# THE MAYOR'S ADDRESS

Gentlemen of the City Councils:

One year of our administration of the city's affairs has passed, and we are about to begin the second and final year of our stewardship. I believe it is well and proper that we review briefly our work of the past year with the idea of profiting by any mistakes we may have made to the end that we who have been chosen to administer the affairs of our community may become more zealous and more proficient in the performance of our duties.

#### FINANCE

I am pleased to report that the city's financial condition is excellent, as was demonstrated by the ready market at a good premium for the bonds recently sold on the market.

#### HIGHWAYS

While there has been but little new construction of roads within the city, this department has been able to employ a considerable force with C. W. A. funds and with funds furnished by the State for Class V Roads. I strongly urge that these gravel roads be treated with oil this year as a matter of economy and to insure their permanency. I believe our city streets are as good or better than any other city in the state.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT

The fire department has had a busy year, and the new pumper purchased for the department has proved its value many times. My only suggestion is that the committee endeavor to create some plan for more frequent inspection of mercantile buildings, especially the basements and cellars of these buildings.

#### PARKS

Much has been done on park improvements the past year. I congratulate the park commissioner on the success of his efforts.

#### POLICE

A number of improvements have been made in connection with this department. All banks, with the exception of one, and the telephone office have direct telephone connections with the polices station, and a police box has been installed from which the officers on beat make a report to the station every thirty minutes. Machine gun, gas gun, and gas clubs have been added to the equipment. The new police car is very useful both for police work and as an ambulance. A record system is being installed which should prove valuable for future reference.

#### WATER DEPARTMENT

The outstanding accomplishment of this department was the successful extension of the water main around the Five Mile Drive.

This project, in my opinion, was well worth while and furnished a considerable amount of work for the unemployed, increased the fire protection for a large amount of property, and will eventually open up some very desirable property for the building of homes. I regret that funds were not available to complete the connection of dead ends, and hope that the committee may be provided with the money to complete this desirable improvement.

#### CEMETERIES

The Sumner Knight Memorial Chapel was dedicated in September and is a beautiful building. The special committee under whose direction this chapel was built spent a great deal of time and effort in bringing to a successful conclusion the location and building of the chapel, and are entitled to your sincere commendation.

#### HEALTH DEPARTMENT

So much has been published about what has been done in improving this department, that I will not tire you with details. I believe that the results of your action will prove the wisdom of our efforts and justify our endeavor to better safeguard the health of our people.

# WELFARE

Probably the most serious of all the problems that confront us in the immediate future is the matter of taking care of the unemployed and needy. As a Christian people, our duty is plain. That none shall suffer from cold or hunger should be our aim. Far better that we practice rigid economy in all other departments than that we fail in the duty we owe to suffering humanity. The head of this department has proven his efficiency. I trust you will give him your help and support.

#### CONCLUSION

Gentlemen: The year 1935 is ahead of us. I take this opportunity to express to you, the members of the City Government and the heads of each and all of the city departments my most sincere thanks for your support and spirit of cooperation for the past year, with the hope that my conduct the coming year may be such that I may continue to merit the same support that has made my duties as mayor a real pleasure during the year 1934.

# ORDINANCES AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

#### CITY OF KEENE

In the Year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

AN ORDINANCE amending Regulations Relating to Rooms used for dancing.

Be it ordained by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

That section 3 of the regulations be amended by striking out 11:30 P. M. Saturday nights and inserting in place thereof the words 11:50 P. M. on Saturday nights.

Passed December 6, 1934.

Keene, N. H., Dec. 17, 1934.

To the City Councils,

The undersigned desires to present to the City of Keene, in trust, however, the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars, the income only to be used in the care of the Tinker-Newman Lot in Greenlawn Cemetery, numbered 242 on the plan of said cemetery.

The fund is to be called the Tinker-Newman Cemetery Fund.

A JOINT RESOLUTION relating to the Tinker-Newman Cemetery Fund.

Resolved by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows: That the City of Keene by its councils, hereby accepts the Tinker-Newman Cemetery Fund of One Hundred Fifty (150) Dollars, in trust, however, the income to be used in the care of lot No. 242 in Greenlawn Cemetery.

The City Clerk shall receipt for said fund which shall be invest-

ed by the Trustees of Trust Funds according to law.

Passed December 20, 1934.

AN ORDINANCE amending Chapter XXXVIII, Section 2.

Be it ordained by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

That Section 2, Chapter XXXVIII, City Ordinances, be so far modified that the same shall read as amended: There shall also be an inspector of plumbing who shall be appointed by the mayor and board of aldermen, who shall hold office for one year or until his successor is appointed, who shall inspect all plumbing work for which permits are granted, in process of construction, alteration or repair, at any and all times, who shall perform such other duties as are prescribed by state law or city ordinance and who shall receive therefor the annual salary of five hundred dollars to be paid in equal quarterly payments.

