# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookfield in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at one of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of 1981 taxes.
3. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid on Class V Highways and appropriate the sum of \$353.34 as the Town's share.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,944.87 for the Sanbornville Fire Precinct and \$1,000.00 for forest fires.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,930.00 for the use of the Sanbornville Dump.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the Gafney Library.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for Huggins Hospital.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$550.00 for the Public Health Visiting Nurse Service.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$205.42 for the Carroll County Mental Health Service.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to update the Tax Map for the year 1981.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$52.50 for the Lakes Region Association.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to the Capital Reserve Fund for Town Road Equipment.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to the Capital Reserve Fund for future replacement of a Police Cruiser.
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to help finance the Wolfeboro Area Meals on Wheels, Inc.
15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the installation of dry fire hydrants.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,600.00 for the purpose of oiling roads.

**17.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,750.00 to repair the Mountain Road Bridge, \$2,750.00 to be raised by taxes and \$11,000.00 to be used from the Revenue Sharing Fund.

**18.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 and transfer \$11,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund as the Town's share in replacing the Mountain Road Bridge, the work to be done by the State at a total cost of \$80,000.00

*This Article to be considered if Article 17 is defeated.*

**19.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 to pay for the completed EDA audit.

**20.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for the increased costs of Property Reappraisal.

**21.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for two (2) additional voting booths.

**22** To see if the Town will vote to petition the Representatives and Senators who represent the Town in the General Court to support in the current session of the General Court, the concurrent resolution to amend the State Constitution to limit the annual increase in property taxes to five percent and to limit the annual increase in spending by the state or any city, town, or other governmental unit of the state to five percent.

## REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD – 1980

In December, the Board adopted a Master Plan for the Town, as required by law. With the help of an Advisory Committee of many townspeople, the work began in January with the mailing of a questionnaire to all land owners, seeking their opinions on many matters relating to the Town and what they desired for its future.

## REPORT OF THE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT – 1980

The first meeting of the Board of Adjustment was held in April. Mr. Alan McKinlay was appointed by the Selectmen to fill the vacancy caused by the expired term of Mr. Ralph Shortridge.

The Board met several times during the year as circumstances warranted.

In May, a request for a variance was received from John E. Page for property at the corner of Garney Road and Pike Brook Road. The request was for a variance of the terms of Article V, Section C, of the Zoning Ordinance to permit excavation, filling, and the location of a dwelling within 100 feet of a seasonal run-off.

Mr. John Knight, the surveyor representing Mr. Page, met with the Board of Adjustment, showing a map of the dwelling site and the septic system. The Board met again with Mr. Knight and visited the site, the location for the proposed dwelling, and the septic system, and measured all distances between the dwelling site, septic systems, and water run-off.

On Other occasions the members of the Board viewed the property following heavy rains and witnessed no surface water accumulation. On another occasion, Mr. Bradford Foster of the State Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission visited the property with the Board of Adjustment, on August 11, 1980. In his written report Mr. Foster concluded that "the area is suitable for sewage disposal".

On September 13, 1980, at a \$100.00 a day fee, the Selectmen had Mr. Barry H. Keith, Natural Resource Consultant, view the proposed building lot. At the invitation of the Selectmen, the Board of Adjustment members were present. Copies of Mr. Keith's report, dated September 19, 1980, are on file with the Selectmen and the Board of Adjustment.

Based upon the reports of Mr. Bradford Foster, Sanitarian for the Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission, and Mr. Barry H. Keith, Natural Resource Consultant, and the diligent and conscientious study of the Board of Adjustment, a variance was finally granted to Mr. John E. Page on October 15, 1980.

## REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST FIRE SERVICE

*Forest Fire Prevention: Your Business, Our Business, Good Business.* Forest fire prevention slogans have been seen in association with Smokey Bear since the late nineteen forties when a national effort to check the spread of forest fires was implemented.

New Hampshire residents recognized that forest fire prevention and suppression was the responsibility of every citizen, a half century before this national campaign, when our legislature established our first forest fire laws in 1903. Since that date, the State has appointed a town/city forest fire warden who is responsible for forest fire law enforcement in his municipality.

All fires kindled out of doors when there is no snow on the ground must be approved in writing by the forest fire warden before being kindled. All forest fires must be suppressed by the warden and his deputies as soon as they are reported. The cost of fire suppression is shared jointly by the town/city and the State of New Hampshire, as are forest fire prevention and forest fire training costs.

This state and local municipality cooperative forest fire program has given New Hampshire one of the best forest fire records in the United States.
