



## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriations for the same.

4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid to be expended on the Robie Road so-called, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,470.00 for the same, the State contributing \$4,940.00.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Class V roads.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to repair the town tractor and appropriate a sufficient sum for same, or in lieu of this to purchase a new tractor at a cost not to exceed \$3,000.00 and appropriate money for the same.

7. To see if the Town will vote to build an addition to tractor house and raise and appropriate money for the same.

8. To see if the Town will vote to rebuild the bridge over Harper Brook on Hannaford Hill Road and raise and appropriate money for same.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of old cemeteries.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of the New Hampton Village Cemetery.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$165.00 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

15. To see if the Town will allow the use of the land in front of Town House for the purpose of erecting a memorial to World War veterans.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.

18. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such an audit.

19. To transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

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February 5, 1946.

This report as Superintendent of Schools is based on my work for three months. The death of your former Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Fred S. Libbey, deprived New Hampton of the services of one of the outstanding educational leaders of the state. A life time of service devoted to public education ended with the death of my predecessor in the latter part of September.

It is evident, to even a casual observer, that the schools of New Hampton might be more economically operated if they were consolidated. A centralized school would mean an extension of the present transportation system and this in turn depends upon an improvement of certain roads. Without casting any reflections upon the work now being carried on in the schools of New Hampton, it is safe to say that a better educational program might be operated in a centralized school. Eight grades in one class room can tax the ingenuity of even the most competent teacher. Instead of operating with five buildings having grades one to eight, the schools would operate in three class rooms having enrollments of from twenty-five to thirty pupils with three grades in each of two rooms and the seventh and eighth grades combined in the third room. A school lunch program would provide a nourishing meal for every pupil. A well heated, properly ventilated building with adequate sanitary facilities would provide better conditions for the school children than does the present school environment. It might be to the advantage of the community to have a survey made of the schools during the coming year to fully investigate the feasibility of such a plan.

The schools of New Hampton are offering a program of studies comparable to that in operation in most of the

smaller towns in New Hampshire. This program is based upon the State program of studies distributed by the State Department of Education. For the most part textbooks, workbooks and school supplies are in adequate supply and are of relatively recent purchase.

New Hampton is fortunate in that it is able to keep its schools open during this period of teacher shortage. A number of schools in outlying areas have been forced to close because of the fact that teachers were not available.

It is a privilege and pleasure to serve as Superintendent in a community in which educational standards are kept in high regard by parents, teachers, and pupils. May the fine traditions surrounding the schools of New Hampton be always maintained.

## REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

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A summary of the health work done by the school nurse during the past year :

Physical examinations, including height, weight and vision tests have been made. Individual inspections were carried out whenever necessary.

Result of examinations :

Defective teeth—25

Defective vision—17 (12 have been corrected)

Enlarged tonsils—4 (2 have had tonsilectomies)

2 pupils were taken to Dr. Hernandez for refraction.

2 pupils had tonsilectomies at the Laconia Hospital.

The Red Cross furnished cod liver oil tablets for the four rural schools and assisted financially when it seemed necessary.

The new Telebinocular for measuring vision was used with very good results.

A Tuberculosis Skin Test Clinic sponsored by the New Hampshire Tuberculosis Association was held on May 17th. Of the 77 pupils tested, there were ten who had skin reactions. On June 15th these 10 pupils had chest X-ray pictures taken. They were all found to be negative.

It has been very difficult this year to make any appointments for school children due to wartime conditions.

I again wish to express my appreciation to all of those who assisted in carrying out the health work.
