

Town Warrant

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stratford, County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said village of North Stratford, on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, 1954, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To elect a clerk for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 2. To elect two auditors for the ensuing year, or to see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the cost of such an audit.

ARTICLE 3. To elect a treasurer for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 4. To elect one selectman for three years, and all other town officers.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the town will vote to continue the services of the Public Health Nurse, and raise money for same.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$50.00 toward Blister Rust Control. This amount to be set aside for future use.

ARTICLE 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for highways, bridges and town maintenance.

ARTICLE 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following: Libraries; Memorial Day; Skating Rinks; Sewers; Street Lighting; Cemeteries; Retirement of Bonds; Long Term Notes; Interest; Insurance; Personal Bonds and any other money for the town.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the voters will authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$15,000 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name, and on the credit of the town, negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year, from taxes collected within the current municipal year.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to advertise for sealed bids on any property acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds, with the right to accept or reject all bids.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$87.88 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1000 of assessed valuation (1/100th of 1%) for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road, subject to gates and bars, from the Maxie Bordeau house to the end of the town road.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the town will vote to buy a suitable truck for fire purposes; also a 500 gallon tank and pump, and hose, and raise money for same.

ARTICLE 14. To hear reports of agents, officers and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relative thereto.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Stratford:

It is with pleasure that I submit my third annual report. To save duplication we publish the State Auditors' re-1953, plus detailed list of payments. Other narrative and statistical data including the proposed budget is for the current year unless otherwise noted. Resignations at the end of the year last June left us with two new teachers to find. Mr. Alfred White of Keene was engaged to take the place of Mr. Robitaille and Mr. Paul Mitchell of Ware, Mass. was engaged to take the place of Mr. Harwood. Both of these teachers are proving satisfactory and the school program has not suffered as much as last year when there were four out of five new teachers.

The arrangement to send all the members of the fifth grade to the Hollow School and allowing one room for the sixth grade at North Stratford has worked out most satisfactorily and will, no doubt, be continued in some combination of grades.

It will be noted that there is a present enrollment of 35 in the sixth grade. When these are promoted for next year there will be over fifty members in the seventh and eighth grades, and nearly sixty the following year. These two grades are commonly taught together using one teacher but the large enrollment forecast for next year makes it necessarv to have another teacher and a room in which to house the overflow. Looking toward this end the School Board have made plans to repair and repaint the shop room, so called, as a classroom. Rearranging the classes will make a room available for the seventh and the eighth grade. It will still be necessary, no doubt, to hold classes in the main room while it is being used as a study hall but the situation will be improved over what it has been for the past several years. The floor space in the shop is about 20% greater than the room that has been refinished at the Hollow schoolhouse.

The installation of a new furnace and the refinishing of an all purpose room at the Hollow have greatly improved the efficiency of this building. Health and safety factors have been improved and excellent hot lunch facilities have been provided. Special mention should be made of the lunch program which is being conducted by Mrs. Grace Brown. The lunches are ample and well cooked and meet all requirements of the State and National program. Both Mrs. Wheeler and Mrs. Fuller cooperate to make this building an excellent school unit.

Nothing in the foregoing paragraph is meant to detract from the North Stratford Lunch Program. Here, too, is a well conducted lunch serving approximately 175 meals daily. New piping installed throughout the building with a new lead from the water main outside the building has made for a plentiful supply of water. The installation of new valves and, in some cases, new toilets has corrected unpleasant odors and a poor health condition.

Early in the year the School Board made arrangements with Mr. Linwood Peck of Canaan to teach instrumental music. Mr. Peck was available only for evening engagament so practice sessions are held once each week. About twenty young people have instruments and are practicing faithfully. Much interest has been shown by the parents, and the P. T. A. is interested in the possibility of uniforms or capes for the band members.

The P. T. A. also has continued its active sponsorship of the dental clinic. A great many children have dental care through the clinic who otherwise might have to do without it.

The need of a new teacher seems imperative for the coming year. To this end the School Board has prepared a budget in identical amounts as last year, except to add the probable cost of this teacher. The Board has already been advised that the State School Fund will be in the amount of \$18,366.11, which is \$421.00 greater than last year's amount. With the tuition estimate at \$7,000.00 it will leave a balance to be raised by taxation of approximately \$34,200.00 or about \$1,600.00 less than was raised in 1952-1953.

In the past several years schools of the State and Nation have taken a bombardment of criticism. In individual schools some of this may be justified but in general much of it is not. During the past year in Stratford there has been a close and understanding supervision of and cooperation with the teachers to see that the school program is in line with the State approved course of study and the best interest of the children of Stratford. In standardized tests our children do as well on the average as they could be expected to do if they were attending school in an urban situation. The teachers, the superintendent, and the School Board members welcome an opportunity to listen to and meet any such criticisms as they apply to our schools. Moreover, a cordial welcome is extended to the parents to visit the school at any and all times.

It has been a pleasure and a privilege for me to take part in the school program of Stratford schools. Thank you for this opportunity to report.