Passed December 20, 1934.

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 2, Chapter XII.

Be it ordained by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

That Section 2, Chapter XII, City Ordinances, be so far modified that the same shall read as amended: The board of health is hereby authorized and empowered to employ a health officer for the City of Keene, who shall give his full time to the work as the agent of and under the direction of the board of health and who shall perform the duties hereinafter laid down and who shall receive therefor the annual salary of twenty-four hundred dollars (\$2,400.00) to be paid in equal monthly payments.

Passed December 20, 1934.

In the Year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five. A JOINT RESOLUTION relating to a Temporary Loan.

Resolved by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

That for the purpose of paying such claims against the City of Keene as may fall due during the current municipal term, The Joint Standing Committee on Finance and the City Treasurer of said city be and hereby are authorized and empowered to make such temporary loans, from time to time, for the use of said city of sums not exceeding in the aggregate the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand (250,000) Dollars; said loans being in anticipation of taxes of the present municipal year and hereby expressly made payable therefrom; said treasurer giving for said loans the notes of said city, bearing interest, or discounted and signed by said treasurer and the mayor of said City of Keene and payable within one year from their respective dates; and be it further resolved that the above resolution shall take effect upon its passage.

A JOINT RESOLUTION relating to the Clarence W. Emerson Cemetery Fund.

Resolved by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

That the City of Keene by its councils hereby accepts the Clarence W. Emerson Cemetery Fund of One Hundred Dollars, in trust, however, the income to be used in the care of one-half of Lot No. 476 in Greenlawn Cemetery in which Mr. Emerson is buried.

The City Clerk shall receipt for said fund which shall be invested by the Trustees of Trust Funds according to law.

Passed February 7, 1935.

A JOINT RESOLUTION relating to coordination of departments for relief purposes.

Resolved by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

That the Mayor, as Chairman, appoint a committee consisting of himself and two others, in accordance with a Joint Resolution passed March 16, 1933, to cooperate with the Overseer of the Poor, and other welfare agencies, and the other City Departments, to the end that the City of Keene shall get value received for all monies expended as aid to its ablebodied inhabitants; and that this committee shall report to the city councils at the first regular meeting of each month.

Passed February 7, 1935.

AN ORDINANCE relating to salary of Chief Engineer of the Fire Department.

Be it ordained by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

Amend Chapter XXXIV, Section 13 of the City Ordinances by striking out the words "two thousand" in line 2 and substituting therefor the words "twenty-four hundred".

Passed February 7, 1935.

# A JOINT RESOLUTION relating to a Special Committee.

Resolved by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows: That, for the future betterment of the City of Keene, there exists a need for change in the way the various City Departments are now being run, and that the Mayor forthwith appoint a committee consisting of himself, the City Solicitor, and five representative citizens, to consider the advisability of consolidating several departments of the City and setting up and maintaining a City warehouse and garage, of employing a full time City Treasurer, of remodelling City Hall, with a view to relieving the City of maintaining a public auditorium and to provide adequate office space for the various City officials, of disposing of land in the rear of the City Hall, in whole or in part, and of any other changes that may warrant their attention; which committee shall report to the City Councils at the second regular meeting in May, 1935.

Passed February 7, 1935.

AN ORDINANCE amending section 1 of the Building Ordinance.

Be it ordained by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

Amend Section 1 of an ordinance relating to the construction, alteration, maintenance and use of buildings in the City of Keene, known as the Building Ordinance, by striking out the last six words of line 5 and all of the remainder of said section and adding thereto the following: Section 1a. He shall act as City Engineer for all departments of the city and shall attend to all matters concerning the several departments of the city requiring the services of an engineer upon the request of the superintendent or committee having charge of such department.

Passed February 7, 1935.

AN ORDINANCE amending Chapter XXXIV of the City Ordinances.

Be it ordained by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

Amend Chapter XXXIV by adding a new section as follows: Section 23. The inspector of buildings shall receive in full for his services and for all duties required by the ordinances the sum of two thousand dollars per year, payable in equal weekly payments.

Passed February 7, 1935.

AN ORDINANCE amending Chapter XV, Section 1, City Ordinances.

Be it ordained by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

Amend Chapter XV, Section 1, by adding thereto the following: He shall also collect and receive all cemetery monies committed to him for collection by the superintendent of cemeteries and keep a separate account of all such collections and deposit the same with the city treasurer, taking a separate receipt therefor.

Passed February 7, 1935.

AN ORDINANCE amending Chapter VI of the City Ordinances.

