TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire:

To the inhabitants of the town of Hebron in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Hall in said Hebron on Tuesday, the Fourteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forence, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Polls open from 5 to 9 p.m. Business meeting will open at 7 p.m.

- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to give two percent cash discount on property taxes, if paid thirty days from date of tax bill.
- 5. To see if the Town will accept and maintain approximately a one-half mile portion of the Hobart Hill Road extending south-westerly from the Glines Place, so-called.
- 6. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be divided equally between the Mary Hitchcock Hospital at Hanover and the Sceva Speare Hospital at Plymouth.

- 7. To raise a sum of money as may be necessary to purchase and install transcievers for Police Vehicles and make an appropriation of the same.
- 8. To see if the meeting will authorize the Moderator to appoint a committee to see what changes or additions may be necessary in the area of fire fighting equipment (This committee is to report their findings at the next annual meeting).
- 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

PRESENT CEMETERY REGULATIONS

1. Eligibility for receiving a free lot in the Village

Cemetery be restated along the following line:

A resident of two years' standing may have assigned to him without cost a lot in the Village Cemetery for use of his family when the need for such a lot arises. Former residency does not make him eligible. Husbands, wives and children and children's spouses and minor children constitute the family eligible for burial in the free lot. Residents without family will have single graves assigned to them. The cemetery has been divided into lots with space for six graves each with some containing a lesser number. The Selectmen will determine how the lots or graves are to be allotted. Once a lot has been properly assigned and the holder of the lot is no longer a resident of Town, the unused spaces in such lot will be held for his heirs for a period of fifty years unless application is made in writing to the Selectmen, setting forth for whom the spaces in the lot are to be held. This is to be retroactive.

- 2. A fee of \$10.00 is to be levied for each grave of a non-resident who qualifies for burial in a lot as set forth above. Such sums received will go towards the maintenance of the cemetery.
- 3. There are quite a number of unmarked graves and unknown graves. The Town will purchase temporary cast iron markers to be placed at the grave at the time of interment. Should the family fail to have a stone set within two years, the Town would furnish a small, plain stone with name only at the grave for future identification.
- 4. The Cemetery Committee is hereby dissolved and the responsibility for the cemeteries is returned to the hands of the Selectmen.

FIRE RECORD

Fire records are made by people—those who cause fires and those who control them. Your forest fire warden, deputy wardens, fire chief and firemen have, in spite of a prolonged drought, made one of the best fire control records in recent years. Despite a very dry spring, we in New Hampshire working together, have substantially reduced our fire incidence (885 in 1965 to 595 in 1966.)

This enviable record is largely due to two factors:

- 1. A closely coordinated and integrated statetown organization jointly carrying out programs of forest fire prevention, training and suppression with dedicated personnel.
- 2. Your appreciation of our forest fire control program and your individual effort in practicing fire prevention.

Statistics show, however, there is room for improvement. Major problems are still with us; (1) the careless disposal of cigarettes; (2) the householder's carelessness in burning rubbish; (3) the failure of woodlot owners and contractors to completely extinguish their brush burning fires; (4) failure to extinguish camp fires; (5) unsupervised children playing with matches.

New Hampshire has 4,339,000 acres of woodland to be protected. In 1966 we experienced 595 fires on this area and restricted acreage burned to 395 acres—a fine testimonial to the efficiency and dedication of the men who make up our forest fire control organization.

1. If you must burn you will need a permit. Permits are not issued between 9:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. except on rainy days. Permits are not needed when the ground is covered with

snow. To minimize risk the best way to dispose of rubbish is at your authorized town or municipal dumping area.

- 2. Be sure all discarded smoking material is out.
- 3. Don't leave a live camp or cooking fire.
- 4. Most important—Instruct your children that matches are not playthings.
