To the inhabitants of the Town of Deering, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs, greetings:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at seven of the clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

Polls will open at one P.M.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of the Town Officers for the previous year. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations of the same. – Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for Town Officers' salaries and \$1,500.00 for Town Officers' expenses. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for election and registration expenses. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other buildings. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,100.00 for Social Security payments for Town Employees. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for Police and \$1,000.00 for the Fire Department. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for Blister Rust control. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

priate the sum of \$1,800.00 for Insurance. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for Damages and Legal Expenses. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Civil Defense. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Vital Statistics. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the use of the Hillsboro Town Dump. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the sealing of roadways. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for Summer and \$9,000.00 for Winter Roads. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$425.00 for Street Lighting. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the general expenses of the Highway Department. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,206.93 to secure Town Road Aid. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35.00 for the Town Library. - Submitted by the Library Trustees.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the Town poor and \$1,200.00 for Old Age assistance. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the interest on short term loans and \$550.00 for the interest on long term loans. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to meet the annual payment on the West Deering Moat Bridge, and \$3,300.00 to meet the

annual payment on the grader. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for County Taxes. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the care of cemeteries. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deed. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. - Submitted by Selectmen.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$132.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to have the State Tax Commission reappraise all properties located within the Town of Deering, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the cost of said reappraisal, to be repaid over a period of three years. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to establish as an ordinance of the Town of Deering, New Hampshire, the following:

No Structure or building to be used as a dwelling shall be constructed without prior filing a notice thereof with the Selectmen, which notice shall include the general specifications and location for the proposed building or structure. Upon receipt of said filing, the Selectmen shall forthwith issue a permit for said construction, which permit shall be visibly displayed on the construction site. A permit fee of \$1.00 shall be paid at the time of filing the notice.

The permit shall issue for such period of time as the Selectmen shall determine. Any person who shall undertake to construct or have constructed, any structure or building to be used as a dwelling without first having obtained the permit as herein set forth, shall be fined not less than \$10.00 for each day of violation or neglect or refusal to comply with this ordinance. - Submitted by the Planning Board.

Article 31. To see whether the Town will vote to authorize and direct the Selectmen and Road Agent to prepare a 10-year plan for the improvement and development of the roads and highways of the Town, and to require such plan to be presented to the next annual meeting of the Town for approval or modification by the Town; and further, to require the Selectmen and Road Agent to substantially follow such plan as may then be approved in future years. - By petition (Names Submitted.)

Article 32. To transact any other business which may legally be brought before this meeting. - Submitted by the Selectmen.

#### ROAD CONSTRUCTION

The 1967 Class V Highway allowance was used to widen the Long Woods road around the foot of Hedgehog Mt. There have been several accidents on this section of road in past winters due to it being too narrow. This was an expensive project, yet we felt the Town should not risk the chance of a fatal accident. We are planning to complete this project with the 1968 Class V money.

#### REAPPRAISAL OF PROPERTY

This year, at the suggestion of the State Tax Commission, we have placed an article in the Warrant to see if the Town will vote for a complete reappraisal. A review by the Tax Commission of recent transfers of property in Deering shows that the assessments for tax purposes are disproportionate. We feel the Selectmen have neither the time nor the proper training to do a complete reappraisal, and strongly recommend passage of Article 29. The estimate of the cost of a complete reappraisal is \$4,500.00 which we propose to pay for over a period of three years. Passage of this article will require a two-thirds vote of the Town Meeting.

#### GIFTS TO THE TOWN

The Deering Community Club, active for many years, was disbanded this past summer. They have given the cooler and gas stove to the Town, also the use of the coffee maker. Mrs. Ruth Lawson has the coffee maker, and may be contacted for its use. At the Annual Town Meeting on March 14, 1967, the Town Voted to create a five member Town Planning Board in accordance with regulations described in Chapter 36, Sections 1-15, State of New Hampshire R.S.A., 1955. The Selectmen appointed Dr. James M. Carew for four years, Leon Baghdoyan for three years, Ernest Johnson for two years, Irving W. Ireland for one year and Selectman Mark Treacy, exofficio. The Board elected Dr. James M. Carew, Chairman for one year.

