 56. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.



ACCOUNTANT'S REPORT ON FINANCIAL PRESENTATION

To the Members of The Board of Selectmen Town of Conway Conway, New Hampshire

We have examined the combined financial statements and the combining fund and account group financial statements of the Tonw of Conway, New Hampshire as of and for the year ended December 31, 1984, as listed in the table of contents. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in Note 1B, the combined financial statements referred to above do not include financial statements of the General Fixed Asset Group of Accounts which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, except that omission of the General Fixed Asset Group of Accounts results in an incomplete presentation, as explained in the above paragraph, the combined financial statements and the combining fund and account group financial statements referred to above present fairly the financial position of the Town of Conway, New Hampshire at December 31, 1984, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Our examination was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the combined financial statements taken as a whole and on the combining fund and account group financial statements. The accompanying financial information listed as supplemental schedules in the table of contents is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the combined financial statements of the Town of Conway, New Hampshire. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the examination of the combined, combining fund and account group financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the combined financial statements taken as a whole.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

What are the major problems confronting our growing town and your Board of Selectmen and Town Hall staff? Traffic congestion, disposal of solid waste and the increasing volume of septage generated in North Conway continue to be the outstanding concerns. In addition, the construction of many condominiums (49 in 1984, and 24 in 1985) in Conway, plus rapid growth of factory outlet stores (12 in 1984, and 15 in 1985) are changing the general character of our town. One's point of view determines whether or not the changes are desirable. This observation is made only to record the fact of much change in a relatively short period of time - and there is no indication the pace is slackening.

Largely, through skilled efforts of Conway's State Legislators, enthusiastically assisted by Raymond Burton, Executive Councilor of our District, the Governor and Council have adopted a 10-year plan which includes \$34.5 million for a toll road bypass which is scheduled to be operational in 1993. An environmental impact study is now underway.

When the bypass is in operation there will be substantial reduction of through town traffic. This alone will not change the need for local traffic circulation, a need which even now is an exasperating problem. This need was the basis of one of the major recommendations of the 1983 Master Plan: the construction of an Eastern Connector road (a rough equivalent of the West Side Road on the east side of town) which would extend from Redstone to Mt. Cranmore and Kearsarge Village. The Selectmen strongly endorse this project. There are obstacles involved with this proposal, apart from the problem of money, which we must always consider. The road would cross Conservation land east of Pudding Pond which was purchased in part by Federal funds and, therefore, Federal permission will be required not always easily obtained. The Selectmen weigh the need for this road against the marginal impact on the Conservation land and we believe the greater benefit to the town lies in our ability to circulate traffic more freely within the town. Furthermore, such a road would also provide better safety with a much needed second access for fire and emergency vehicles.

After five years of study and much negotiating, the Selectmen, on authority of the October 26, 1985 Special Town Meeting have signed a contract iwth Remedial Resource Recovery, a local corporation, to take our solid waste, burn it and produce electricity - all to be on a site adjacent to the town's landfill. Certain items such as refrigerators, building debris and stumps are excluded from the contract. At the time of writing this report RRR had not completed its financing; but assuming this will be arranged, the Selectmen

are confident an excellent solution to our solid waste disposal will have been accomplished and that operations will begin in 1987.

It has been a fairly common assumption that ultimately a sewer system will be required in North Conway. This is because of continuing growth and its consequent septage impact on the aquifer, the sole source of our drinking water. The Selectmen have been urged by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission to engage consultants to study the problem. The U.S. Geological Survey has recently completed extensive hydrogeological tests of our aquifer. Preliminary indications show that the groundwater is being affected by sewage load in North Conway. The analysis and report is expected to be completed next summer. A warrant article is being entered for \$30,000 to cover a survey.

The variety and number of problems winding up at Town Hall seem endless and increasing. Some of them are discussed in the Town Manager's report found elsewhere in this booklet. Many of them are resolved during the Selectmen's weekly meetings; many others are handled by our competent Town Hall staff.

Curt Lunt, Town Manager, has mastered his job and is well assisted by John Walsh, Assistant Town Manager. Curt's praise of his staff is enthusiastically endorsed by the Selectmen.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

1985 was a very busy year with the Selectmen and I spending a great deal of time dealing with the issues of solid waste and septage. We saw our transfer station fully operational with over ten thousand tons of garbage shipped to a private landfill in Bethlehem. This has been a successful but expensive short term solution to our solid waste woes. The fifteen year agreement signed with Remedial Resource Recovery for incineration is required to be financed by mid February and on line by late 1987. If successful, this operation should lower our long term cost.

It is quite apparent that there are no inexpensive solutions and that past operations may not have been so inexpensive at all. We are required to cover and close out our present landfill, but are hindered from doing so due to the pollution in our 10 monitoring wells. This is related to the septage lagoons which have been receiving more than 2 million gallons each year. We are presently investigating the source or sources of the contamination. The pollution at the landfill, along with a USGS aquifer study, has lead us to propose re-examining the need for sewers in North Conway.

