### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lincoln in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lincoln High School Auditorium in said Lincoln on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 10. How much money will be raised for Public Library.
- 11. How much money will be raised for Support of Town Poor.
- 12. How much money will be raised for Old Age Assistance.

- 13. How much money will be raised for Maintenance of Water Department.
- 14. How much money will be raised for White Mt. Regions Association.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,000.00 and Interest to take up Water Bonds due July 1, 1951.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$141.85 for T. R. A. work, the State to contribute the sum of \$567.39.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,500.00 to apply against the current deficit of \$1,-142.08
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to install a water line on the new street at the South End of Town.
- 20. To see what action the Town will take in regard to a donation toward the support of the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Non-Partisan balloting system as provided by Chapter 22, Section 121 of the Revised laws of the State of N. H. (Public Acts and Joint Resolutions of the Legislature of 1943).



# Scope of Audit

Included in the audit and examination were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Municipal Court.

# **Financial Statements**

# **Comparative Balance Sheets:**

December 31, 1949 - Dec. 31, 1950: (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1949 and December 31, 1950, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$6,995.29 during the year 1950.

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 21, 1950, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a revenue surplus of \$1,663.74, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$3,386.56, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$5,050.30.

# Summary of Receipts and Expenditures:

(Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1950, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance, as of December 31, 1950, is indicated in Exhibit F.

# Statement of Bonded Debt:

(Exhibit L)

A statement of outstanding bonded indebtedness,

as of December 31, 1950, showing annual maturities of principal and annual interest requirements, is contained in Exhibit L.

#### Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

#### **General Comments**

#### Reduction of Current Deficit:

Another substantial reduction was made in the current deficit during 1950, from \$6,137.37 to \$1,142.08. During the two year period December 31, 1948 to December 31, 1950, the current fiscal position of the town has improved as follows:

#### **Prior Years Poll Taxes:**

In our report of last year's audit it was recommended that the uncollected lists of prior years' poll taxes be carefully gone over by the Selectmen and Tax

Collector and that such taxes as appear to be uncollectible be abated. Some of these uncollected poll taxes are

on the warrants for levies prior to 1942.

It is again recommended that some action be taken in regard to this matter, particularly in view of the fact that no collections were made during 1950 on any of these warrants prior to 1946.

#### Conclusion:

The accounts and records of all town officials which we examined were found in good order and the accounting procedure conformed to the uniform system prescribed by this Division.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next an-

nual report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Lincoln for their assistance during the course of the audit.




