

## TOWN WARRANT

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### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Veterans' Memorial Building, in said Town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, Eastern War Time, to act upon the following subjects:

By vote of the Selectmen, the polls for this meeting will remain open from ten o'clock in the forenoon until seven o'clock in the afternoon, Eastern War Time, and as much longer thereafter as the Town, at the opening of the meeting, may vote.

1. To elect a Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Auditors and all other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.

2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways for building and repairing bridges, for the suppression of moths, for the police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of Town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town halls, for the support of libraries, for State and County taxes, for the observance of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes, for co-operating with the State and Federal governments in control of insect pests and white pine blister and for all other necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00, or any portion thereof, to be expended for construction and repair of sidewalks, and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey any real estate acquired through deeds from the Collector of Taxes or as a reimbursement for assistance furnished to citizens, and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will authorize its selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of the taxes of the municipal year in which such debts are incurred and made payable therefrom by such vote, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will accept State aid for construction of Class 5 roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose, the sum of \$1,046.61, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of Taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.

8. By request of the Town Defense Committee, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for civilian defense purposes not exceeding \$200.00, and pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to place the management of the public cemeteries in the Town in the hands of a board of three cemetery trustees and authorize the Selectmen to appoint three such trustees, one for one year, one for two years and one for three years, and thereafter one trustee to be elected each year for

a term of three years, and pass any vote relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will authorize the cemetery trustees, either by themselves or in conjunction with the Selectmen, to make rules and regulations for the proper management and control of said cemeteries, and pass any vote relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the cemetery trustees to sell and convey burial lots in the East Derry Cemetery, any funds received from the sale of such lots to be retained in the hands of the trustees of the trust funds as a part of the cemetery funds, and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to transfer from the unencumbered surplus funds of the Town the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the capital reserve fund to be used for the construction of a sewerage system and sewerage disposal plant for said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for playground purposes, said sum to be expended in the discretion of and under the direction of the Board of Selectmen, not more than \$150.00 of said sum to be expended at Hood Pond Park, and pass any vote relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dunbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.

15. To see if the Town will vote to accept from the Derry Cemetery Association a conveyance and transfer of all the property and assets of said Association,

including funds held in trust by said Association for the perpetual care of cemetery lots, and agree to assume all the debts, liabilities and obligations of the Derry Cemetery Association, including all obligations as to perpetual care of cemetery lots, all in accordance with the petition filed in the Superior Court for Rockingham County, and the decree entered thereunder on the 5th day of February 1945, and pass any vote relating thereto.

16. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

17. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

18. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before such meeting.

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#### ANOTHER ENEMY TO CONQUER

Here is a home front fight that everyone can get into. Last year in this State 558 brush and forest fires burned over 4,648 acres of land, of which 2,788 acres were valuable timber and young growth. With available manpower the lowest of any year since the war started, you can help to keep this loss down by preventing these fires from starting.

Keep in mind these simple rules:

1. Always get a permit from your forest fire warden before starting any fires in the open. Burning under certain conditions is permitted.
2. Never burn unless you have enough help to control your fire—a permit does not excuse you of negligence in case it gets away.
3. Always report any uncontrolled fire promptly to your forest fire warden. Minutes lost are acres lost.

4. Be especially careful with cigarettes, matches and pipes. Smokers caused most of our fires.
5. Never leave a fire unless it is dead out. You can't feel safe while there is a spark left.

The trustees accepted the resignation of the Rev. Malcolm Peart after 8 years service on the board. His interest in and devotion to the Derry Public Library made his contribution to the library service a worthy one.

## LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

To the Trustees of the Derry Public Library  
The 40th annual report is herewith presented:

Our report for 1944 only covers the work of 11 months, as all books were obliged to be closed on December 31, 1944.

Routine work has been carried on as usual. Junior High School classes were given instruction in the use of the library, during the early fall term. Many of the children returned, after school hours, for further instruction and were given extra credits in the English course.

We are now able to see a great deal of progress as the result of placing books in the classrooms. Many teachers come in and choose the books that fit into the program of study. In this way they have the material at hand for each new subject, when it is needed in class. Many new books about children of other lands have been added thus acquainting our young people with the customs and habits of our foreign friends. A few new biographies, for book reports for Junior High and Pinckerton students, have been placed upon the shelves.

