

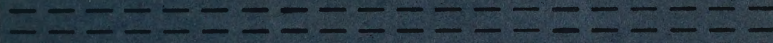

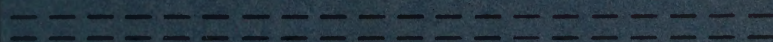

## TOWN WARRANT

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### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. s.]

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Nottingham in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Nottingham on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To hear the report of the Budget committee and act thereon.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
4. To see if the Town will appropriate \$1,500.00 to pay interest and reduce debt incurred for Trunk-Line construction.
5. To see if the Town will appropriate \$1,500.00 for State Aid construction, the State to contribute \$4,500.00.
6. To see if the Town will appropriate \$681.10 for Class V roads, the State to contribute \$2,724.40.

7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of Taxes to pay current town charges.

8. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$72.60 for the Library, for the purchase of books.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

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*To the Citizens of Nottingham:*

Within a year, Mrs. Annie B. Laughton retired from the School Board, Mrs. Mary E. Perkins resigned, and Mr. Harry D. Cilley left his membership vacant through death. These members all gave faithful service during their terms, and their assistance in the direction of school affairs will be missed. Mrs. Lisa B. Batchelder continues as chairman of the Board, with Mrs. Mildred R. Chesley as the second member.

The School District of Nottingham has for many years been carrying out the spirit and purpose of the new Municipal Budget Act adopted by the town. Early in February, the School Board draws up an "Estimate", including expected income and also expenditure for the support of schools and other statutory obligations of the District for the following school year, beginning July 1st. This estimate is now passed upon by the town budget committee and then becomes the basis of appropriations at the School District Meeting. Again in October, when the expenses and income for the current year are more accurately predictable, the Board draws up a detailed

“Budget”, which is submitted to the State Board of Education as the basis of State Aid the following year. This Budget can only be modified by permission of the State Board. Any balance not needed is listed under “income” in the Estimate of the following year and is re-appropriated, reducing by a corresponding amount the sum to be raised by taxation. As the Selectmen and the School Board are each entitled to one representative on the town Budget Committee (according to the terms of the Act), the School Board is this year represented by its chairman, Mrs. Batchelder.

Last year the per pupil cost of elementary schools in Nottingham was \$72.69, which was 5% less than the median of the state. Forty-four per cent of the cost of running the schools in town was paid for by state aid. Although Nottingham had 18 pupils in high schools and academies last year and paid the full tuition charged, the cost was but \$2.56 per \$1,000 of the equalized valuation of the district, the second lowest of the seven towns in Union No. 44.

It is interesting to compare the physical with the scholastic progress of the children in the schools. The former is recorded by the school nurse, who weighs and measures the children, notes any obvious physical defects, suggests ordinary health rules to remedy bad hygiene or refers the case to a clinic or doctor, securing the cooperation of the home for health improvement.

In like manner, the teachers in our schools make use of standardized tests to measure the capacity of the pupil to do school work. By means of these tests, the teacher can adapt the type, quantity, and difficulty of the school work to individual differences in the children. By means of other standardized tests, known as “Achievement Tests”, the individual level of attainment is found in each of several important school subjects, and an “educational age” is obtained, which may be compared with that of the average child throughout the nation. Scores on these tests may be represented graphically by a line ascending and descending as it crosses the record, so that one may see at a glance where the hills and valleys of

achievement are. When two of these tests are compared, the pupil's progress in the interval of time elapsed may be measured. It is then the effort of the teacher and pupil to devote special drill and effort to the weak subjects, finding out so far as is possible just what the particular difficulties are. As in the matter of health, so here also the home may cooperate by insisting on regular and prompt attendance, securing right conditions for home study when required, creating a right attitude toward the school, and encouraging the child to his best efforts.

By cooperating to support the dental clinic and by presenting educational programs, the Nottingham Parent-Teacher Association in an organized way has helped to further both of these lines of progress in the children.

The school buildings have been kept in good repair. Simple window ventilators have been provided to furnish fresh air without drafts. The district is faced with the necessity of providing more room to relieve the overcrowded condition at the north side of the town, either by enlarging the Gebig building or some other plan.
