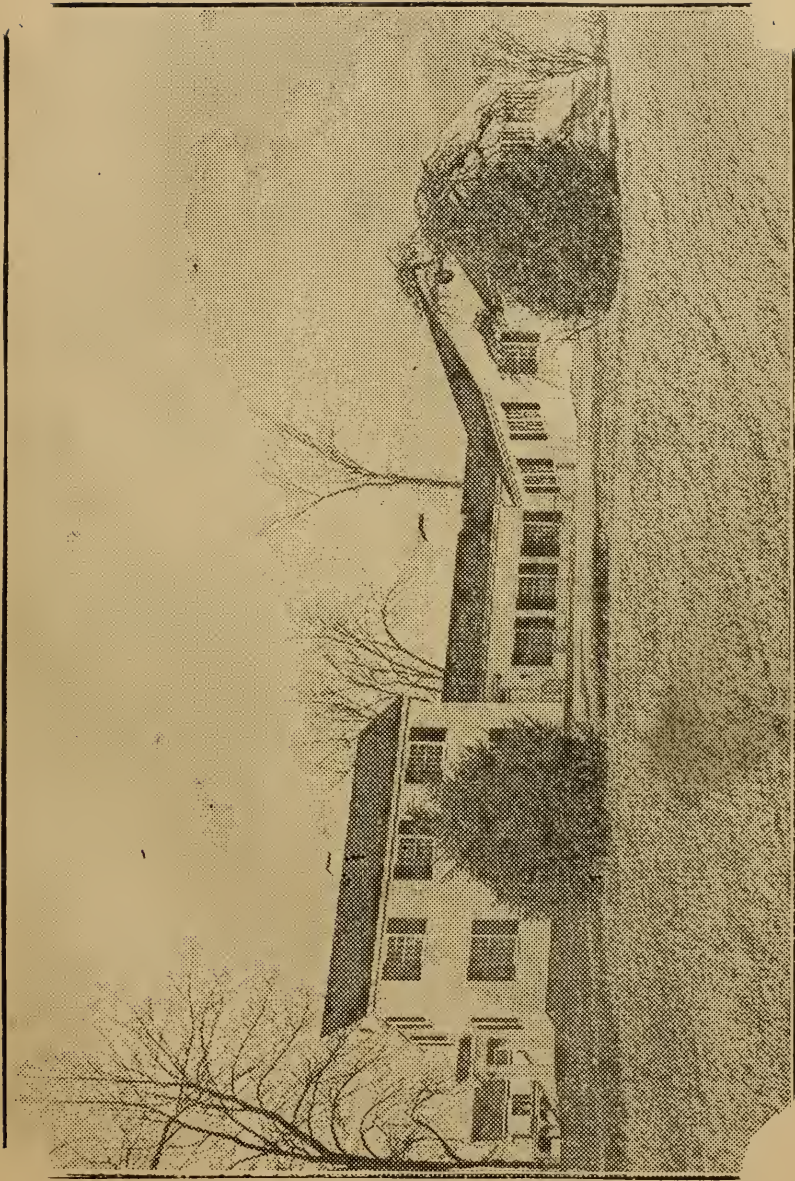

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR OPERATING A BOX

Opening a box does not give alarm; pull down handle. Anyone sounding alarm to remain at box to direct firemen. Second alarm to be sounded by order of the chief engineer only. Test alarm every day at 12.45 p. m. Do not sound alarm unless necessary.

## ALTON TOWN WARRANT

---

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Alton, in the county of Belknap, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Alton, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay all necessary charges of the town for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the year ensuing, in addition to that required by law.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow necessary moneys in anticipation of taxes.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on all property taxes paid before October first on the 1937 assessment.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the decoration of soldiers' graves.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the public library in addition to that required by law.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the lakes region. (By request.)

Article 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of grading

and to apply tarvia to one mile of the Alton Mountain road, beginning at the state highway. (By petition.)

- Article 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the aid of the Huggins hospital at Wolfeboro. (By request.)
- Article 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the aid of the Laconia hospital. (By request.)
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be expended under state supervision for the control of the white pine blister rust. (By request.)
- Article 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the control of the satin, browntail and gypsy moths.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the year 1937 and a like sum for the year 1938, provided the state appropriates the sum of \$4,000.00 for each of the two years for the completion of the Gilmanston road, any unexpended balance to be expended on the Wolfeboro road, so called, leading past the house of Percy H. Walker, provided that House Joint Resolution No. 41 now pending in the State Legislature becomes a law.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$681.69 to be expended under state supervision on Class V roads.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote the following resolution: Resolved that the wage to be paid laborers for work on the roads and highways be not less than forty cents per hour. (By petition.)
- Article 16. To see if the town will reconsider, rescind, and repeal the following votes taken at a special town meeting of the town of Alton held on July 9, 1936:



A. "To appropriate money for the purchase of that portion of the abandoned railroad property owned by the Boston & Maine Railroad located between the bridge in Alton and the Gilford line."

B. "That the town vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow \$17,500.00 on the credit of the town for the purposes for which money may be appropriated at this meeting."

C. "That the selectmen be instructed to appoint a board of directors, who shall serve without pay, consisting of twenty-five persons which shall include the selectmen and members of the Budget Committee, and to instruct the board of directors to select their own manager."

Article 17. To see if the town will vote the following resolution: Resolved that all action and votes taken at said town meeting held on July 9, 1936, are hereby rescinded and repealed.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to rescind the vote taken at the annual town meeting on the twelfth day of March, 1935, adopting the Municipal Budget Act.

Article 19. To see what action the town will take in regard to swimming at Alton Bay.

Article 20. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 21. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year, to elect one selectman, one library trustee, one trustee of trust funds, one water commissioner for the ensuing three years, and is it expedient to revise the Constitution?

We have received during the year the following trust funds which have been paid over to the trustees of trust funds:

From the estate of S. E. P. Gilman, \$150.00 for perpetual care of cemetery lots.

From the estate of Louis E. Avery \$1,266.00, the income to be expended for the construction and repair of sidewalks.

From the estate of Edward F. Cate \$5,000.00, the income to be expended for the repair of highways.

At a special town meeting held on August 5, 1935, the town voted to authorize the selectmen to borrow the amount necessary for the completion of the road leading from West Alton to the Gilford town line, said sum not to exceed two thousand dollars. We were obliged to spend \$2,145.82. We have been able to do this out of this year's money without borrowing.

The erection of the Gilman Home for the Aged made it necessary for the Water Department to extend its pipe line, which made it necessary to borrow twenty-five hundred dollars.

We have done these things according to our best judgment and have been able to reduce the town debt \$2,511.42.