The Deering Planning Board has met ten times over the past year, with two of the meetings in joint sessions with the Hillsboro Planning Board.

Considerable discussion and research on planning for the present and future of Deering has transpired which includes the following:

1. The possibility of purchasing the Herrick Property to be used as a Town Dump was explored and studied but on entering into an agreement with Hillsboro to use their dump at \$300. per year, made this idea impracticable.

2. The Planning Board recommended that the Selectmen direct the Road Agent to improve Zoski Road on Deering Lake.

3. At a Special Town Meeting on July 8, 1967, the Trailer Ordinance as adopted at the Town Meeting 1967, was amended and unanimously approved by the voters, providing guidelines for the Selectmen in granting trailer permits, specifically, that the Selectmen must give substantial weight to the views and wishes of abutters and neighbors after a public hearing. This Amendment received the backing and approval of the Planning Board.

4. The possibility of a Merger of the Towns of Hillsboro and Deering underwent a preliminary study by a Committee consisting of Board Members and Selectmen from both Towns. A brief study proved that consideration of a merger and further study to be non-advisable at this time but to remain under open investigation by the Planning Boards until further study and application of the idea is improved. The Committees agreed that the two Planning Boards and Boards of Selectmen meet in joint session throughout the year to discuss topics of mutual interest.

5. The appointment of a Town Health Officer has been considered. The Selectmen have served in this capacity in the past.

6. A preliminary study on Sub-Division Regulations has been made by the Planning Board as applicable to Deering. This project will receive further investigation during the coming year.

7. A study on the need for road signs at various intersections of Town was made by Mr. Ireland. Members Ireland and Baghdoyan have offered to design and construct twenty such signs to be placed as needed throughout Deering.

8. In 1967, the State of New Hampshire Legislature enacted into law RSA Chapter 147-2 and 149-E regarding Sewage Disposal Systems. The law reads in effect that all future dwellings must have a sewage disposal system approved by the State. To assure compliance of the law the Planning Board recommends passage of Article No. 30 requiring a Building Permit be obtained from the Selectmen prior to the building, erection or placement of any home, or dwelling.

In January 1968, Selectman John Snow was made exofficio member of the Board filling the vacancy created by Selectman Mark Treacy's resignation.

The Planning Board feels that much has been accomplished during its first year of inception. The members of the Board are appointed by the Selectmen and serve without remuneration in a true civic spirit and in what is believed to be in the best interests of the Town of Deering and are always open to receive suggestions and opinions from residents and non-residents alike relating to matters of future planning for the Town.

## TOWN OF DEERING

## Report of Annual Town Meeting, Deering, N.H. March 14, 1967

A legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Deering was called to order at 7:15 p.m. The meeting was opened with The Lords Prayer.

Article 1. Ballots were cast as follows, Selectman for three years; Mark Treacy - 97 votes. Leon Baghdoyan - 61 votes. Town Clerk; Clara T. Rich - 149 votes. Town Treasurer; Clara T. Rich - 151 votes. Tax Collector; Howard E. Whitney -149 votes. Overseer of Welfare; Board of Selectmen - 135 votes. Highway Agent; Carroll E. Greene - 93 votes. Percy Putnam - 55 votes. Auditors; Marjorie Heath - 142 votes and Eunice Willgeroth - 144 votes. Library Trustee for three years; Alice Michie - 101 votes. Rita Morgan - 44 votes. Trustee of Trust Funds for three years - Eleanor Fitzpatrick - 141 votes. Chief of Police; Donald Dumais - 148 votes. Police Officer; Herschel Murdough - 149 votes. Surveyor of Wood and Lumber; Board of Selectmen - 137 votes.

Article 2. It was voted to accept the Reports of the Town

Officers for the previous year.

Article 3. It was voted to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations of the same.

