



#### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Windsor in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Windsor on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, 1987, the Town Meeting to open at 6:30 p.m. Polls open to 8:30 p.m. to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following ordinance:

Question #1. Are you in favor of the adoption of the "Land Use Ordinance of 1986" as proposed by the Planning Board?

This ordinance is to become effective upon passage and filing with the Windsor Town Clerk.

(To be voted on by Official Ballot)

- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations of the same.
- 4. To hear reports of Auditors and Agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,500.00 for highways and bridges.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept and use Highway Block Grants and other monies that may be forthcoming to the Town for Highway purposes.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,500.00 for Police and Fire expenses.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$750.00 for repairs and upkeep of the Town House.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$110.00 for Street Lighting.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for the upkeep of the Town Cemeteries.

- 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$250.00 to donate to the Hillsboro Rescue Squad.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,500.00 to be paid to the Town of Hillsboro for the use of the public sanitary receiving station in Hillsboro, N.H.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for the annual membership fee in the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and Planning Board expenses.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for legal expenses.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 to support the Fuller Library in Hillsboro, N. H.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund established in 1985.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 for revaluating the Town.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 to initiate a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of constructing a new Town Hall.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Between July 1985 and June 1986, we experienced fewer fires than normal. The two leading causes of forest fires were again children and fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden. Both causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden.

If you own forest land, you became responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.
