TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday the twelfth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$85.00 for the Monadnock Region Association or take any action relating thereto.

4. To see if the Town will vote to provide supervision at the bathing beach, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an adequate sum of money for Workmen's Compensation and Public Liability Insurance, or take any action relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,279.50 for State Aid Construction, this amount to be set aside for future use, and also raise and appropriate the sum of \$648.61 for Town Road Aid, the state to give \$2,594.45 or take any action relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to rebuild and tar the Norway Hill Road beginning at Route 202 and go toward the residence of William Hastings, and raise and appropriate money for same or take any action relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$325.00 for use in purchasing a new snow plow, or take any action relating thereto.

9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day and Old Home Week, or take any action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with The State Forestry Department, or take any action relating thereto.

11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department or take any action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to extend its Electric Lighting system, raise and appropriate money for same or take any action relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to close the road (subject to gates and bars) from a point near Toumanoff's place through to a point near Harry Mulhall's place, and also the road from the Pietersz place (so-called) to the above-mentioned road, or take any action relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes or take any action relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of one per cent on property taxes paid on or before August 15, 1946, or take any action relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to extend the Town water main from a point near the Bastille residence to a point opposite Joe Quinn's barn, and raise and appropriate money for same, or take any action relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$330.00 for necessary repairs on the Town Library, or take any action relating thereto.

18. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Capital Reserve fund for building a tool house, or take any action relating thereto.

19. To see if the Town will vote to accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the use of the Town, or take any action relating thereto.

20. To hear reports of Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and take any action relating thereto.

21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE ELECTRIC LIGHT COMMITTEE

The total revenue for the year from the electric light system was \$5,845.52.

New services were run to the residence of George Webberson, Fred Cox, Horace Hanson and Abbott Fuller and changes and additions were made in the services of several old customers.

A third wire was run from the main line to the Pierce mill. This added considerable expense for which no provision was made in our appropriation but we felt that such an extension should be made to encourage an industry and it also added a substantial load to the system.

Further progress was made in the pole replacement project started in 1943 but there are still about 75 poles to which our wires have not been transferred. It was necessary to draw on the Replacement Fund to cover a part of the cost of this work.

We are asking for a larger appropriation for this department for the coming year as we expect to transfer our wires to the remaining new poles and we hope that labor will be available to do a substantial amount of trimming.

We herewith submit a financial report for the year.

I submit herewith my twelfth annual report with the statistical summary and the annual health report by Miss Margaret E. Harris, R. N.

The enrollment for the fall term for all grades and the high school was 106 as compared with 99 for the same period last year, the average membership was 99.56 and the average attendance 95.36.

The work of the senior high school has been carried on very successfully. The junior high grades have been receiving special attention and every effort is being made to secure proper pupil adjustment to the work as outlined.

The primary and intermediate grades are under the same teachers as during the past two years, Mrs. Black teaching grades four, five and six, and Miss Welsh the first three grades.

Miss Margaret Robb was secured again this year to carry on the supervision of music in the high and elementary grades. Her work has been outstanding. We have been fortunate to have been able to secure her services during the past two years.

The mounting cost of living makes it necessary to consider salary increases again this year. New and inexperienced teachers are demanding higher salaries at the start than most towns have paid to teachers with years of experience.

At this time I wish to thank the School Board, Teachers, Pupils, and Citizens for the support given me during the past year.
