To the inhabitants of the town of Walpole qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 5th day of March next, 1974 at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, auditors, Town Treasurer, Collectors of Taxes, Trustee of Public Funds, Surveyors of Wood & Lumber, Fence Viewers, Delegates to The Constitutional Convention and all other necessary officers.

Polls to remain open until 6:00 P.M.

The business meeting will be called to order at eight o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To raise money for the support of the town poor, for the town library, for cemeteries, to build and repair highways and bridges, and for such other current expenses as may accrue.

Article 2. To see if the town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to raise money on notes of the town for current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes as has been the custom in previous years.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to accept such funds and bequests as have been left to it during the past year.

Article 5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of and deed any real estate ac-

quired by the town by the Tax Collectors deed, after being advertised.

Article 6. In the interest of crime prevention and the prevention of death on the streets and highways of the Town of Walpole by the unrestrained use of motor vehicles, we the undersigned submit this petition to the selectmen to include in the warrant a proposal to hire or appoint a full time Police Chief and to raise the necessary money to pay his/her salary and expenses. By petition

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$5200.00 for a new pickup truck and sander, taken from Revenue Sharing Fund.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$2859.00 from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund to make capital improvements in the Bridge Memorial Library. By petition

Article 9. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to contract for and accept aid relative to disasters, Federal funds.

Article 10. To see what action the town will take in regard to the Hooper will.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$25,000.00 from Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and raise and appropriate \$25,000.00 by taxation for the purpose of starting a Sanitary Landfill Disposal.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$7500.00 for the recreation program at the Hooper School.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to designate Derry Hill Road from Christian Hollow around the loop back to the County Road and to the March Hill Road as scenic under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18 for the purpose of protecting and enhancing the scenic beauty of Walpole and, further, that the selectmen of said Walpole shall, regarding such road or roads designated as scenic, file the appropriate request for suspension of specifications when making application to the

Commissioner of Public Works and Highways for Town Aid funds under RSA 241:7(I). By petition.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to designate Reservoir Road from the reservoir gate to the Walpole Valley Road as scenic under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18 for the purposes of protecting and enhancing the scenic beauty of Walpole and, further, that the selectmen of said Walpole shall, regarding such road or roads designated as scenic, file the appropriate request for suspension of specifications when making application to the Commissioner of Public Works & Highways for the town road aid funds under RSA 241:7(I). By petition.

Article 15. To see if the town will appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 to the Rockingham Senior Center for services and programs to the senior citizens of Walpole, N. H. By petition.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,016.88, as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to use Revenue Sharing money left, at their discretion for the general needs of the town.

Article 18. To transact any other legal business.

REPORT OF THE LIBRARY TRUSTEES

1973

The local library becomes more important to our town as the gasoline shortage keeps people closer to home and more dependent on our own resources for recreation, information, and continuing education. An aural dimension has been added to our library service through records, a tape recorder, and cassettes. The Friends of the Library donated French and Spanish language records with accompanying texts, as well as the tape recorder. Music, from country to classical, bird song studies, and children's stories are available. Books on crafts, hobbies, and instruction for do-it-yourself projects are frequently being added to our collection. Some large print books are provided for people with eyesight problems. Fast service is provided by telephone requests to the State Library or the Keene Public Library for books which we do not have. The library trustees are applying for revenue sharing funds this year to make some improvements which will make the library a more inviting place for all the people of our community.

Handrails were added to the library steps this year to provide safer access, and repairs were made to the roof and ridge-pole. A water damaged corner was repaired and painted. Various members of the library board attended district seminars on library finance, N. H. library laws, cooperation between public and school libraries within the district, as well as a State Library Open House in Concord, thus providing an exchange of ideas among small libraries.

The Friends of the Library group has added vitality to the library with its various programs for children and adults, including a monthly story hour for pre-school children, a weekly K-2 film program, and a 3-5 educational film program. This same resourceful group sponsored "The Little Red Wagon," a U.N.H. program of puppet shows and creative dramatics for

children. A candle decorating course was offered for adults. A new magazine rack was purchased by the Friends. In 1974 they plan a continuing crafts program for adults and hope to donate a permanent collection of craft books to the library. A weekly evening course in conversational Italian, with Charles Noon instructing, is being considered. They also hope to repeat last year's successful children's programs. Both Walpole and N. Walpole conducted a summer reading program for children, with so many participating that facilities for the end-of-the-season party were overtaxed.

Appreciation is due the librarians at both libraries for the extra hours they contribute. By continuing the library courses offered by the State Library, Virginia Putnam has upgraded her qualifications for handling the management of a small library, as has her assistant. Special thanks go to our custodian for his willingness to perform jobs beyond his responsibility.

Meeting on a regular monthly basis, this group has discussed many areas of concern. Being a new committee it has taken some time to become oriented and understand our responsibilities.

Conservation Commission responsibilities include such activities as researching local land areas and coordinating the activities of unofficial bodies organized for similar purposes; keep an index of all open areas in the town; receive gifts of money and/or property in the name of the town.

In order to provide better utilization of our natural resources we have undertaken a study of town-owned land including mapping and on-sight inspection.

Certain lots are being surveyed and with the aid of the Cheshire County Expansion Forester, trees suitable for harvest are being marked.

Discussion on many other conservation practices has taken place and suggestions made to the selectmen in some cases.

