

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hinsdale qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall on Tuesday the 14th of March, 1961, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To cast your ballots for all necessary town officers.

Article 2. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the revised laws relative to playing games of beano shall be adopted in this town.

Polls open on the above articles at 10 A. M. and shall not be closed earlier than 7:30 P. M.

Action will be taken on the following articles beginning at 7:30 P. M.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept and adopt the report of the Selectmen, Auditors and other town Officers.

Article 4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of ordinary town charges, for the maintenance of the fire department, for highways, and for all other necessary expenses arising within the town. (See Budget)

Article 5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$80,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year, from taxes collected within the current municipal year.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$471.09 to which the State will contribute \$3,140.58 to be expended on Class 5 roads. (Town Road Aid) (Inserted by the Selectmen)

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to close by gates and bars, under Chapter 95, Part 1, Revised Laws, State of New Hampshire, Oak Hill Road so called, and the short piece of road formerly part of Route 119, running southerly from the so-called Liscom's brook, located east of new Highway 119.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a gift a deed from the State Highway Department, Concord, N. H. for land formerly owned by Mrs. Delia Waterbury and taken by the land damage committee. This land is located on the west side of the Brattleboro Road on Route 119 and is to be used for a roadside park. This lot contains six acres more or less, as described in the deed. (Inserted by Selectmen)

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the water commission to take option for the purchase of land to protect the watershed of the Town Water Supply at North Hinsdale, and report the estimated cost of the land involved at the next Annual Town Meeting.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the water commission to obtain options of property on the water shed of the town gravity water system, or act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by Selectmen)

Article 11. To see if the Town will appropriate \$450.00 (Four hundred fifty dollars) for the purchase of 100 (one hundred) chairs for the Town Hall. (Inserted by Selectmen)

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to install and maintain two street lights on Prospect Street so-called: one at the intersection of Prospect Street and Playground Road and one at or near the corner at the Kathleen Russell Residence. (Inserted by petition) Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate sufficient amount of money to erect and maintain two street lights, one at each entrance of the approach to the Monument Road from the recently constructed State Highway 119. (Inserted by petition)

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the John Smith collection of Indian Relies, (All found locally and pertaining to the History of Hinsdale), as a gift to the Town from his brother, Milan Smith and his sister, Mattie (Smith) Laffond, providing that the collection will be properly displayed, suitably housed, and maintained in the Community Room, or a similar Town Building available to the Public, and to vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for any additional showcases, locks, lighting, repairs to existing cases, or for any item necessary for the proper maintenance of the collection, or to act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by Selectmen)

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to be used by the Selectmen in the promotion of obtaining new industries to locate in Hinsdale. The above sum to be used for the printing and mailing of a brochure explaining to industries what Hinsdale has to offer for new industries to build and locate in Hinsdale, or to act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by Selectmen)

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 (Five-hundred dollars), the money to be used to paint the guard rails and guard posts in the village streets, or act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by petition)

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 (Two Thousand dollars) to be used to replace or repair the existing surface drain in Fitzgerald Court and also to lower and resurface the existing road, so the surface drain may accomplish its purpose, or act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by petition)

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 (Two-thousand dollars) to resur-

face or reconstruct sidewalk on Canal Street, or act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by Selectmen)

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to purchase a 4-Wheel Payloader with full equipment, truck, snow plow and sidewalk plow for the Highway Department, or take any action thereon. (Inserted by petition)

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the action taken on Article 9 appearing in the Warrant of the Town Meeting of March 10, 1959 relative to the responsibility for the extension of water supplies; Article 9 above referred to read as follows:

"To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Water and Sewer Commissioners and the Selectmen to provide for additional water supply if found necessary, such additional supply to be paid for from income of the Water Department and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town for such additional facilities, provided payment of both principal and interest can be paid for by the Water Department.

(Inserted by the Water Department) (Inserted by petition)

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to extend the Town water main into the Pierce development or take any action relating thereto. The estimated cost is \$4,500.00 (Forty-five hundred dollars) (Inserted by petition)

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to enclose the swimming pool located at the playground with a chain link fence and gate. (Inserted by petition)

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 (Five-hundred dollars) to tar the street on Indian Acres, from Vito Rizzi's to Howard Soskin's east line, a distance of 630 feet, or act in any manner thereon when this street has been accepted by the Selectmen. (Inserted by petition)

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to install a blinker traffic light at the intersection of Gray's Corner (Plain Road) and Brattleboro Road. The State to pay for the traffic light at an approximate cost of one-hundred and fifty dollars and the Town to pay for the installation of the light only, at approximately the cost of one-hundred and fifty dollars, and to maintain the light thereafter, or to act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by petition)

Article 25. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$100.00 (One-hundred dollars) for the expense involved in setting up a numbering system for the buildings on the named streets in the Town. (Inserted by petition)

Article 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The total circulation of books shows an increase of 1544 volumes over that of last year. It is a large circulation in proportion to the population and a fact of which the town may well be proud, as it averages approximately thirteen books per person.