In 1985 the Town worked in many areas which are important, but received little public attention. We resurfaced nearly 5 miles of Town roads, rebuilt 3500 feet of South Conway Road, replaced the Tasker Hill Bridge, built the Smith-Eastman Canoe Landing Project, and built an additional fire pond on West Side Road, for example. Our Community Development Block Grant Housing Rehabilitation Project in Center Conway improved 20 housing units during the year. The Selectmen also signed an agreement with State Cable T.V. to extend service to 6 miles of East Conway Road and Stark Road during 1986.

While we have many activities and projects proposed for 1986, it is with your active participation that we can best meet the challenges ahead.

The Board of Selectmen meet in open public session on Mondays and minutes of those meetings are on file at the Conway Public Library.

Thank you for your support and assistance.



REPORT FROM YOUR CHIEF OF POLICE

1985 has been a very busy year for your Police Department. Requests for Police Services were up 3% over 1984. Even without the presence of the Volvo Tennis Tournament, traffic on the strip this past year was up 7%. This shows that there was an average daily increase of over 1000 cars.

1985 was also a year of great tragedy due to the four fatal accidents that occurred on our highways. All of these fatal accidents were alcohol related. By this I mean that not all of the parties involved were drunk, but in each of the accidents at least one of the operators had been drinking.

This year we would like to add a Juvenile Officer position to the Department. During 1985 your Police Department investigated 20 Felonious Sexual Child Abuse cases. So far this year from January 1st to January 28th we have received three more cases. These cases are very time consuming and need a full time investigating officer.

We also would like to purchase the equipment to go on line with the New Hampshire State Police Telecommunications System. The first year the cost of this system is approximately \$11,000.00. 50% of the cost would be funded by the New Hampshire Highway Safety Agency. After the first year, the yearly cost to use and maintain this system would be approximately \$3,000.00. This system will allow us to retrieve motor vehicle listings, license checks, N.C.I.C. checks, etc. from any state in the U.S. in 3 to 5 second which will save the Town many man hours a year. It will also make our patrol officers' job much safer due to the retrieval time. He will be able to know if a car is wanted before he makes a stop.

With your continued support both of the above requests will allow your Police Department the opportunity to serve you better.

Again this year we have underexpended the Police Budget and are able to return approximately \$24,000.00 back to the taxpayers. We will continue to spend your dollars wisely without hindering the operation of the Police Department and its services to the citizens of the Town of Conway.

This is Commissioner Wesley S. Gleason's last year as Commissioner. He has served the Town and the Police Department for three faithful, dedicated years. I would like to wish him the best and thank Wes, Commissioner Robert F. Porter, Commissioner Ronald A. Light and the members of the Conway Police Department for their support in 1985.

REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

1985

The high point of 1985 was the open house, held on March 3 in the beautifully remodeled basement, to celebrate the completion of Project READ (Renew, Expand and Develop) which had been only a dream in 1982. This event was attended by many enthusiastic area residents and officials from the State Library.

There was a gratifying increase in activities at the library in 1985. The number of people coming into the library increased 33% over 1984, circulation 11.5% and reference questions answered 80%.

Hours the library is open were increased from 38 to 56 a week.

The library has become a model in the state, and visitors from many other libraries have come to see it and to learn how Project READ was accomplished. The elevator, providing access for the handicapped, is frequently used. The meeting room is used by many civic, cultural and educational groups, as well as for expanded library programs.

Library service has been improved by the addition of a micro-film/fiche reader printer and a micro-computer, which speeds inter-library loans by access to the State Library union list.

The staff is conscientious, professional and friendly. Volunteers, who contributed 294 hours in 1985 enthusiastically support the library. The annual book sale depends largely on volunteers; the Conway Woman's Club helped with the book sale, and decorated two Christmas trees, one in the new area, and another in the great hall.

Keith Henney, who gave the library the Nella Braddy Henney History Room, established a trust, the income from which is to be used to defray the expenses of maintaining, operating and improving the History Room. He suggested that part of the income from this trust be used to employ a part time library assistant to work under the supervision of the librarian, to provide such services as adding relevant material to the collection, cataloging, developing and maintaining a master local history index, and sponsoring history projects for students. Mrs. Ann Cullinan enthusiastically started working on this project in the fall.

The trustees and staff again express deep appreciation to the many organizations and people who support the library. We look forward to continued growth in meeting the rapidly expanding civic and cultural needs of the community.

REPORT OF THE CONWAY CONSERVATION COMMISSION

This year's major emphasis was on inventory of all the parcels of land owned by the Town and managed by the Conservation Commission. Not only did we look at deeds, but also to see if boundary lines were blazed, signs present, current condition, when last visited by members and what the recommended use should be of the properties. Each member is responsible for a certain tract of land and also gathering historic information about the property. Should someone have pictures of information about present owned land, the Commission would like to obtain a copy.