Story hours for the 5th and 6th grades were held for two months in the spring, but were discontinued when it became too warm and the children lost interest in indoor activities. Fifth and 6th grade pupils had two Christmas story hours before the holidays. The attendance was gratifying to the storyteller, Mrs. Helen Garrison. The summer reading club was dropped this year as the playground project proved more interesting.

The number of books missing from our shelves was very low. Only 17 books had disappeared, but the number lost in circulation was much higher. Many of them were destroyed by fire and others were not returned last spring, from homes reporting cases of scarlet fever.

Six books are missing from the last collection we placed at the Report Center. We are still hoping that they will be found and returned to the library. The number of books, worn beyond repair, is very high. Popular, light fiction in the war bindings must be discarded after a few months in circulation.

Book Week activities were not so elaborate as those of last year. Junior High students and the 5th and 6th grades had a Book Character Contest. Irene Muzzey won first prize for Junior High and Jean Dubeau won the prize for the 5th and 6th grades.

A special display depicting 200 years of children's books was shown. Beginning with the "Pretty Little Pocketbook," published by John Newbery in 1744, the display included a Horn book of 1800, a New England Primer, and then worked up to the lovely picture books of 1944. Miss Sylvia Clark and Miss Lillian Poor contributed many interesting books of the 1880's for this exhibit.

The library was awarded another gift book from the Junior Literary Guild for our 1943 Book Week activities.

We were asked to solicit for the 6th War Loan and were much pleased with the result of our drive. \$1,150.00 was credited to the Derry Public Library.

During American Art Week, we received from the State Library some interesting reproductions of the works of certain American artists.

Early closing hours began on October 31 and will continue until April 1. The regular hours on Saturdays 2:00 to 9:00 P. M., will continue.

Your librarian attended the District Chairman's Meeting, held in Hanover in April and the annual meeting of the New Hampshire Library Association in Concord during the first week of June. Both proved interesting and instructive.

The oil burner was re-installed on December 21 and is proving very satisfactory.

The Derry Garden Club furnished the decorations for the library during the Christmas holidays, Mrs. Maroney and Mrs. Blake having charge of the arrangements.

A doll collection, exhibited in the large glass case, is growing rapidly owing to loans and gifts from interested friends. Adults as well as children enjoy looking at the various types.

We wish to thank the newspapers for publicity given us during the past year.

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### ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION PERSONNEL

The turnover in personnel was considerable during the summer. Resignation of seven teachers and a janitor made the turnover one of the largest in recent years. Miss Mabel Plante resigned to accept a position at Hampstead High School. Miss Patricia Royal also resigned and accepted a position at Spaulding (Rochester, N. H.) High School. Mrs. Dorothy Parker and Miss Eleanor Long resigned to be married. Mr. Howard Joslyn gave up as part time shop teacher because of the pressure of his regular duties.

After many long years of devoted service Mrs. Bertha Wiggins felt it necessary to resign as teacher at East Derry. Mrs. Lillian Brown, who had been teaching at Oak St. School, another veteran teacher, resigned so as to devote more time to her home.

Mr. Louis Gagne resigned as janitor at Oak Street School to accept the janitorship of the Adams Memorial Building.

The task of securing competent teachers to replace these losses was aggravated by a definite teacher shortage in all fields and especially in vocational subjects.

Miss Eva Bernier, a graduate of Bridgewater (Mass.) Normal School accepted the position as teacher of social sciences. Miss Bernier had several years successful experience in junior high work in Massachusetts.

Miss Rachel Kendrick was transferred to the science department in Junior High.

Miss Katherine Lyons was transferred to Oak St. first grade from West Side.

Miss Eunice O'Mara of Franklin, a teacher of successful experience, was secured to fill the first grade vacancy.

Miss Mary Mros, an accelerated junior at Keene Teachers accepted the position as teacher of the second grade at West Side.

Mrs. Phyllis Young, who prior to her marriage had taught rural school with success, was secured for the East Derry vacancy.

Mr. Charles Wingate agreed to take over the shop work at Oak St. on a part time basis.

Miss Olive Cahoon, a graduate of Lowell Teachers' College, accepted the position of music supervisor.

Mr. Starr Verge Sr. was secured as janitor at Oak St.