The non-fiction shows a substantial increase due to the fact that many of the young people are reading this type of book in preference to novels. Even the children in the elementary grades show a marked interest in books pertaining to science, social studies and biography. The majority of young people of today read at a much higher age level than those of even a generation ago and this means that we must buy the best books available to maintain the high standard of reading demanded by them.

During the year soiled and worn out books have been discarded, others have been rebound and three hundred fifty-five (355) new books have been placed on the shelves. The elementary school teachers have borrowed collections of books for their home rooms from time to time and the high school students use our reference facilities daily. Several classes from the English Department of the High School, accompanied by their teachers, have visited the library to be instructed by the librarian in the use of the library and its tools.

National Library Week in April and National Book Week in November were observed with appropriate posters, book markers and displays of new books. The latest edition of Webster's New International Dictionary was purchased in November and will be a valuable addition to our reference section. During the year the library was the recipient of a gift subscription to the Manchester Union Leader. It is greatly appreciated.

The librarian attended the New Hampshire Library Association meeting held in Winchester in May. She also attended the New England Association meeting in Swampscott, Mass. in October.

The library hours continue to be as follows: 2:30 to 5:00 p. m. every afternoon except Tuesday and 6:00 to 8:00 p. m. every evening except Saturday.

The librarian wishes at this time to thank the Board of Trustees for their help and cooperation during the past year. She also wishes to express her appreciation and thanks to the teachers who have visited the library. It makes it much easier for the librarian, teacher and student if preparation for outside reading demands can be made in advance of the assignment.

The young adult readers and the children continue to be a pleasure to work with and each school year, new readers discover the fun and joy to be found in the world of books.

Once again we cordially invite you to visit your library.

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Hinsdale for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1960, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector. Town Clerk, Water and Sewer Departments, Library, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1959—December 31, 1960: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1959 and December 31, 1960, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$24,450.25 in 1960.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures ---Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1960, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$1,224.02, plus a revenue surplus of \$4,172.30, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$5,396.32.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1960, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1960, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit H)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1960, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit H.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$2,450.25, from \$11,930.96 to \$14,381.21, in 1960, as shown herewith:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the tenth day of March, 1961, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To choose Agents, Auditors, Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

7. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

8. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.

9. To consider the report of the School Planning Committee and to see if the District will vote to proceed with the proposed plans as outlined in the preliminary drawings, or act in any manner thereon.

10. If the preceding article is acted on favorably, to see if the District will authorize the School Board, acting with the School Planning Committee, to have plans and specifications prepared for the construction of the proposed high school, and appropriate the sum of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00), to be added to our 1960 balance, for the preparation of such plans and specifications.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL PLANNING COMMITTEE

Acting upon the decision of the voters at the last annual School Meeting, the school planning committee pursued the project of investigating the possible construction of a high school building for the Town of Hinsdale.

Our first meetings were held for the purpose of interviewing architects. After interviewing a sufficient number of them, we decided upon Mr. Edward L. Baker of Leominster, Mass. He has been very cooperative and helpful in his work with the committee.

Quite a few of our meetings were concerned with the number of classrooms, cafeteria, and other aspects of the proposed building. On two occasions, representatives of the State Dept. of Education were present to offer their suggestions. The plans, as proposed so far, have been approved by the State Dept. of Education.

If the two articles in the School Warrant concerning the new school are accepted by the voters, the committee plans to call a special school meeting sometime in the fall for the purpose of voting on the bond issue to raise the necessary funds for the actual construction of the building.

It is estimated by the architect that it will cost approximately \$290,000 to construct the building, and it will require \$29,000 for the furnishings. The architect's fee is figured at the rate of 6% of the actual construction cost.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

To the Superintendent of Schools:

I herewith submit my eighth annual report as principal of the Hinsdale Schools.

The elementary school adopted a revised reading program, based in part on the Joplin Plan. Simplified, this reading program is ungraded. Test results obtained from the annual evaluation program, plus scores from a specialized reading test was used in placing pupils in homogeneous groups. Levels of reading are substituted for grades. Each child may advance in reading as rapidly as his ability permits. Testing is the established method of determining rapidity of progress. To date, both pupils and teachers indicate a decided preference for this newly adopted ungraded program over the one previously in use.

