TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Canaan in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Canaan on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of tax revenues.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey by quitclaim deed all property acquired by tax deed, or to take any other action thereto.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to continue the present policy of joint cooperation with the State of New Hampshire in the construction of bridges and to hire the necessary funds to provide the Town's share in any construction authorized and undertaken in the year ensuing.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for town bridge construction or to take any other action thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to receive partial payments from any person, firm or corporation owning taxable property and before tax bills of the amount of taxes assessed against said property for the year has been received. Such sums shall be divisable by ten but not less than ten dollars, and the Tax Collector shall receive such payments and give a receipt therefor and credit the amount toward the amount of taxes eventually assessed against said property.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts of Federal or State Aid, in the name of the Town of Canaan.

9. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$700.00 for the Lebanon Regional Airport, as requested by them, or take any other action.

10. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new road grader, and for the purpose of defraying the cost of said grader to authorize the Selectmen to trade in the present grader, and further to authorize the Selectmen to use the sum of \$5,500.00

presently in the Capital Reserve Fund, and for the purpose of defraying the balance of the cost of said grader to authorize the issuance of not exceeding \$20,000.00 in Serial Notes or Bonds under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 33 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955 and any amendments thereto), and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such Notes or Bonds and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the negotiation, issuance, sale and delivery of such Notes or Bonds as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Canaan, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to restrict the signs within the Historic District as follows:

No signs shall be flashing or animated;

No signs shall be larger than four (4) feet square;

All signs shall be constructed of durable material and shall be maintained in good condition and repair;

No more than one (1) sign advertising or promoting a single business or activity, but not including one (1) "for sale" sign, shall be permitted upon any lot of land in single ownership.

12. To see if the Town will vote to amend the boundaries of the Historic District as established by the 1966 Town Meeting, by changing the west boundary to be a line 1000 feet westerly of and parallel with the westerly line of Canaan Street, so that the boundaries of said Historic District, as amended shall be:

on the north, the northerly line of land of the North Church, so-called, and the northerly line of the Canaan Street Cemetery;

on the east, the westerly shore of Canaan Street Lake, so-called;

on the south, the easterly lines of the Old Stage Coach Inn, now the Butler-Moore property, and the easterly line of the Stacey Beebe property;

on the west, by a line 1000 feet westerly of and parallel with the westerly line of Canaan Street.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to install a flood light at the Town beach and parking area at Canaan Street Lake or take any other action thereto.

14. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or any other officers heretofor chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1969 fire season was a quiet one in this area. Frequent rains kept the danger to a minimum and there were few violations. Your Forest Fire Wardern's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Penalties

- 1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
- For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
- 3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
- 4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland maximum fine of \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.
