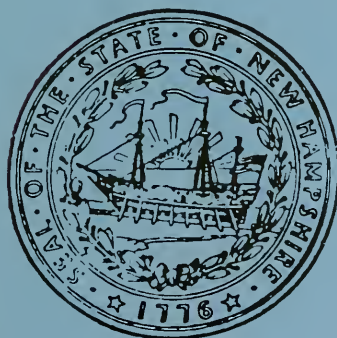

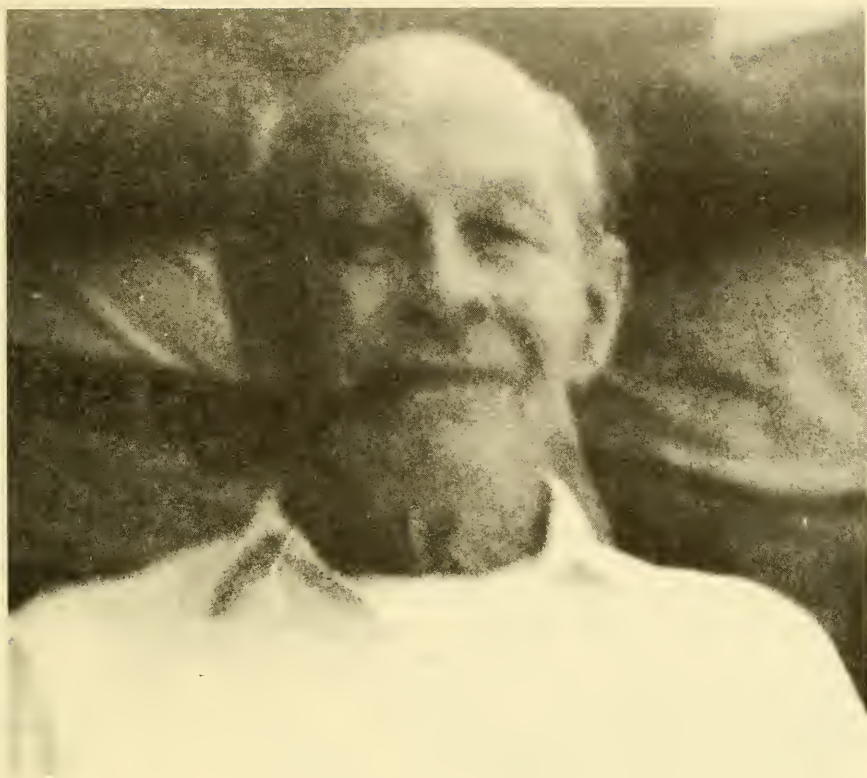

## THE SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The year of 1986 has shown many property changes in Danbury. Five sub-divisions with new buildings are being constructed and many other pieces of property have changed hands. These changes have not only increased the Town population, but has had a large effect on our school population. Naturally, all this, increases the work load for all Town Officers and this accounts for some of the articles in the Town Warrant.

There are many residents who feel that all elections and meetings should be held in the Town Hall and not in the Multi Purpose Room of the Danbury Elementary School. The change had to be made because the State requires that we have proper access and facilities for the Handicap. It is required that we have a ramp leading into the building from a paved area and we also need to have Rest Room facilities specially equipped. We sincerely hope this answers all questions as to why the change had to be made. We are very fortunate to have a Multi Purpose room to use, if this was not available, we would be in a very bad position.

At the last Town Meeting, we put before you a proposal to make renovations at the Town Hall, which was not accepted. In this proposal, there were included some of the conditions required by the State. This would also have given the Town Officers proper working facilities which are essential and badly needed. In the very near future, the Town is going to be looking at either Town Hall renovations or another building with adequate facilities for all Town Officers to meet State requirements.

In reading over our Comparative Statement, you will see that the unexpended balances outweigh the overdrafts, giving us a fair size surplus. This was accomplished through the fine cooperation of all Town Officers and the careful watching of their budgets.

We would like to express our appreciation and thanks to Andrew Phelps. Andy has worked as Cemetery Sexton and takes no compensation, he also gives freely of his time on other tasks, such as, the water problem at the Town Hall. Many many thanks Andy.

Trudy Curren is leaving the office of Tax Collector to enter into other fields of endeavor. Thank you Trudy for a fine job and Good Luck!