With the help of the Pequawket Foundation, Kennett Corporation and the Conway Conservation Commission, the Abenaki property bordering the Worcester Hill Town Forest was purchased by the Town and will be managed as part of the Town Forest.

It was reported to the Selectmen that a private tennis court was built over the boundary line of the Pudding Pond property. The Town Manager is investigating the problem.

The Conway Conservation Commission opposed the Selectmen's proposal to develop an Eastern Connector road through the middle of the Pudding Pond property.

The Commission's monthly meeting is held on the 2nd Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. at the Extension Service Conference Room on Main Street in Conway.

REPORT OF CONWAY RECREATION CENTER

This has been another busy year for the Conway Recreation Center. We are truly a Community Center and provide over sixty different recreational programs. The building and facilities are used by several civic groups, government agencies that help local residents, non-profit groups use it for meetings and workshops, along with the programs that the department sponsors.

The skating rink is a vital part of Conway Village and is often used 12 to 15 hours a day. The Junior High and High School use it for physical education classes, local kindergartens and Conway Elementary School groups skate each week. This was most successful and we hope the Town will support a special article to continue this program so all youngsters will have the opportunity to enjoy new recreational experiences.

I would like to thank the Recreation Commissioners, Precinct Commissioners, the Conway School District for use of its facilities, the volunteers who make our programs a success, and the taxpayers for their support.

NORTH CONWAY COMMUNITY CENTER REPORT

The Board of Directors and the staff of the North Conway Community Center had a busy year. Some new programs were started and there was some good growth in the established activities.

We continued our fund raising endeavors again and added the Portland Symphony and Jumping in the Clouds to our food concession income. Those 2 events alone gave us almost \$5,500.00 in unbudgeted funds. These are funds that are used for our special projects.

Over the past decade the Board has annually invested monies back into the land and building and programs. 1985 was no exception. Major fence improvements, new outside bulletin board, hockey uniforms, football uniforms were some of the special projects for the year.

The Board and staff will continue to seek new programs and new ideas so that we can maintain our high level of recreational service to our community.

CONWAY RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

In late 1984, the Conway Board of Selectmen formed the Conway Recreation Advisory Committee (CRAC) to aid it in addressing the recreation needs of the community. A seven member committee was appointed to coordinate existing programs, develop budgets, plan for future recreational needs, and investigate the acquisition of property for recreation. CRAC has met monthly and has made the following recommendations to the Board of Selectmen:

- Davis Park CRAC recommended various physical improvements to the site, including an expanded parking area, which were accomplished in 1985.
- 2. Recreation Personnel A recommendation has been accepted by the Board of Selectmen to budget for a summer Park & Recreation Supervisor and for two part-time lifeguards at Conway Lake Beach. The Park & Recreation Supervisor's duties will include organizing summer recreation programs at Davis Park, the supervision of personnel and activities at Conway Lake Beach, and the gathering and evaluating of usage data at other recreation areas such as First Bridge and the Smith-Eastman Landing. A budget appropriation for these positions will be considered at the annual Town Meeting.
- 3. Needs Assessment A meeting was held in January at the Pine Tree School to gather data on the recreational needs of children in the Center Conway, South Conway and East Conway areas. CRAC expects to make recommendations regarding programs in these areas if the needs warrant them.
- 4. Land Acquisition The Committee continues to study possible recreation sites which could serve the needs of the Town in the future. Toward this end, CRAC is requesting that the Town Meeting act favorably on a warrant article which would create a Capital Reserve Fund for the acquisition and development of a swimming area and provide initial funding of \$15,000.

REPORT OF EASTERN SLOPE AIRPORT AUTHORITY

Your Airport Authority has made application to the FAA for an additional 500 foot runway extension and a new large truck-mounted snowblower. If approved, we will receive 90% federal funding, 5% state funding, with the remaining 5% to be contributed from local sources. Our 1986 budget shows a capital improvement account balance of \$21,600.00 which should cover our share of the anticipated capital improvements for 1986. Our share of the snowblower cost cannot be taken from the capital improvement account.

Our general operating expenses (electricity, snowplowing, mowing, road maintenance, runway maintenance, etc.) continue to grow each year as the facilities are improved and airport usage increases. We are making a sincere attempt to direct the airport to become self-sufficient with respect to operating revenues.

Other major improvements have been the implementation of airport standards consistent with FAA guidelines for facilities of our size, and the opening of negotiations with a professional manager to provide all the related services our recreation based community requires.

With the closing of North Conway Airport it is becoming apparent that Eastern Slope Regional Airport will be the airport that will service the region. It is, therefore, our expectation that the airport usage will continue to increase.

We appreciate your continued support.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGERS

Between July 1984 and June 1985, we experienced more forest fires throughout our state than in any year in the last 50. Two of the leading causes of the 1,605 fires were children and fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden. Both causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden.

If you own forest land, you will become responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.