It is quite conceivable that with continued success in reading a similar ungraded program could be effected in other subject areas.

Uniformity in spelling was also effected with the adoption of a standardized program in grades three through eight. Six teachers studied within this area this past summer.

All grades except grade six are now in two divisions. This one grade, composed of forty-three pupils, poses a severe challenge to the teacher in charge. However, every effort is being made by the teacher to do the best job possible under these most trying circumstances.

Home Economics and Industrial Arts having been added to seventh and eighth grade curriculum, a well-rounded program is now in effect. It is encouraging to note these additions were made as advocated in my report a year ago.

Science instruction within the elementary area has broadened. N.D.E.A. contributions have aided here by increasing needed equipment and apparatus for demonstrative instruction. An accelerated program of science, beginning in grade one, is necessary for the preparation of pupils for their more advanced studies and especially so for those who may pursue this field in college.

Considerable progress is apparent in the Kindergarten area. From supervisory contacts and observation it would appear this will prove to be of considerable value in preparing the children for their more formal education.

Assemblies are held periodically with grades one through four sharing in one area, and grades five through eight the other. Each teacher sponsors an assembly based on some phase of the total program. Pupil participation is one hundred per cent.

Lunch is served daily in two divisions. Actual eating time has been lengthened as has the recess period immediately following. Teachers supervise their own divisions and share this period with pupils by again actually sitting at the same table area.

Supervision of play periods has been increased providing improved observation and control of activities. As recess is designed for the purpose of releasing excess physical energies, uninhibited play prevails. Age groups, where not doing so naturally, are encouraged to engage in recreatory activities within their own groups, thus the excellent playground space is well populated with a diversification of interests.

Hinsdale is one of many schools enjoying the services of the New Hampshire Bookmobile. As a result of this fine service, each room receives twenty or thirty books per month which supplements the reading program.

Field Trips sponsored by the P.T.A. provided all elementary grades with the opportunity of visiting new places and enjoying related experiences. Teachers and pupils alike expressed appreciation for these added opportunities.

Achievement tests were administered to all pupils of the elementary grades. Mental Maturity tests were administered in grades one, three, five and eight. State sponsored aptitude and ability tests were given grades seven and eight. Test results show a steady growth in all areas. Norms used were established on a national level and pupils are averaging above these norms. I am extremely proud to report that the elementary school is functioning as smoothly and progressively as anyone could wish. I do not know of a single teacher who is unhappy in this area. This is supported, I believe, by the fact that it has not been necessary to call to your attention, or that of the school board, a single problem of major or minor consequence this year.

On the high school level, I am pleased to report that thirtyseven per cent of last year's graduates are participating in post-secondary study. I am quite proud of this fact as it is a thirty-two per cent gain over that achieved my first year as principal of this school.

Every member of the class of 1960 is occupied. In addition to those going to school, others are either working or in the armed services.

Hinsdale was honored this past summer in having a pupil of the secondary area attend the St. Paul's Advanced Study Group. This program is sponsored by the Ford Foundation and attendance is by invitation only. It would appear that we will again be so honored this coming summer.

It is unfortunate that a reduction in class time within the commercial area was deemed necessary this year. This important study cannot stand a reduction of thirty-six teaching periods per year and maintain the standards presently existing. The return to alternating subjects is equally disturbing. Small classes within certain specialized areas will probably continue to be the rule; however, our pupils do need equality in subjects and length of courses found in nearby schools, and I again strongly recommend that serious consideration be given to halting any further regression.

Installation of the Foreign Language Laboratory is complete, and encouraging results are already in evidence. This aid should result in increased interest in the study of languages.

With the adoption of the revised Language Arts Guide, instruction in the field of English is rapidly improving. Continuity of growth from grade one through twelve is considerably strengthened by this addition. Each teacher of English now has defined areas for instruction, thus reducing, if not eliminating the danger of overlapping or an excessive gap between grades. Freedom of technique is not infringed upon, alA decided increase in numbers is occurring within the general educational group. Many pupils with a known potential for more complicated studies are electing this area. This fact should be of serious concern to parents who may want their children as fully qualified for the future as our school can offer, but who do not understand the course selection procedure. Visitation and parental conferences are definitely invited.

I am convinced the establishment of grade standards in all subject areas would add strength to the secondary program and therefore recommend that serious consideration be given the adoption of such a step. I also wish to be recorded as advocating the adoption of written policies governing the total operation of education in Hinsdale.

