

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WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L. S.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Enfield qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Whitney Hall in said Town of Enfield on the tenth day of March next at nine thirty o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Polls will open at 9:30 A. M. and will not be closed before 6:00 P. M. Articles in Warrant will be taken up beginning at 1:30 P. M.

ARTICLE 1. To choose by ballot to serve for three years, one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds, one Library Trustee, one Fire Ward, and two members of the Recreation Commission; to serve for two years, one Recreation Commission; to serve for one year, one Treasurer, one Clerk, one Tax Collector; one Highway Agent, one Overseer of Public Welfare, one Police Chief, one Cemetery Agent, one Fire Ward, two Auditors and such other necessary town officers as are required by law to be chosen for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 2. To choose one Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

ARTICLE 3. To vote on the question "Shall Sweepstake tickets be sold in this town." ARTICLE 4. To vote on the question "Shall the Town of Enfield continue to maintain its Municipal Court so long as its present Judge remains in office."

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, the sums so borrowed to be paid before the end of the fiscal year in which the debt was incurred.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the sale or lease of any or all such parcels of real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds for non-payments of taxes, or any or all parcels are not in public use, or required for public use; and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to execute and deliver, in the name of the Town, suitable deeds or leases of such real estate, subject to such conditions or restrictions as may be voted by the meeting.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,007.24 for Town Road Aid, and to receive the sum of \$6,714.93 from the State, or act thereon.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from Gladys R. Ronca, the income there from to be used for perpetual care of the Gladys R. Ronca and Edmond Bushee cemetery lot number 59 in the Lake View Cemetery.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$1,000.00 as a bequest from the late Stella H. Dorothy, to the Enfield Public Library such sum to be placed in the hands of the Trustees of Trust Funds, and the income there from to be turned over to the Library Trustees to be used for Library Purposes as the Library Trustees may see fit. ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Budget and raise or appropriate the various sums recommended and posted by the Budget Committee, or act thereon.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote, if any person, firm or Corporation owning taxable property on April first may, after April first and before notice of the amount of taxes assessed against said property for that year has been received, make payment on account of such taxes in sums divisible by ten dollars, but not less than ten dollars, and the collector shall receive such payments and give a receipt therefor and credit the amount paid toward the amount of the taxes eventually assessed against said property.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to purchase additional land for the Town dump or act thereon.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,500.00, \$3,500.00 of this amount to be raised by taxation in 1964, the remaining \$12,000.00 to be borrowed on long term notes to mature in 1965, 1966, 1967 and 1968, for State Aid Construction; and to receive from the State the sum of \$31,000.00, or act thereon.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote that, if the purpose or subjects, hereinafter designated, for which appropriations for the year 1964 may have been made, have not been fully accomplished during the fiscal year, then the funds so appropriated or unexpended on the unfinished portion of said object shall be placed in a Capital Reserve Fund, dedicated to the purpose or object of its conception until such time as the Board of Selectmen, acting as Agents for the Town, shall have the opportunity or occasion for the fulfilling, or completion of/or for the purpose or objects for which said appropriaiton was created. The specially designated purposes for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1964, are as follows: the net earnings of the town owned trucks, grader or other equipment derived from highway appropriations for replacement purposes.

ARTICLE 15. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, on behalf of the Town, to hold Town Meeting, March 1965, in the evening.

ARTICLE 16. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or any other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto; and to transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE TOWN PLANNING BOARD

At the Annual Town Meeting held in March, 1963, the voters of Enfield authorized the creation of a Town Planning Board, the members of which were to be appointed by the Selectmen of Enfield. Additionally, the voters approved an appropriation of \$1,000 for planning to be matched by Federal funds under the Urban Planning Assistance Program.

Beginning with an organizational meeting held May 22, 1963, your planning board met regularly thereafter with seseveral consultant firms recognized by the State Planning Department of New Hampshire. On September 10, the firm of Hans Klunder Associates, Inc., of Hanover, N.H., was selected to prepare and implement a comprehensive plan for the Town of Enfield.

However, since the submission of the Enfield application, all Federal appropriations have been tied up because of civil rights legislation. Consequently, there has been no money for urban planning grants. The sum of \$1,000.00 appropriated last year has been set aside so that it will be available, when needed, and the planning board earnestly solicits your support of this year's appropriation so that the program can continue.

PREPARATION FOR ACTION

In March 1963, the member communities set the stage for the U.V.D.C., Inc., by appropriating operating funds on a pro-rated basis from general tax revenue (each community's share is approximately 75 cents per capita). The Steering Committee then set out to secure passage of necessary state enabling legislation and the approval of the New Hampshire and Vermont Legislatures. This was accomplished with the active assistance of local representatives of both states. A charter was subsequently granted establishing the U.V.D.C., Inc. as a non-profit promotional and development agency.

The Council swung into action on July 1, 1963 when the member communities appointed a Board of Directors composed of one director from each community plus an alternate who may serve in the absence of the regular director.

Applicants were then interviewed and the Executive Director was hired and assumed his responsibilities on September 3, 1963. A central office was established in Lebanon to effectively provide communication between the member communities and for the establishment of an overall program to assist existing industry as well as to formulate plans for continuous growth and development.