Be it ordained by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:

Amend Chapter VI, Section 3 by striking out the last four words in line 26 and all of the remaining section and substituting therefor the following:

He shall promptly make out and render all bills pertaining to his office as superintendent and sexton and for special work, made payable at the office of the tax collector and shall deliver to the tax collector a true record of all such bills at the time they are rendered. He shall pay no bills of any kind. Under the direction of said committee he shall have the power to contract for such materials and supplies as it may order, and all bills against the city on account of cemeteries, except the weekly pay-rolls, shall be approved by the superintendent and the said committee, and when duly audited shall be paid.

Amend Chapter VI, by adding thereto a new section as follows: Section a. Money received on account of the cemetery department, whether from sources pertaining to the customary duties of the superintendent and sexton or from special work, shall be treated as a fund for the payment of all bills which may be authorized by said superintendent on account of the cemeteries.

# A JOINT RESOLUTION relating to an Appropriation.

Resolved by the City Councils of the City of Keene, as follows:
That the sum of Six Hundred Thirty-nine Dollars and Seventy
Cents be and hereby is appropriated from any money in the treasury

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than ten (\$10.00) dollars.

The Sewage Disposal System has been under construction since Septem-

ber 20th, 1934.

The pipe lines are now all laid and the Emhoff tanks and disposal field completed.

The Pumping Station structure is well along toward completion and with the installing of the pumps and grading about the grounds, should see completion of the Project about February 1, 1936.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS

To His Honor the Mayor and Gentlemen of the City Councils:

The following report of the Highway department for the year ending Nov. 30, 1935, is submitted.

Our work this year has been mostly a matter of maintenance with no new construction.

There is an ever increasing demand for oil treatment on our suburban roads. We have met the demand this year so far as we could do so by not oiling some of our city streets that were in quite good condition.

Excavations made necessary in the construction of the Sewage Disposal plant left several of our streets in bad condition particularly Winchester Court where trenches were so deep that the street was torn to pieces. All of these streets have been repaired. By agreement with the contractor we were allowed two hundred dollars toward the expense of repairing Winchester Court. This street has been graveled and treated with oil, both walks have been covered with stone dust and the street is in better condition than ever before.

An appropriation of \$5,000 was made to repair West street bridge and to help towards expense of painting other bridges. We added two new lines of stringers, replaced several old stringers with new ones and completely replanked with treated lumber. This bridge was built 35 years ago and was designed to carry the traffic of the times. With these repairs it is now in condition to carry loads permitted by our State laws.

We have previously called attention to the bridges over the Branch, and again urge a careful consideration of their condition. With the improvement of the Branch road traffic is becoming such that heavier construction is necessarv.

We are reducing each year our cost of bridge maintenance by erecting permanent structures.

The bridge over the Branch in Main street was replaced this year by the State.

All bridges railings and buildings of this department have been painted as a W. P. A. Project. The Federal appropriation for labor being \$1,123, and the City furnished supervision and material to the extent of \$1,400.

Removal of car tracks in West street, Main street and Central Square was also undertaken as a W. P. A. Project. It also included the repaving. The Federal appropriation for labor was \$1,760 and the City furnished supervision, labor, trucks and material to the value of \$4,600.

The City funds thus used were taken out of our regular Highway fund.

Attention is here called to a recent petition presented to the Councils asking for a reconstruction of Woodbury street.

The usual amount of rubbish has been disposed of at the incinerator, and the customary spring and fall rubbish collections were made.

In addition to the appropriation made for moving barn in the City pasture, this department spent about \$500 in repairing and grading around the building.

For some time tools, equipment and materials have disappeared from the buildings and property in the City pasture. We strongly urge that a suitable fence be erected to guard against further loss.

We have spent this year \$2,596 in fertilizing, trimming and removing trees. Statement of collections made by Highway department during the year.

## REPORT OF PARK COMMISSIONER

To the Honorable Mayor and City Councils:

This department is pleased to report that, during the past year, in addition to the regular care and upkeep of the various park areas, a considerable amount of development has been done with the co-operation of E. R. A. and W. P. A. projects in Robin Hood Park and the Drummer Woods. Through State and Federal aid the employment of 20 to 25 men who were on city or county relief has been possible for a period of eight months resulting not only in much progress in the development of these areas but in a saving to the city and county of over \$10,000 in poor relief.

At Robin Hood Park, the clogging of the drainage pipe and the appearance of several springs during the early spring caused serious damage to the new recreation field, necessitating several cross drains and the installation of a new main pipe of twice the former capacity. With the completion of these changes, the installation of swings, teeters, and sand boxes as well as seats and tables in the adjoining grove, this area has seen such a large and constant use that its development already seems well justified. The old octagon reservoir has been cleaned out, graded and seeded as an outdoor amphitheatre with terraced approaches, and the latter planted with perennial plants and shrubs. It is hoped that the amphitheatre may be used for plays and pageants but the transformation is at least a visual improvement. The season at the swimming pool was the largest and most successful in its history and three life guards, instead of the former two, were necessitated by the crowds.

