TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1 To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal for the ensuing year.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Home Day.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred thirty-three dollars and ninety-nine cents (\$233.99) for T. R. A.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for general expenses of the highway department for the ensuing year.
8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Fire Department for the ensuing year.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to advertise the Town.
11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for street lights.

13. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of Municipal Accounting and raise the money to cover the expense of such audit.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

15. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of the land and buildings within the Town to equalize valuation in accordance with the law and to raise money for this purpose.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the upkeep of the library.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars (50.00) toward the support of the Elliot Community Hospital in Keene.

18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the necessary improvements of the Town Dump.

19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of title 11 of Federal Social Security Act (Old-Age and Survivors Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 234 of the Laws of 1951 and to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.

20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to improve and fence the plot of land purchased to enlarge the New Cemetary, also to authorize the Trustees and / or the Selectmen to have a plan of said plot made, and to sell lots therein.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any or all land acquired by tax collectors deeds.

22. To see if the Town will vote to set aside from the surplus any sum of money in a Capital Reserve Fund for any purpose.

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise any sum to repair the doors and floor in the tractor house.

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred (\$200.00) to improve the parking lot at Carrs Landing.

25. To transact any other business that legally come before said meeting.