Article 4. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,400.00 for Town Officers' salaries and \$1,500.00 for Town Officers expenses.

Article 5. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for Election and registration expenses.

Article 6. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other buildings.

Article 7. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for Social Security payments for Town Employees.

Article 8. It was voted on amendment, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for Police and \$1,000.00 for the Fire Department. The Police to receive \$1.75 per hour.

Article 9. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for Blister Rust Control.

Article 10. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for Insurance.

Article 11. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for damages and Legal Expenses.

Article 12. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Civil Defense.

Article 13. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Vital Statistics.

Article 14. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for sealing of roadways.

Article 15. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for Summer and \$8,500.00 for Winter Roads.

Article 16. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$425.00 for Street Lighting.

Article 17. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the general expense of the Highway Department.

Article 18. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,083.60 to secure Town Road Aid.

Article 19. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30.00 for the Town Library.

Article 20. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for Town Poor and \$1,200.00 for Old Age Assistance.

Article 21. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for interest on short term loans and \$550.00 for interest on long term loans.

Article 22. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to meet the annual payment on the West Deering Moat Bridge.

Article 23. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for County Taxes.

Article 24. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the care of cemeteries.

Article 25. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deed.

Article 26. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 27. It was voted, on amendment, to take up Article 27, at adjourned Town Meeting on Monday, May 15, 1967, at 8 p.m. At which time further discussion will take place with the Selectmen presenting financial figures.

Article 28. It was voted, 60 yes, 25 no, for the Town to adopt as an ordinance of the Town of Deering for the purpose of maintaining the general property values, atmosphere and well being of the Town, the following; No trailer or mobile home shall hereafter be located within the Town of Deering; unless the same mobile home shall be in a duly established and licensed trailer or mobile home park, or unless a person desiring to locate a trailer or mobile home not in such a park, shall upon petition and public hearing obtain the permission in writing of the Selectmen of the Town; said party shall have the right of appeal as set forth in Revised Statue annotated, Chapter 31, Section 74 and following as if said Selectmen were a board of adjustment.

Article 29. It was voted for the Town to adopt as a local ordinance governing the licensing and regulation of Trailer or Mobile Home Parks, the regulations proposed by the Selectmen as posted and published with this warrant. Under section 2, it was voted to charge an annual fee of \$25.00.

Article 30. It was voted for the Town to create a five member Town Planning Board in accordance with regulations described in Chapter 36, Section 1-15, State of New Hampshire R.S.A. 1955.

Article 31. It was voted to have the Town adopt an ordinance for the regulation of, care and maintenance, of cemeteries within the Town of Deering, as proposed and posted by the Cemetery Committee and printed in the Annual Report. Under Article 7 of the ordinance it was voted to include the following: These regulations shall not apply to any privately owned cemetery now in being and operated as a business and for which there is a charge made for the sale of burial lots.

Article 32. It was voted to purchase all of the "Herrick"

property located on Route 149, not to exceed \$15,000.00 and appropriated money for same. The property to be maintained by the Town as a sand and gravel pit and used as a sanitary fill area. By amendment it was voted to empower the Selectmen to sell or rent, any or all of the property.

Article 33. It was voted to preserve the beauty of our countryside by establishing control of billboards and signs in the Town of Deering. First, by prohibiting billboards and other signs advertising businesses, products, etc.; located outside of Deering. Second, by having any Deering resident wishing to erect a commercial sign/signs for his business in Deering submit plans for such sign/signs to the Selectmen. Such signs, if approved by all Selectmen, will be limited in number and size, as well as to being in keeping with the decorum of the landscape. Part three, relative to replacing signs already existing in Deering was withdrawn.

Article 34. It was voted to have Mr. and Mrs. Herricks picture on next years Town Report. A moment of silence was observed in memory of Mrs. Marie Wells. It was voted to have the Planning Board select a committee to plan Old Home Day. It was voted to adjourn until May 15, at 8 p.m., to take up Article 27.