James Fifield, our Road Agent with his crew, have done a great job in keeping our roads open in this year of heavy storms. Many have told of the conditions they have encountered on roads of other Towns in comparison to ours being so wide and well cleared. A fine job Jim and greatly appreciated.

The Selectmen's road is not always very smooth. We have encountered extra problems due to the loss of our Health Officer. A difficult position to fill, and also, the new rigid regulations for Welfare. The welfare position has been kept within the Selectmen's Office as finances are greatly involved. However, regardless of the added burdens, we feel this has been a very good year and are greatly helped by our competent Secretary Marie Meola.

Motion made by Andrew Phelps to have Step #1 read Minimum Wage \$3.35 raising level on schedule. Seconded by Jon Schurger. Alan Brownell motion to add that the Selectmen can determine starting wage. Motion carries, voted to pass. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Motioned by Forrest Powers, seconded by Phyllis Taylor. Jon Schurger submits an amendment to reduce Town Officers' salaries reduced by \$175.00. Police total budget to be \$150.00 for school blinker lights. Moderator to receive no fee. Seconded by Andrew Phelps. Moved to vote by Janet Stitt, seconded by Phyllis Taylor. *Amendment voted on and Fails to Pass.*

Bob O'Neill submits an amendment to reduce Police Officer's salary from \$5,600.00 to \$5,000.00. Bob O'Neill motions to vote, seconded by Alan Brownell. *Voted on and Passed.*

*1986 Budget of \$109,928.00 voted on and Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$102,000.00 for the Maintenance of Highways. Motion by Jon Schurger, seconded Gordon Cavis. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of \$3,608.33 for principal and \$324.75 for interest for the payment of the long-term loader note. Motion by Phyllis Taylor, Seconded by Gordon Cavis. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for principal and \$911.97 for interest for the payment of the long-term note on town truck. Motion by Phyllis Taylor, Seconded by John Ford. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for the sealing of roads. For oil MC800 only. Motion by Gordon Cavis, Seconded by Bob O'Neill. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of \$5,000.00 for the repair of bridges. Motion by Phyllis Taylor, Seconded by Alan Brownell. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 to help defray the expenses of the Jiminy Cricket Kindergarten. Motion by Brian MacKay, Seconded by Brenda Haynes. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 for the purpose of remodeling the Town Hall into office space, and equipping them, and in an artesian well. The



above sum of money to be raised by issuing a long-term note for a period of 4 years. This note to be paid in 4 equal installments each, plus interest. Motion by Alan Brownell, seconded by Judy MacKay. Voted on: 42 No votes, 41 Yes votes. *Article Fails to Pass.*

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the Danbury Volunteer Fire Department to assist in defraying expenses incurred. Motion by Bob O'Neill, seconded by Edna Powers. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 154:30 commonly known as the Mutual Aid Law and raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,131.27 for the purpose of becoming a member of the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Association, giving the Board of Selectmen the authority to enter an agreement with the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Association for a term of five years beginning on April 1, 1986 which would provide a full-time communications service to the Fire Department. (Explanatory Note: For the first year of the contract; the amount the Town would raise to pay its share of the cost of the communications service would be used to buy radios and other equipment for the fire department so that it can fully use the service offered. During this time the communications service would be provided free of charge to the Town. Annual assessments to cover the cost of the service are based on the total equalized valuation of all members of the Mutual Aid System). Motion by Phyllis Taylor, seconded by John Ford. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate an amount of \$3,000.00 for the Capital Reserve Fund for Highway Equipment. Motion by Brian MacKay, seconded by Phyllis Taylor. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 for two new plows and wings. Motor by Twila Cook, seconded by Ed Colby. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for the use of setoffs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated below: and further to authorize the Selectmen to make prorata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or take any other action hereon. Appropriation—Town Dump Amount \$8,793.00. Motion by Brian MacKay, seconded by John Ford. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to designate the New Canada Road, in Danbury, N.H. as a Scenic Road. Per RSA-231:157

(by Petition). Andrew Phelps moves to amend Article 15 to read "To discuss the possibility of acclaiming New Canada Road a Scenic Road. Seconded by Gordon Cavis. *Amendment Passed.* Article 15, To be discussed at next Town Meeting.