WALPOLE RECREATION DEPT. REPORT

1973

The Walpole Recreation Department experienced a good year in 1973. Several successful programs were continued from the previous year, and several new ones experienced a great deal of success. Programs continued from the previous year were as follows:

Chess Club — In the 1973 season over 20 area people participated in the Chess Club.

Summer Program — 41 town children signed up. The Program included hikes, games, arts and crafts, and field trips to the Walpole Historical Society and Santa's Land in Putney, Vt.

Swimming Lessons — Walpole Recreation Dept. again handled registration for the Red Cross Swimming Lessons. This year, 40 children registered.

Community Center — Located at the Hooper Building, it is open to the public and to clubs and organizations who wish to meet there.

The new programs instituted this year were as follows:

Girls Softball — 2 teams, 1 from Walpole and 1 from North Walpole were started. 34 girls signed up. Mrs. Joanne Houghton coached North Walpole and Mrs. Vaughnette Gage coached Walpole. Each team played 5 games, and an awards picnic was held at the Hooper Building at the end of the year.

Tennis Clinic — A tennis clinic was held at the Hooper Country Club. Mrs. Joanne Houghton and Miss Linda Jennison served as instructors. 23 boys and girls signed up and participated.

Touch Football — A touch football league for boys aged 10-14 was established in town. 36 boys played on 3 teams. The

coaches were Cas Menard, Dan Stamm and Dick Latham. An awards banquet was held at the end of the season.

Senior Citizens Organization — A Senior Citizens Organization has been established here in town. Several activities have been started, and more are in the planning stages. Activities in progress now include:

Water Color Class — Mrs. Anne Lamothe, instructor.

Rhythmic Gymnastics — Miss Lucille Mitchell, instructor.

Bowling — Once a week, a trip is made to area bowling lanes. Both Candlepin and 10-Pin are included.

Pot Luck Luncheons — Held once a month on Monday.

Birthday Parties — Held on the first Monday of each month to celebrate birthdays of members whose birthday falls that month.

Speaker Programs — Interesting speakers on various topics.

Trips — Walpole Senior Citizens have been invited by Keene Senior Citizens to accompany them on their tours.

These and other activities will be provided.

The year 1974 promises to be a year of further growth. I would like to thank all those people who volunteered their services to help make these programs a success.

SEWERAGE AND WATER POLLUTION STUDY COMMITTEE

The Board of Selectmen of the town of Walpole were authorized at the 1973 Annual Town Meeting to retain consulting engineers to prepare a comprehensive study of a sewerage system and water pollution control program for the town. Since the study was to include the North Walpole area, it was necessary to obtain concurrence of the North Walpole Village District for the above action. This was obtained at the 1973 Annual meeting of the North Walpole District.

S.E.A. Consultants Inc. of Boston, Mass. were retained in 1969 to prepare a preliminary study on sewerage and sewage treatment for the Walpole Village District. They were selected by the Board of Selectmen, with the approval of the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission, to continue as consultants to conduct the proposed study authorized by the above mentioned articles. A contract for engineering services to conduct the study was entered into on September 10, 1973 by and between the town of Walpole, New Hampshire, the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission; and S.E.A. Consultants Inc. Under the terms of the contract, the engineer agreed to submit the completed study and report to the Commission within 270 days, or about June 10, 1974, and to deliver the report to the town within 30 days following the Commission's approval.

Work performed to date by the engineer has included the determination of drainage areas and population within these areas, the preparation of plans showing the existing sewerage

systems and outfalls and the gathering of data concerning flow and flood frequency of the receiving waters — the Connecticut River. Certain field phases of the study, particularly those concerning infiltration/inflow, can best be accomplished in the Spring during periods of high runoff and high groundwater conditions.

Upon completion of the study and report, the town of Walpole will have met the requirements of the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission and will have a course of action to follow concerning the abatement of pollution contributed by the town to the Connecticut River at Walpole.

WALPOLE POOL AND PARK COMMITTEE

TO THE CITIZENS OF WALPOLE:

We would like to submit our report covering the activities of the committee since its formation, March 30, 1972. We have held over 24 regular meetings as well as making several trips to other communities, not only to view recreation facilities, but to consult with the people responsible for the operation and planning of those facilities.

We have consulted with people involved in recreational planning on the Federal, State and local level and as a committee, have developed plans for what we feel is a workable and reasonable type of recreational area designed for the benefit of the residents of the town.

The committee was authorized by the vote of the town on the 7th day of March, 1972, to be charged with the responsibility of developing a swimming and recreation facility on the so called Hooper Estate. Thus, we have directed our efforts mainly toward carrying out this directive of the voters. However, it wasn't until September 26, 1973 that the committee was advised by the town council and our selectmen that a petition to the courts, requesting approval for construction of this type of facility be delayed. Additionally, council recommended that the selectmen explore the possibility of some type of educational programs that could be conducted at the site, so as to bring the town back into the good graces of the Hooper trust. Town council felt that the town has not operated within the terms of the trust since the formation of the Fall Mtn. Regional School District and we must show clear title to the Hooper Estate before any Federal funding is available.

We therefore, as a committee, have attempted to stay active and direct our energy to promoting interest in fund raising projects. A very successful carnival was held in September with

all proceeds going into the fund. It was most gratifying to see not only most of the town organizations, but individuals as well, working toward a common goal.
