THE PAUL REVERE BELL

The Cover Design

The picture of the Paul Revere bell on the cover is a reprint from "Historic Bells of N. H.", by Mrs. Eva A. Spear, who kindly loaned us the cut. The following description of the Hancock bell is from the same book.

The original meeting house at Hancock was destroyed by fire the year before church and state separated. In 1819 the Congregational Church and the town combined to build the beautiful edifice that both still occupy. The storied steeple is a copy of the designs of Elias Carter of Connecticut Valley fame and in its belfry hangs bell number 236 on the stock book list. The illustration offers many points of observation for the reader. The conspicuous yoke of oak is banded with strips of iron and turns at the axis in a groove in the oak beam of the frame.

A mechanic called attention to the square or four sided nuts that hold the bolts of the iron bands, a contrast to the six sided nuts of later introduction. The staples that were cast above the shoulder of the Revere bells are characteristics that were changed to a simple form of headstock as displayed in other illustrations.

This bell weighs 1,166 pounds and bears the trade mark, "Revere & Son, Boston, 1820". Number 236 seems to prove that the bell at Effingham was cast before the Hancock bell, but was not purchased until 1821; that is, a year later.

REPORT OF ELECTRIC LIGHT COMMITTEE

The total revenue for the eleven months from the electric light system was \$5,500.00.

The only new customer added to the lines was Philip Engstrom.

The expense of maintaining the system was small during the period. The wind storm in September affected us very little and the damage was much less severe than in the hurricane of 1938. We have done some trimming on the main line this fall and hope to do more in the spring if labor is available. Two sets of repeating cut outs have been installed on the main line which should result in fewer interruptions in service. We have made some progress in the pole replacement program and all the new poles have been set and paid for. We hope labor will be available during the coming year to change over our wires to the remainder of the new poles.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS TO THE SCHOOL BOARD OF HANCOCK

I submit herewith my eleventh annual report, the statistical summary of the Hancock Schools for 1943-1944, and the annual report of Miss Margaret E. Harris, R. N.

The enrollment for the fall term of the present school year was practically the same as last year. The September enrollment was 99, but during the first month five pupils moved away leaving the enrollment 94, the same as the enrollment for last year.

The work of the Senior and Junior High Schools has been carried on with its usual high standard. Miss Manchester has been able to rearrange the work of the Junior High grades to meet the needs of the present classes.

The primary and intermediate grades have been carried on as last year with the first three grades in charge of Miss Welsh while Mrs. Black has had grades four, five and six.

At the opening of school in September Mrs. Whitcomb gave up her work in music to accept a position in Vermont where her supervision could be carried on in a single town, and it was several weeks before arrangements could be made to resume

the work in music.

Fortunately we were able to secure the services of Miss Margaret M. Robb who teaches grades five and six in Dublin, and teaches the music for all the grades in the Consolidated school. By securing a substitute for one half day each week Miss Robb has been able to give one forenoon to the Hancock schools.

Miss Robb is a graduate of the Winona, Minnesota Teachers' College and has a degree in music from Oberlin College, and has

taught music in both public and private schools.

The Hancock schools are fortunate in times like the present to secure and retain the services of well trained and experienced teachers.

I thank the school board, teachers, pupils and parents for their loyal and continued support.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$85.00 for the Monadnock Region Association or take any action relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to provide supervision at the bathing beach, raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an adequate sum of money for Workmen's Compensation and Public Liability Insurance, or take any action relating thereto.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$609.04 for Town road aid, the State to contribute \$2,436.17, or take any action relating thereto.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,276.50 for State aid construction, this amount to be set aside for use after the war.
- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day and Old Home Week, or take any action relating thereto.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to make any change in the water rates, or take any action relating thereto.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry Department, or take any action relating thereto.
- 12. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department or take any action relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes or take any action relating thereto.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of one percent on property taxes paid on or before August 15th, 1945, or take any action relating thereto.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for necessary repairs on the Town Library, or take any action relating thereto.
- 16. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to be added to the Capital Reserve fund for building a tool and fire house, or take any action relating thereto.
- 17. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the care of the Town dump, or take any action relating thereto.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the use of the Town, or take any action relating thereto.
- 19. To hear reports of Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and take any action relating thereto.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