ARTICLE 15A. To see if the Town will vote to return the One-way Street so called, to a Two-way Road. (by Petition). Motion by Kathy Colby, seconded by John Ford. *Article Fails to Pass.*

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts and/or Federal or State aid in the name of the Town of Danbury. Motion by Brian MacKay, seconded by Judy MacKay. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of (\$30,000.00) Thirty Thousand Dollars to have the State reassess all properties in Town, and request that the work is to be done with more than one man. (by Petition). Motion by Twila Cook, seconded by Brenda Hayes. *Article fails to Pass.*

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will buy for \$13,000.00 the 3.35 acres more or less on Route 4, from Wilmer Brownell, if Brownell can demonstrate that he can convey Marketable Title. Motion by Phyllis Taylor, seconded by Twila Cook. *Article Fails to Pass.*

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any material or equipment deemed to be surplus to the Town needs; the sale of highway material or equipment to be made with the approval of the Road Agent. Motion by Brian MacKay, seconded by Andrew Phelps. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Motion by Dorothy McGonnigal, seconded by Jon Schurger. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell real estate taken by the Town for non-payment of taxes or by Collector's deeds. Motion by Brian MacKay, seconded by William Gealy. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to have the Appraisal Division of the Department of Revenue Administration conduct a complete revaluation starting in 1988 or thereafter. To establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of conducting such revaluation and to appoint the Selectmen as agents to administer the fund. Motion by Phyllis Taylor, seconded by Twila Cook. *Article Fails to Pass.*

ARTICLE 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$10,000.00 to be

placed in the Capital Reserve Fund for the revaluation of the Town by the Appraisal Division of the Department of Revenue Administration. Motion was made to pass over Article by Forrest Powers, seconded by Jon Schurger. *Article Passed Over.*

ARTICLE 25. To see if the Town will vote to have a "Budget Advisory Board" to meet with the Board of Selectmen and review the Budget and present to the Town their recommendation on the budget, and to have the Board elected starting in march 1987.

2 Members for 3 years; 2 Members for 2 years; 2 Members for 1 year. Motion by Andrew Phelps, seconded by Judy MacKay. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 26. To see if the Town will vote to purchase the Phelps Lane property behind the Riverdale Cemetery on North Road and Spa Road for \$30,000.00. The potential use is Town Shed location, Ball Field, Town Beach on Smith River, Picnic Area, Town Park, etc. Motion by Anthony Sciucco, seconded by Phyllis Taylor. Jon Schurger submitted amendment to buy lots One and Two from James Phelps for \$14,000.00. Seconded by Trudy Curren. Amendment voted on and Passed. Motion was made to vote on Main Article 26. *Article Failed to Pass.*

ARTICLE 27. We the undersigned, would like to have the Town of Danbury reserve the Bog Bridge Lot, which it now owns as a wayside picnic area and park. We are willing to serve on a committee to work for this Motion by Twila Cook, seconded by June Phelps. *Article Passed.*

ARTICLE 28. To Transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Jon Schurger moves to adjourn meeting. Seconded by Donald Haynes. Meeting adjourned at 7:00 p.m.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of \$5,000. for the repair of bridges.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an amount of \$10,000. for the purchase of a computer system for the Town Records and Taxes. This appropriation to come from the Fund Balance.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an amount of \$4,500. for an artesian well system for the Town Hall. This appropriation to come from the Fund Balance.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of \$3,010. for one radio for the Police Cruiser and one portable unit. This appropriation to come from Fund Balance.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an amount not to exceed \$50,000. for the purchase of a new Highway Truck with Body and Sander. The above sum of money to be raised as follows: \$6,000. from Capital Reserve Fund; \$5,305. from Block Grant; \$1,040. that was leftover from the purchase of Plows and wings; \$7,655. to be raised by Taxation; \$30,000. to be raised by issuing a long-term note for 4 years. This note to be paid in four equal installments of \$7,500. each plus interest.
8. Shall the Town of Danbury accept the recommendation of the Pemi-Baker Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Committee and appropriate \$1,224. This will enable the Committee to gather the necessary engineering, legal, and financial information in order to determine the detailed costs for a District solid waste disposal solution including but not limited to the District acquisition of and improvements to the Plymouth Incinerator/ Recycling Facility.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$342. to pay Deborah Phelps for her hours for training at the Police Academy last summer. This is in compliance with the U.S. Supreme Court decision in the Garcia Case.
10. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAM: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Planning Board to prepare and amend a recommended program of Municipal Capital improvements projects pursuant to RSA 674:5.
11. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following ordinance:

**ORDINANCE VIOLATION PENALTIES.** Any person who fails to comply with any ordinance adopted by the Town of Danbury shall be subject to a \$25.00 Penalty. Each day of non-compliance shall be a separate violation. The Selectmen shall notify any persons in violation by certified mail and may assess penalties from that date. Any penalties collected shall be committed to the Town's Treasurer.

12. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following ordinance:  
**SIGNS ORDINANCE:**
  - A. No sign or advertising device shall be erected or placed on any property in the Town of Danbury or be visible from outside of any structure in the Town of Danbury or be affixed to a vehicle and allowed to remain on the premises with intent to serve as a sign without a permit. The applications for permits shall be submitted to the Selectmen. An application for a sign permit shall include the site location, the sign's size and content.
  - B. Exemptions:
    - (1) Signs indicating the existence of private property, forbidding trespass or other activities on the property.
    - (2) Signs located on private property and intended to regulate or guide activities with the property even though such signs may be incidentally visible from outside the property.
    - (3) Temporary signs in use for a period of not more than 30 days during a 12 month period. These signs shall be non-illuminated signs such as for community events, political campaigns, special sales promotions, auctions, and the like.
    - (4) Temporary real estate signs advertising sale of the property on which the sign is located not exceeding 3 feet by 4 feet in size.
    - (5) Non-illuminated home business signs which shall not exceed 2 per property and shall not have a surface area in excess of 8 square feet per sign.
  - C. All signs within the Town of Danbury shall comply with the following standards:
    - (1) Flashing Signs: No signs shall be intermitently illuminated nor be of such traveling light type, animated, or flashing except such portions of the sign as consists solely of indicators of time or temperature or both.

- (2) Shielding fixtures shall be arranged to direct the light away from street and away from adjoining structures.
- D. All signs shall be maintained in good condition and repair. Any business that closes its operation permanently shall remove any signs in connection with that business within 30 days. The Selectmen shall notify sign owners, in writing, to remove or repair any sign which is in violation of this ordinance or becomes in disrepair. If the owner fails to comply within 30 days after date of notice, the Selectmen shall have the sign removed at the expense of the owner.
- E. All costs of removal of signs, including attorney's fees, costs, and expenses related to the removal of an unlawful sign shall be borne by the violator.
- F. Each business at a commercial site is allowed 2 advertising signs on the property where the business is located, either 2 single faced signs, each face not exceeding 36 square feet, or 1 double faced sign with each face not exceeding 36 square feet. Additionally, each business may display a business identification sign externally. Such signs shall not exceed 16 square feet per side.
- G. All signs shall comply with minimum set-back requirements of permanent structure.
- H. No sign shall be erected or placed in the Town of Danbury which advertises a business not located in the Town of Danbury.
- I. Directional signs may be allowed by permit for location off the business premises as follows:
- (1) Such signs shall indicate only the name and direction or location of the business and its general type of activity (for example: building supplies, general store, etc.) and/or its logo.
- (2) Such off-premise directional signs shall contain no other advertising matter and shall not exceed 16 square feet in size per side per sign.
- J. The height of any free-standing sign shall not exceed 20 feet above surrounding road grade or 2 feet above the roof ridge of any building to which it is affixed.
- K. Any sign which is damaged or destroyed may be replaced and/or restored to its former condition within 180 days of the date of its damage or destruction.



If adopted, this ordinance shall take effect upon passage. It shall be administered and enforced by the Selectmen with penalties for non-compliance as provided by Town Ordinance.

13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following ordinance:

**BUILDING PERMIT ORDINANCE:** No person shall erect any building; locate any mobile home; locate any camper or travel trailer for a period of greater than 30 days; or construct any other dwelling for purposes of human habitation without first obtaining a permit from the Selectmen.

Applications for said permit shall include the following:

- (1) Public Utilities Commission Energy Code approval as required by RSA 155-D.
- (2) N.H. Water Supply & Pollution Control Commission approval for septic system construction.
- (3) A sketch of adequate detail to show the location of the proposed dwelling and its relation to roads and property lines.
- (4) State or local driveway permits.
- (5) Any other information that may be required to ensure that the dwelling shall comply with all state and local regulations.