This has been advocated for all schools, both by the New Hampshire Educators Association and by the State Board of Education.

Reporting on Departments:

Within the Home Economics area, a revised program of education, adopted as a result of teachers and State Department working together has been introduced. The new demand made upon this division of education by our ever-changing social and economic life has increased the breadth of coverage in study required. One can no longer consider Home Economics as designed exclusively for "future homemakers." It is rapidly becoming as well a preparatory program for training following high school.

At the conclusion of the past school year, girls of this area presented a well received Style Show at the May meeting of P.T.A.

Industrial Arts is also facing expanding demands for broader coverage of subject offering. Technilogical growth requires the addition of sciences and mathematics and will require changes in the program now being offered.

Boys from this shop displayed projects made during the year at the New Hampshire Industrial Art Fair held in Littleton last spring and several received ribbons of recognition for their work. The music program culminated its efforts with an excellent Spring Concert. In addition, those pupils participating within the instrumental area demonstrated their ability publicly on other occasions. Hinsdale was represented in both the All-State Band and the All-State chorus during April. From results observed to date, one can expect improved participation in this.

The high school athletic program enjoyed a respectable participation in spring sports. Due to the lack of a coach, girls' volleyball was not undertaken this fall. Socker experienced a period of rebuilding: However, Hinsdale missed the play-off by a mere percentage point. Basketball, as an interscholastic sport, is facing serious difficulties. The boys and girls of Hinsdale are facing players in league schools who have experienced two and three years of coaching and play before entering high school. This is the result of other league schools having physical education and an adequate facility for such a program.

Hinsdale has been fortunate in obtaining the services of young teachers who are interested in giving their time in aiding the boys and girls within the sport program. However, our major competitors are seeking experienced coaches and this fact combined with regulation play facilities places Hinsdale in a most precarious position in league competition. Hinsdale desires winning teams as intensly as do others. With Charlestown, Vilas, Walpole, Marlboro, Troy and St. Mary's all possessing gyms and instructors who start youngsters in grades six and seven, it is apparent that the boys and girls of Hinsdale face overwhelming odds.

The annual trip to Washington was successfully completed. Much credit is due the mothers of those making the trip and to the townspeople who so generously gave of their time and resources to assure this success. The present class faces an even more difficult task in raising sufficient funds for this endeavor. Costs are continually increasing. Some solution must be found for assuring this project.

Our schools still continue to enjoy the excellent service provided by Mr. Brandl and Mr. Bouchie. Their personal interest in the safety and comfort of pupils in their charge is most gratifying.

Our custodial services continue to be superior. The elementary school has been repeatedly commented upon in this respect by visitors from other school areas.

Dr. Nichols, with the capable assistance of Mrs. Bradbury, conducted physical examinations of all school pupils this year.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Hinsdale:

I have the honor to submit my fourteenth annual report.

Staff Changes: High School—There were two changes in the faculty of Hinsdale High School as schools opened in September. Mrs. Elizabeth T. Sikoski replaced Mr. William E. Beane as teacher of English and Foreign Languages. Mr. Beane resigned to accept a position in Peterboro. Mrs. Sikoski is a graduate of Middlebury College. Miss Elizabeth M. Swancott, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, was elected to the English and Social Studies position vacated by Mr. Robert W. Blakslee, who resigned to accept a position elsewhere.

Elementary School—There are four new teachers in the Hinsdale Elementary School. Mrs. Harriet B. LaChance resigned at the end of the 1959-1960 school year. Mrs. LaChance was the teacher in the kindergarten since its inception in 1949. It is hoped that she will enjoy to the fullest her years of retirement which she so courageously has earned. Miss Winifred D. McCarthy, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, is the present kindergarten teacher.

Upon the resignation of Mrs. Joanne E. Tenney, Mrs. Sandra O. Salo was elected to one of the first grade positions. Mrs. Salo is a Keene Teachers College graduate. Mrs. Sandra H. Bean was elected to the fourth grade position vacated by Mrs. Phyllis M. Fearon. Mrs. Bean, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, taught last year in Hollis, New Hampshire. Mr. Joseph P. G. Lessard left us to take a position in Lincoln, Massachusetts. He has been replaced in the seventh and eighth grade area by Mr. Raymond W. Miner, Jr., who graduated from Keene Teachers College.

