

#### WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Canterbury in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Canterbury on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to give a discount of 2% on all taxes paid within 30 days after date of tax bills.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400 for Blister Rust control.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of the municipal budget act.
  - 7. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to accept the land known as the Gale Black-Smith lot.

- 10. To see if the town will vote to elect a clerk for the Selectmen by yea and ney vote and determine his salary and term of office.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to adjust the Selectmen's salary.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to allow the Selectmen to appoint an overseer of the poor. The town to fix salary of same.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
- 14. Through a resolution adopted by the General Court, the voters of the town are requested to vote upon the following question, "Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?"

She was succeeded in September by Miss Constance Dunlap of Concord, a graduate of the three year Elementary Course at Keene. Mr. Ervin A. Cogswell, who for many years had been a teacher in Canterbury schools, and for the last few years at the Upland school, also completed his services in June. This vacancy was filled by the appointment of Miss Helen Szalajeska of Laconia. Miss Szalajeska is also a graduate of the three year Elementary Course at Keene.

Six from this group entered high school in September, five going to Penacook, and one to Concord.

#### IMPROVEMENTS

In my report a year ago I recommended certain alterations and much needed improvements in the Carter school building. It is a pleasure to report at this time the changes that were made during the summer vacation. The schoolroom was enlarged by the removal of the entrance and lighting conditions much improved by the installation of additional windows. All windows were equipped with new shades of the type best adapted to school-room use.

An addition was made to the main building large enough for a good entrance, ample room for toilets, and a commodious wood shed. Kaustine Sceptic Toilets were installed. This type of toilet is a decided improvement over the chemical, and the cost of maintenance is less.

The whole job was well done and Canterbury has reason to be proud of this improvement. The total outlay was approximately \$850.00. This school-room needs a jacketed stove to give a more even distribution of heat. All our other school-rooms have the same need. I am recommending that at least one of the buildings be properly equipped in this particular before another winter.

#### FINANCES

The financial report of the School Board covers the full fiscal year which ended June 30, 1936.

The revenue for this current fiscal year, the year which began July 1, 1936, will amount to approximately \$9,500.00, which includes \$1,967.23 received as State Aid. The total expenditure this current year will be approximately \$8,500.00. In this amount is included the outlay for the alterations at the Carter School. The School Board anticipates a balance of \$1,000.00 in the treasury at the close of the school year in June. The following table shows the budget as voted at the annual meeting last March for this current school year, and the suggested budget for the next school year:
