

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said state qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Northwood on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To choose delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
- 4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 6. To see if the Town will accept State aid for construction of the Class II road known as School Street and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,060.50.

Or will accept State Aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$467.00.

- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town highways.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$990.00 for street lighting.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the care of cemeteries, as provided in Chapter 55, Section 4, Laws of 1925.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate in excess of that required by law for the Northwood Public Library.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to give 2% discount on property tax paid on or before July 15, 1937.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on temporary loans.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for graveling driveway at Town Hall.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$600.00 to construct the Sherburne Bridge.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, the road leading from William Warden's to Epsom line.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$500.00 from the Pacific Mills and release them of any future responsibility for repair on Bennetts Bridge (so called).
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to elect one Highway Agent, instead of three.
- 19. To see how the town will vote on the following question: Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?
- 20. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Citizens of Northwood:

The present value of our schools is due to the leadership of educational pioneers. The founding of Harvard College 300 years ago is thus described in "New England's First Fruits": "After God had carried us safe to New-England and wee had builded our houses. provided necessaries for our livli-hood, rear'd convenient places for Gods worship and settled the Civill Government. One of the next things we longed for, and looked after was to advance Learning and perpetuate it to posterity." One hundred years ago. Horace Mann, then president of the Massachusetts Senate, resigned to devote himself to the uplift of humanity through better schools. As first Secretary of that state's Board of Education, founder of the first Normal School in America, and later President of Antioch College, he fought for the principles expressed in these famous utterances:

"The Common School is the greatest discovery ever made by man."

"If ever there was a cause, if ever there can be a cause, worthy to be upheld by all of toil or sacrifice that the human heart can endure, it is the cause of education."

"Be ashamed to die until you have won some victory for humanity."

This year also is being celebrated as the centennial of William Holmes McGuffey, through whose readers walked Mr. Post and the Little Girl, Lazy Ned, Meddlesome Matty, The Lone Indian, and other characters, very good or very bad, to edify and instruct. In McGuffey's day, the "dunce," with his cap of shame,

a "sad, sad sight," whom "no one loves," was still branded as an example of depravity. Now such a pupil is a challenge, no more to be humiliated than a child who is lame. Difficulties in reading, with behavior problems often resulting, are now attacked in our schools from the standpoint of diagnosis and remedy. We do not accept either the position that any child who wants to can learn to read as well as any other child; on the other hand we do not agree with a recent statement that it is normal for many persons never to be able to read. This is a highly technical field, in which experts are still experimenting. During the past year in Northwood, we have made progress in remedial reading by special systematic instruction with materials taken from common life.

Our school nurse, Miss Margaret Macdonald, reports as follows:

Similar work was carried on at Coe's Academy. The vaccination record of Northwood is practically perfect.

In the death of Joseph B. Clark, late janitor of Brookside School, on November 22, 1936, the District lost a respected citizen and faithful employee, always assiduous in the duties entrusted to him.

Your superintendent attended the annual convention of the National Education Association at Portland, Oregon, June 29-July 2, representing Union No. 44, also the N. H. Parent-Teacher Association and the Rockingham County Teachers' Association. The route

from Northwood on was wholly through country that at some time was wilderness and frontier. New Englanders were among those who drove covered wagons over the Oregon Trail and opened the "New Northwest." Northwood teachers have found travel experiences a fruitful source of professional improvement.