The Selectmen shall issue or deny this permit in writing within 15 days of its receipt.

There shall be no fee for this permit.

This ordinance shall be administered and enforced by the Selectmen with penalties for non-compliance as provided in Town Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall take effect 30 days after its passage.

14. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following:  
**HEIGHT ORDINANCE:** No building or structure, or part thereof, shall exceed 35 feet in height as measured from the high point thereof to the average natural or graded permanent ground level at the wall of the structure nearest to the below said high point, provided, however, that this provision shall not apply to television and radio antennae, lightning rods, cupolas, steeples, chimneys, utility poles or parts of buildings designed exclusively for agricultural uses.

If adopted, this ordinance shall be administered and enforced by the Selectmen with penalties for non-compliance, as provided in Town Ordinance.

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage.

15. To see if the Town will vote to approve an addition to the schedule of wages, benefits for full-time and part-time Town employees.
16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Road Agent, commencing in 1988, according to N.H. R.S.A. 245:8.
17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Constable, commencing in 1988 according to N.H. R.S.A. 105-1.
18. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of Capital Improvement to the Town Hall.
19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000. to go into the Capital Reserve Fund for Capital Improvement to the Town Hall.
20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for the use of setoffs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated below: and further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or take any other action hereon.  
Appropriation—Town Dump Amount \$59.00
21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts and/or Federal or State aid in the name of the Town of Danbury.
22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any material or equipment deemed to be surplus to the Town needs.
23. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell real estate taken by the Town for non-payment of taxes or by Collector's deeds.
25. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Town's

representatives to the General Court to take all necessary measures to insure that no low level radioactive waste from the Seabrook nuclear plant shall be stored or disposed of within this Town of Danbury unless and until the proposed storage or disposal has been approved by the voters of the Town at the annual Town Meeting.

26. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT**  
**August 1986 to December 1986**

It is difficult to take over a job and budget in the final quarter of the year. I must ask the townspeople to judge the police activity for that final quarter of 1986 only as no records of mileage and calls for service were ever made available to me for the January to July 1986 period. The Animal Control activity is listed in a separate report.

In August I applied for the job of Danbury Police Chief due to civic pride. The position had been floundering since Chief Fredericks resignation shortly after the March '86 election. It has not been an easy four months but it has been busy and I feel it has been productive, by that I mean re-establishing the credibility of Danbury Police Department as a functioning unit. This could not have been accomplished without the cooperation of Troop D of State Police and the Merrimack County Sheriff Department and for their assistance I am grateful.

A high priority item on the Danbury Police agenda has been to bring the community and the police together. Public support is essential to effective police management. The way I look at it is the only long-term way to improve the police credibility is to provide effective, enthusiastic, fair and just service in as professional manner as possible. Without the community cooperation the successful accomplishments of the police purpose is almost an impossibility to attain. Major laws as well as minor regulations can be enforced only with the support of the public. A public that is aware and observes and complies with regulations relieves the police of some of their burden. Being on call twenty-four hours a day is a burden to the police and the community needs to recognize this burden.

This past year has seen the development of an effective Animal Control unit and I thank Debi Phelps our Animal Control Officer (ACO) for her untiring interest in developing professionally this department within the police department.

The proposed police budget for 1987 shows an increase, the reason for this is primarily to bring the pay scale up to par with other departments in the state and to purchase a replacement radio unit for the cruiser. The cruiser radio having been declared obsolete five years ago finally quit functioning altogether in December 1986. The department cannot operate without radio contact with other units. A working radio is a necessity for the safety of the officers and they will not work without one.

The purchase of a radio is a one-time expense. The third largest reason for the increase is due to the new Animal Control Unit. The

Humane Society has requested an increase in town appropriations due to their increased costs and our increased usage of the facility. ACO training school is desirable each year and mileage expenses are a necessary disbursement as the type of cruiser we have isn't suitable for animal transport.

We ask you to understand that the primary police purpose is to prevent violations, not to arrest people and the public should try to recognize the separation line between police and court functions. The police actions in the enforcement of laws and ordinances that offend some individuals creates a barrier between the police and the community, we ask that you try to remember we are doing our job even at the risk of being unpopular at times.

