THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jackson in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Jackson on Tuesday the 13th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
 - 3. Maintenance of summer highways and bridges.
- 4. Snow removal from highways and "dooryards" and sanding highways.
 - 5. Streetlights..
 - 6. Old Age Assistance and Poor Relief.
 - 7. Maintenance of Cemetery.
 - 8. Memorial Day Exercises.
 - 9. Town Library.
 - 10. Fire Protection.
 - 11. Police Protection.
 - 12. Memorial Hospital.
 - 13. Jackson Resort Association.
 - 14. Social Security.
 - 15. Civilian Defense.
 - 16. Town Dump.
 - 17. Skating Rink
 - 18. Swimming Program.
- 19. The sum of \$273.71 for T.R.A. State will contribute \$1,824.77.

- 20. The sum of \$145.00 for White Mountain Region Association.
- 21. The sum of \$175.00 for Sander, the sum of \$150.00 having already been paid for rental, the original cost being \$325.00.
 - 22. The sum of \$1,200.00 for retarring Class V roads.
- 23. To authorize the selectmen to manage the Baker Place standing timber for the highest financial yield, proceeds from timber sold shall be placed in the General Account, providing that at least ten percent of such funds shall be used for reforestation of said land.
- 24. The sum of \$11,000.00 to secure State Bridge Aid to rebuild Gill Bridge, the State contributing \$22,000.00.
 - 25. The sum of \$5,000.00 to repair Gill Bridge.
- 26. The sum of \$300.00 for reassessing new property in 1962 by State assessor.
- 27. The sum of \$220 for interest on borrowing in anticipation of taxes.
- 28. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow in anticipation of taxes.
- 29. A sum of money for repair and addition of Town Garage.
- 30. The sum of \$500.00 for preambulating Town lines Between Bartlett and Jackson.
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to have its Selectmen enter into a lease with Wylie Apt along with other surrounding towns in leasing of the White Mountain Airport Strip and taxiways, and see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to reseal the hard surface runway with special airport runway sealer.

(by petition - Raymond H. Abbott, Jr. and others)

- 32. A sum of \$600.00 to be raised for Eastern Slope Airport Maintenance and Improvement.
- 33. To authorize the road agent to cooperate with the State by removing the snow from the center of Town, "from brick filling station to Thorn Hill Road". This action necessary when route 16 A becomes dangerously narrow and slippery in the busy winter months.

- 34. To impose summons of .20 on poll taxes uncollected after October 15, 1962.
- 35. To authorize Selectmen to distribute inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.

To act on any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Librarian's Report

THE JACKSON PUBLIC LIBRARY, open most of the year 1961 from 2 to 4 P.M. on Saturdays; and from late June to early September from 2 to 4 P.M. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, circulated some 1.409 books, answered reference questions and helped customers of all ages, and different backgrounds, to find something instructive or entertaining from our collection of 4234 "needed" volumes.

While we are most concerned with serving our residents, we actually serve one of the most cosmopolitan collections of customers in the state. They include people of all ages, from coast to coast, and from all over the world. Recently, at one time, we served readers from New England, New York, Kentucky, North and South Carolina, Florida, California, the Mid-west, Texas, Scotland, France, Germany, Korea, Japan and Russia. While we are glad to have such people, we can't help but wish that our local people appreciated our local asset - the Library - as much as these well informed outsiders do.

Almost every book in our Library has pleased someone. Come in and give us a chance to please you.

The Extension Division of the State Library at Concord sends us the welcome Bookmobile 6 times a year instead of 5, with some fiction, non-fiction and childrens' books.

Our circulating magazines include: Atlantic, Coronet, Field & Stream, Good Housekeeping, Holiday, Jack & Jill, Ladies Home Journal, Life, McCalls, Redbook, Readers' Digest and Saturday Evening Post.

We thank the chairman of our Trustees, Mrs. J. Arthur Doucette, for the New Yorker and the National Geographic Magazine and some books, and Bertha M. Rogers for Readers Digest Condensed Books.

The librarian and trustees, together and separately, have benefited from meetings at Concord, Conway and Jackson with Mr. Allen and others from the Extension Division. The Littleton meeting, displaying some 400 new books from the publishers' lists was most helpful.

We thank our trustee, Mrs. Haskell, for lighting the

gas fires early on library day - which is now (Feb. 1, 1962) on THURSDAYS from 2:30 to 4:30 only. All the trustees have helped the librarian in the selection of some new books.

In the past few years the librarian, with the cooperation of the trustees, has made some much needed improvements in the library. Shelving has been added, the reference and New Hampshire sections have been brought up to date in several respects, the children's section has been enlarged and the whole library "Weeded" to give more space and to get rid of unwanted books.

All this has resulted in improved library service and a \$15.00 merit award from the State Library, with which to buy new and standard fiction for our young adults. Concord thinks we are trying for a better library. How about you? Have you been in lately?

Report of Forest Fire Wardens

AN APPEAL FROM YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook - yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness - our carelessness. This, we - you - and I can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-ofdoors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high fire danger or set up regulations - hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting your and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you.

- 1. Follow the warden's directions.
- 2. Secure the required burning permit.
- 3. Keep your fires under control.
- 4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
- 5. See that your children are properly cautioned. Everyone will benefit by it.