Mrs. Ruth Murray, a graduate of the New York State School of Home Economics at Cornell University, was

engaged as Home Economics teacher. A combination of circumstances forced Mrs. Murray to resign Feb. 2. The situation in this particular field is so acute that no permanent solution in filling this position can be reported at present. Strenuous efforts have been and are being made to secure a satisfactory substitute for the balance of the year.

The personnel situation was aggravated by the serious accident which Miss Nellie Webster had early in the year. The number of available substitutes is so limited that absences of the regular teaching staff create a serious situation. Fortunately the schools, for the most part, have not had to operate with substitutes of no experience. Absences of teachers have not been concurrent so that even with the limited number available the schools have had teachers of experience to fill vacancies.

The children of Derry have fortunately had trained teachers of competence. In a period of teacher shortage that is a fine tribute to the loyal, conscientious service of the teaching staff of the Derry Schools.

Miss Effie Plante and Miss Etta Merrill attended summer school at Plymouth. Mr. Henry Hastings is attending Boston University Saturdays at the present time. In the pressure of war time activities, the teachers who in the interest of professional improvement, spare neither time nor money, are deserving of high commendation.

#### Instruction

The usual testing program was administered in the spring. The results were satisfactory. Results of the reading system adopted several years ago and augmented by recent textbooks acquisitions by allied authors are beginning to reveal themselves. Almost without exception the reading scores are in excess of the established norms. Reading which is basic in so many

fields is the one tool subject which can and does influence pupil progress more than any other single academic factor.

The one incongruous result in our test results is spelling. With an improvement in reading a natural concomitant would seem to be an improvement in spelling which is somewhat related to reading. The reverse was true however. Our spelling results were in general the poorest. In an effort to ascertain whether we could improve our scores in spelling new materials were introduced in two grades. If study of the results obtained show a definite and decided improvement the same spelling course will be introduced at other grade levels to endeavor to have a general improvement.

The physical education program is continuing still on a somewhat curtailed basis. There is continuing evidence in educational publications that one of the educational trends of the post war period will be an expansion of this program. The health of the children is of vital importance and leaders are stressing the need of correcting remedial defects through a program of physical education.

The music department presented the pageant last year as the school department's contribution to the Red Cross drive. The sum of \$200 was realized and turned over to the drive. This year the same program will be followed.

The program of introducing new readers and arithmetics was continued. The problem of textbooks is increasingly becoming more difficult. Paper quotas established by W. L. B. present difficulties in obtaining books. The textual material needs to be appraised and revised constantly so that the textbooks offerings can be factually correct and of interest to our pupils.

The fourth annual Declamation contest by the Derry Junior High School was held Friday evening, May 12, 1944. Those taking part were Warren Pillsbury, Leona

Latulippe, Carolyn Nutt, Faith Fry, Joan Thacher, Raymond Couture, Phyllis George, Kenneth Libbey, Anna Dawn Eaton, Corrine Goodheart, Patricia Blanchard, Rita Cote, Faylene Henderson, Francis Bartlett and Irene Estabrook. Music was provided by a group from junior high.

The schools are continuing to support the war effort through the weekly sale of stamps. The habit of regular savings may have a "carry-over" value that can hardly be estimated. The total sales for the present year up to Feb. 1 was \$3,554.75.

In September the boys and girls collected 191 bags of milk weed pods. The milk weed floss is used as a substitute for kapok in life preservers and 2 bags furnish sufficient filling for one preserver.

#### Maintainance

The usual program of maintainance was initiated during the summer months. Rooms and corridors were painted, floors refinished, desks sanded and refinished in all the schools. The work of our janitors is worthy of high praise. The buildings are maintained in good condition through their painstaking efforts and there is a resultant economy in our maintainance bill.

In addition to the usual repairs the remodeling of shop facilities involved major alterations in Oak St. basement. By shifting several partitions the set up of machinery, tool room, storage for projects, and benches was improved considerably. The addition of a lathe and sander made the work of the shop more efficient.

The area close to the building at Oak St. School and Floyd were hard surfaced with a bituminous material. This provides more adequate drainage and prevents the erosion of the ground close to the foundation.

These last three projects are permanent in nature and will prove beneficial for several years.

In cooperation with the W. F. A. the schools have continued the milk and hot lunch program. The milk program began in October and hot lunches in December. Since the beginning of the programs 14,516 half pints of milk have been served and 3069 hot lunches. A nominal fee is charged and with the assistance of W. F. A. the total cost of the program is defrayed so that no charge accrues to the district. The program can be operated only because the teachers and janitors assume the added responsibility of the preparation of the lunches.