We are committed to professional police practices and will endeavor to offer service to Danbury as such.

## PEMI-BAKER SOLID WASTE DISTRICT

### WHAT IS THE PBSWD?

The Pemi-Baker Resource Recovery Ad Hoc Committee was formed in early 1983 to study regional solid waste disposal. Gershman, Brickner & Bratton were contracted to evaluate the feasibility of a waste-to-energy plant at the College. It was determined that an insufficient amount of trash was available to make this option a cost-effective solution.

In January 1984, the Ad Hoc Committee became an organized District sanctioned by RSA 149-M (taking the name Pemi-Baker Solid Waste District). During the subsequent years, members from each town met regularly to develop a regional solution to the disposal dilemma.

### OPTIONS INVESTIGAGED

In February 1986, required District Plan options were submitted to and accepted by the State which summarized the previous two years of work. Alternatives were investigated including straight incineration, transfer to other facilities, primary landfills, purchase and upgrade of the Plymouth Facility (see the Pemi-Baker Solid Waste District Report, February 1986).

### THE BEST ALTERNATIVE

After months of debate and intense discussion, the District has developed a proposal to buy out the Plymouth Facility in a cooperative fashion as allowed by RSA 53-B. Under this agreement, each town appoints representatives to serve on the District Board of Directors. The BOD are the governing body and make policy decisions concerning the project.

The Proposal includes the purchase and upgrade of the existing Plymouth Incinerator/Recycling Center. Since the Center is currently at capacity, the District has included in the Proposal's price the cost of a continuous feed 50 ton per day modular unit. The recently approved landfill will be used for on-site ash disposal for approximately five years (possibly more). By the end of its lifetime, a new secure lined landfill or transfer option will have to be available. Costs for this have been included in the Proposal.

### WHAT'S THE NEXT STEP?

In order to be sure that this Proposal is the best alternative, fine details must be investigated. Questions must be answered by the State, Engineering Firms, Legal Counselors and Financiers. Approximately

90 days of a coordinator's time, 100 days of an engineer's time and 3 days of both a lawyer and a financial consultant's time is estimated necessary for the complete analysis of this proposal. The total cost is \$34,000 and the Proposal should be complete within six months of the Town Meeting.

Financial participation shall be determined according to each town's solid waste contribution to the District total. Below is a percentage breakdown of the Pemi-Baker towns waste production:

## ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER

I have completed one full year as your Animal Control Officer. I went to the N.H. Animal Control and Humane Officers' Academy in July for four days or a total of twenty-five hours of training.

To be qualified as an ACO and to write violations and go to court, I took the part-time Police Officer's training at N.H. Police Standards and Training for seventy-five hours.

Some of the things I've accomplished is to cut down on the stray animal problem, and answered barking complaints. This also includes wild and domestic animals.

I have a mutual aid agreement with the other N.H.A.C.O.A. members and Fish and Game.

I have humane traps and chemical capture devices at my disposal for nuisance wildlife.

One-hundred and seventy-two dogs have been licensed this year. We know that not all the dogs in town are licensed; the N.H. State Law 466:14 reads: Proceedings: The Mayor of each city and the selectmen of each town shall annually, within 10 days from June 1, issue a warrant to one or more police officers or constables, directing them to proceed forthwith either to collect the fees due and pay them over to their respective town or city clerk, or any unlicensed dog may be seized and held in a town or city holding facility for a period of 7 days after which time full title to said dog shall pass to said facility, unless the owner of said dog has, before the expiration of said period, caused said dog to be licensed and shall pay facility the sum of \$5.00 per day for each said dog has been kept and maintained by said shelter, plus any necessary veterinary fees incurred by said facility for the benefit of said dog."

Effective June 10, 1987, this law shall be enforced.

N.H. State Law 466:30-IV: "In addition to impounding a dog found at large or in violation of this section any law enforcement officers may issue in the name of the owner or keeper of such dog notice of violation. Such notice shall impose upon the owner or keeper of such a dog a forfeiture of \$10.00 which must be paid to the clerk of the Town or City wherein such dog is owned or kept within 96 hours of the date and time notice is given, in full satisfaction of the assessed penalty. In the event such penalty is not paid to the town or city clerk within the time limitations specified, a summons shall be issued for appearance in district court or municipal court and any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a violation."

This law shall be strictly enforced.