SIGNIFICANCE

The U.V.D.C., Inc. is the first organization of its type that encompasses communities from two states and as a result has attracted national attenion and recognition. This national precedent has caused other states to explore this method of operation. The U.V. D.C., Inc. is a cooperative effort in terms of information, research, promotion and prospecting. Its program, complemented by individual action of the member communities, will be the keynote of economical development.

PROGRAM

Historically, industrial development has taken the form of communities offering themselves to prospects. More often than not, local groups have given little more than lip service to assist in the expansion of existing businesses. There are approximately 14,000 development agencies (a new dimension in government) competing for new business investment. In essence, our program is a doubleedged sword;

- 1. The establishment of a business climate that would be attractive to new investment.
- 2. Assist existing industry and commerce to expand

A marketing concept of product development is required which will define the assets and advantages that the U.V.D.C., Inc. area has to offer. It should continuously develop the product so that it will more closely approximate what the prospect needs and wants. This to be accomplished by a planned program of preparation, research, advertising and promotion, solicitation and negotiation. Organization and preparation would characterize the activities of the Council in these first few months of operation. The solicitation phase has, therefore, been nominal. However. it has resulted in several bona fide prospects with whom we are conducting negotiations.

I PREPARATION

A. Economic Base Study — In order to initiate an effective program, it has been necesary to:

Trace the significant trends and changes in the local economy.

Determine what factors caused these changes and what present and future forces will be a factor in future growth and transition.

Evaluate the natural advantages and the human and physical assets that the area has to offer

Make the above information readily available to industry and the U.V.D.C., Inc. communities.

This base study has been prepared and is in the final stages of completion. It will be published as a detailed document outlining the facilities and conditions supporting economic development.

B. Inventory of Land and Buildings

Prior to an all-out solicitation program it is necessary to document available vacant land that has development potential and to make an inventory of existing space for sale or lease. Many such properties have been inspected and compiled data is on file in the U.V.D.C., Inc. offlice. Our searching for sites and building is a continuous one, and we urge property for sites and owners, real estate agents, Planning Boards, and others to recommend properties to us. Descriptive bulletins on these properties are being provided to both the Vermont and New Hampshire State Development Departments to be used by their agents.

A catalog of land and buildings will be prepared for use in direct solicitation.

C. INDUSTRIAL SITES

The development of prime sites is one of our major projects. Such sites should offer direct access to transportation facilities and be serviced by water, sewerage, and electric service. This is a prerequisite to any major development in the area.

The directors of the U.V.D.C., Inc., are currently studying various methods by which industrial sites may be developed and made available to prospects. One plan under consideration is the establishment of a sister corporation financed by local private capital that would purchase or option desirable land and arrange for its development

D. Key factors in Location of Business and Industry

LABOR — A labor survey has been conducted by the U.V. D.C., Inc. based on personal interviews with employers and reports from the Vermont and New Hampshire Departments of Employment Security. This study is to be incorporated in the "base study" and includes:

- a) Characteristics of the labor force
- b) Commuting habits
- c) Range of skills
- d) Wage rates
- e) Fringe benefits
- f) Availability

MARKETS — Industry and commerce locating in the U.V.D.C., Inc. area would be classified as "market oriented." Hence,our economic growth will be directly related to our ability to provide fast, lowcost distribution of goods, and efficient transportation of personnel. The Executive Director has met with the Vermont and New Hampshire State Highway Departments relative to inter-state construction and other highway improvements, and obtained maps to help locate potential sites. In addition, he has participated in meetings and discussions with the L.R.A., F.A.A. and State Aeronautics Commission on the continued development of a master plan for L.R.A. and for the improvement of related transportation facilities and services. The newly created Transportation Committee will continuously evaluate adequacy of rail, highway and air service and make recommendations for improvement.

RAW MATERIALS

Although the area is not rich in raw material resources, it is in a strategic position in relation to wood, pulp and paper. Council investigating opportunities for more effective utilization of hardwoods and assisting in the furtherance of a Hardwood study to be conducted under the Area Redevelopment Act.

II RESEARCH

- A. Base Study
- B. Analysis of total wages and employment
- C. Input-Output study, planned for 1964

III ADVERTISING AND PROMOTION

- A. News Releases Over 700 distributed regionally, nationally and in Canada. As a result, lead articles and editorials were carried in major newspapers and trade publications.
- B. Promotional Piece reproduction of two editorials and lead stories.
- C. Industrial Fact Sheets Highlighting U.V.D.C., Inc. assets with transportation map and statistical data.
- D. Area Brochure Will include area map and information, and separate sheets on each member community.

IV SOLICITATION & NEGOTIATION

- A. Industrial Fact Sheet will be used in direct mail solicitations of selected types of manufacturing and organization. This will be accomplished in February through April to encourage and promote prospects to inspect the area after the snow clears.
- B. The U.V.D.C., Inc. has established a cooperative effort with Federal Agencies and the State Development Departments of Vermont and New Hampshire to insure referral to prospects who may have a possible interest in the area.
- C. Discussions in progress with different business organizations interested in locating in area locations.

OTHER RELATED ACTIVITIES:

Recommended and supported the establishment of specific vocational courses under Manpower Development and Training Act to assist area businesses and to create additional employment opportunities.

Recommendations for curriculum in Regional Vocational Technical Institutes.

Filed brief to assist area High School in receiving grant for approximately \$200,000 to equip Industrial Arts and Shop Courses.

Supported the continuance and improvement of carrier service at Regional Airport in cases before the Civil Aeronautics Board.