### Budget

The overall budget shows an increase of \$472.92. Several items show minor increases with the total increase the indicated amount.

The tax levy, however, is increased \$2,686.04. The decrease in estimated income is the cause of this increase. The budget adopted last year showed an increase in the overall budget of \$3,144.04 over 1943-44. The surplus accumulated by increased state aid was part of an estimated income increase of \$4,161. This enabled the school district to decrease its tax levy. Since this surplus income has now been used the budget proposed is merely based on a truer income base and the increased tax levy is a result of the use of the accumulated surplus.

### Conclusion

The pupils of your schools are progressing educationally at a normal rate. That they are in these times is noteworthy. The conscientious work of your teachers has made this possible. The teachers are assisted in their work by the thoughtful planning of the school board who endeavor to provide the necessary tools of learning in sufficient quantity to facilitate the learning of the pupils.

I appreciate the cooperation that these groups have given me. Another factor of importance is the fine attitude of parents, pupils and citizens all of whom evidence their cooperation in many ways. This has been more especially true in the past few months when conditions have been extraordinarily difficult.

ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION  
PERSONNEL

The personnel problem has fortunately not affected the Derry Village School. Mrs. Alice Follansbee and Mrs. Frances Smith returned to their respective positions. The children are fortunate that their educational progress has been under adequately trained teachers of competence. This condition is not characteristic of the country as a whole and it is hoped that the district may retain the services of the present staff so as to maintain the standard of educational service rendered.

There was one change made in the organization of the school for the present year. The school felt the

effect of increased primary enrollment for the first time. The enrollment in the primary room was on Jan. 31, 1945 almost 70% larger than the intermediate room. This condition was also true in September. In order to effect an equitable distribution of teacher time and to allow for the drill time necessary for 1st and 2nd grade in reading the third grade was moved into the intermediate room for all classes except reading. If the present trend in enrollment continues as statistics would seem to indicate, the arrangement may be continued until a better balance of enrollment in the two rooms is evidenced.

The usual summer program of repairs and cleaning was continued. The policy of maintaining the building in a good state of repair is sound and will prove over the years to be the most economical. The district is fortunate that Mr. Glidden continues as janitor for his conscientious service aids materially in the maintainance of the building.

The schools in general felt the impact of our war economy more severely than heretofore. The Derry Village School like others had impaired services due to conditions beyond control. The most severe impairment was caused by delays in shipment of books and seat work materials. The underlying cause was the paper shortage. With quotas exhausted publishers were forced to delay, until new quotas of paper were available, the manufacture of standard materials. In some cases there was a nine months lapse between the date of the order and the arrival of material. An attempt is being made to allow for such an extraordinary time lag in an effort to avoid a similar situation for the next school year.

The same condition (paper supply) has affected the supplies used in the school to a slight extent. The W. L. B. has set limitations on the weight of certain grades

of paper. The quality of the paper is inferior and it necessarily is observable in the quality of work that can be produced. Both these conditions are temporary and constitute part of the contribution of the nation's schools to the war effort.

The teachers continue to administer the program of war stamp sales as a further contribution to the war effort. This is one phase that can have a carry over value of importance. The habit of regular savings will be one that may have permanence in the lives of our pupils.

In addition the pupils participated in the nation wide effort to provide a substitute for kapok in life preservers. The pupils of the state collected slightly over 12,000 bags of milk weed pods. This amount will, it is estimated, provide over 6,000 life preservers. The pupils of Derry Village School gathered 23 bushels of the pods as their contribution.

A study of the budget reveals an increase of \$160.21 in the overall estimate of the school board. The increase is practically all in salaries. The trend on a nation and state wide basis is to increase the salaries of teaching personnel in order to retain the services of competent experienced teachers. A slight increase in the budget is justified if it can assure the district of retaining good teachers.

The decrease in income of \$500 causes an increase in tax levy of \$650. In view of increased costs in all phases of our life this increase, the first since 1941 of any size, is understandable.

The fact that schools have operated as well as they have is due to the continued cooperation of all in meet-

ing any situations which arise. This cooperation I deeply appreciate for the extraordinary demands of a period like this made such cooperation a necessity if schools are to function well.