It is interesting to note that comparing the current enrollment figures in this year's report with those of a year ago there are ten fewer pupils currently enrolled, six in the elementary school and four in the high school. Repeating what has been written in previous reports, caution should be exercised in using and interpreting the figures in the above tables. They are merely indicative in nature and serve to show only what the enrollment trend might be. The figures do not take into account the pupils who could possibly leave Hinsdale or who could possibly move to Hinsdale. They also do not discount dropouts from high school. For instance, in last year's report the possible future enrollment in the high school for 1960-61 was 152 whereas actually the current enrollment for 1960-61 is 135. The figures in the above high school table are undoubtedly too high, particularly those for the eleventh and twelfth grades where the compulsory school attendance age begins to lose its effect. The table for the elementary school should be considerably more reliable.

Hinsdale School Facilities: It goes without saying that our elementary school plant is most excellent. By acquiring one additional classroom, probably from the all-purpose room, class size in no instance would be excessive. Heating, ventilation and lighting are good. We have a large well-equipped cafeteria, an adequate health room, a pleasant teachers' room, a special room for instrumental music instruction, adequate storage areas and sufficient janitorial closets. We have a spacious all-purpose room, half of which would be lost, however, to gain one additional classroom.

The picture at the high school is diametrically opposite. Here we have an outmoded structure built in the latter part of the nineteenth century. It has served the town of Hinsdale well but by today's standards it has outlived its usefulness. Heating is good but the ventilation and lighting are poor. The facilities are totally inadequate in which to provide good modern instruction. The science laboratory is extremely poor in an age when scientific knowledge is becoming increasingly more important. The facilities for home economics and industrial arts are quite inadequate. The commercial education courses are cramped for space. Classrooms for academic instruction are limited to the extent that it is difficult to schedule classes. In short, the building which suited the needs at the turn of century is seriously handicapped in attempting to do so in the decade of the 60's.

The above is not news to the citizens of Hinsdale. That they are well aware of the conditions is attested by the fact that they have a school planning committee which is working to provide a solution to Hinsdale's secondary school housing problems. The school planning committee and the school board have met jointly with Architects Edwoard L. Baker and Son of Leominster, Massachusetts, for the purpose of having preliminary drawings made for a new high school for Hinsdale. A report on the progress made will be presented to the people at the next annual school district meeting.

Educational Improvements: The Hinsdale School Board is to be highly commended for constantly striving to bring about improvements in our educational system. Three noteworthy advances have been made thus far this year. The first of these is the introduction of a plan for ability grouping in reading, the second is the return of home economics and manual training to the curriculum for the seventh and eighth grades, and the third is the installation of a language laboratory in Hinsdale High School.

Ability grouping in reading attained national attention when the plan put into effect in Joplin, Missouri, was publicized in the Saturday Evening Post. Modified Joplin plans have been tried with varying degrees of success in nearby communities. True to the pioneering spirit, Hinsdale introduced such a plan in the elementary school this year. In essence, the plan simply allows a pupil to make progress in reading as slowly or as rapidly as his ability will allow. Grouping according to traditional grade levels is set aside and grouping according to reading levels comes into being. No stigma is attached to pupils who are reading at a lower level than their contemporaries. All pupils should be able to make more rapid progress in reading than they would have under the traditional method of reading instruction within the four walls of a grade level classroom.

By means of re-scheduling, it was found possible for the

seventh and eighth grade pupils to have instruction in home economics and manual training once more. We have received perfect cooperation from our school transporters, Mr. Robert Brandl and Mr. Guy Bouchie, in accomplishing this since it was necessary to transport pupils between the two schools during the school day.

A language laboratory is a necessity in modern foreign language instruction. High school graduates going on to college who have not had the privilege of studying with this aid find themselves at a marked disadvantage in competition with those who are familiar with this type of instruction. It essentially consists of electronics equipment comprising tape recorders, microphones, headsets, etc. Pupils listen to tape recordings, make tape recordings, listen to their own voices to improve pronounciation and are under the supervision of their teacher who has access to master controls. A six station installation is being made at Hinsdale High School. The individual pupil booths and the teacher's console have been constructed by the boys in the Industrial Arts Department. Half of the expense of the language laboratory will be borne by the federal government under the provisions of the National Defense Education Act.

Unfortunately, we were unable to secure the services of a guidance counselor for Hinsdale High School. There were too few qualified candidates and those who were interviewed were discouraged by the poor facilities of the old building. We will attempt to fill the position for the next school year. It is hoped that the National Defense Education Act will ultimately bring about a more plentiful supply of guidance personnel.

In conclusion, may I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the teachers, pupils and parents, the School Planning Committee, the School Board and the patrons of our schools for their cooperation.
