THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Landaff, in the county of Grafton and state of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Landaff, Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at nine of the o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.

Art. 3. To see what action the town will take in regard to State Aid for highways, and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

Art. 4. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

Art. 5. To see if town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 6. To see what action the town will take in regard to snow removal.

Art. 7. To see how much money the town will raise or appropriate for repairs on road machine house.

Art. 8. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD AND CITIZENS OF LANDAFF:

The total enrollment last year was 60, compared to a total of 69 the year before. The average membership was 55.24 and the per cent. of attendance 92.95. There were thirteen pupils attending Lisbon High school and two pupils attending the Nutter school in Bath.

This year your total enrollment is only 52, distributed as follows: Seventeen in the Blue school, 16 at Ireland and 19 at Scotland. There are ten pupils at Lisbon High school and one attending the Nutter school. The Center school was closed, and the pupils of this district are attending either the Scotland or Ireland schools without having to provide any transportation.

There is only one change in your teaching staff this year. Miss Elizabeth Hayes of Gorham, a graduate of Plymouth Normal school in 1936, is teaching at Scotland in the place of Miss Trevena, who resigned at the end of last year. Miss Hayes is doing a very good piece of work for a beginner.

The Ireland schoolhouse was given a much-needed coat of paint, both inside and out, during the summer vacation. The blackboards and desks at the Blue school were refinished and a new floor was laid in the boys' entry.

By closing the Center school enough money has been saved so that it is necessary for your School Board to ask for an appropriation of only \$2,900 for your schools for next year.