Increased use of Robin Hood Park by our own people and expressions from out of town visitors convinces the department that the city is fortunate in having this large and fine recreation area so near the city and during the coming year work is planned to make more available some of the still undeveloped portions of the property.

At the Drummer Woods, some forty acres near the old Gilsum Road were cleared of dead wood and undesirable growth to give the pine a chance to grow, and it is planned to continue this trimming during the coming winter with W. P. A. labor. On the brook near the center of the lot a twelve foot dam is nearing completion to create a small pond, not only for fire protection, but also, as it is surrounded by pine groves, for an attractive recreation spot. Old roads to this area from both Elm Street and the old Gilsum Roads are also being repaired. A long ski trail has been made down the hill and it is planned to develop other trails along old wood roads throughout the 130 acres.

## REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

To the Members of the Board of Health, Keene, N. H.

I hereby submit a report of my work for the year ending December 1st. 1935.

I am very grateful to His Honor the Mayor and to the members of the city government for the support they have given me during the past year and particularly to the Land and Buildings Committee for their work in obtaining a place for a laboratory and health office and helping to equip it. Through their efforts the City of Keene has a municipal milk inspection laboratory and health office that compares very favorably with any in the State. Credit is also due Dr. A. A. Pratte; who died this year during his term as a member of the Board of Health; and the present members of the board for their efforts in the same matter.

I wish to thank the members of the Board of Health for their co-operation and assistance to me in getting a good start this first year. You were never too busy to stop and give me advice or assistance on any matter that came up.

The milk supply of the City of Keene has been greatly improved this year. Through the cooperation and assistance of the State Board of Health; whose inspectors have helped me whenever requested; we have obtained improved methods of handling, care of utensils and many improved stables and milk rooms. Each producer and dealer has been inspected, some of them many times, and wrong methods called to their attention for correction. There is yet much to be done but due to the present financial conditions some improvements could not be obtained. Milk samples have been collected and tested as often as possible and reports and criticism mailed each producer as soon as tests were finished. I have had fine cooperation from almost all the milk dealers and producers and I wish to take this opportunity to thank them for it.

Barber shops, restaurants, bakeries and all places where milk or food is sold or prepared have been inspected, many of them several times, and anything found unsanitary or illegal has been corrected.

Many complaints have been investigated and many nuisances abated.

Keene has been fortunate in not having many cases of contagious disease this past year. There have been no cases of diphtheria, typhoid fever or septic sore throat reported and only two cases of infantile paralysis. The absence of diphtheria is probably due in part to the administration of diphtheria toxoid to school children. It is apparent that a great many cases of children's diseases such as measles, whooping cough, chicken pox and mumps are not reported, due probably to the fact that most families do not call a physician in these cases. These diseases are reportable and should be reported to the Health Officer. There were also five cass of trichinosis, a not very common disease in this locality, which is caused from eating insufficiently cooked pork.

Following is a summary of some of the work done this year. not show of course the great amount of time spent in attending to correspondence, personal interviews and preparing laboratory equipment for milk work.

# REPORT OF CITY ENGINEER AND BUILDING INSPECTOR

Keene, N. H., Dec. 6, 1935.

To His Honor the Mayor and Board of Aldermen:—

My report is herewith submitted for the year 1935.

Engineering work this year has been mostly routine work, and work has been done in connection with the following City Departments, Highways, Water, Sewer, Drains and Cemeteries, the Park Commissioner, and the Lands and Buildings Committe. Lines and grades have been given on many streets for City construction work and sidewalk grades have been set for property owners when they were constructing houses or other buildings.

Large maps were prepared for the Cemetery Department, of Woodland, Woodland Extension, West Keene, and Greenlawn Cemeteries showing all burial lots with the names of the owners. A numerical and alphabetical index accompanying these plans.

Several vacant portions of Woodland Extension Cemetery being laid out into new lots and about 100 granite markers furnished and set by the Cemetery Department to mark the roadways and paths in these subdivisions. Each year all new data pertaining to cemeteries should be recorded on these plans and indexes, keeping them always up to date.

Street lines, not marked, should be properly marked at street intersections and angles by stone boundary posts set in the ground as called for by the street records. On other streets where records of the original layouts are incomplete, surveys should be made and the street lines established by the City Councils for the convenience of property owners. This is also very important in carrying out City Zoning laws.

Stone boundary posts have been set on several streets this year.

## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF KEENE PUBLIC LIBRARY

To the Honorable Mayor and City Councils:

Gentlemen: The past year has seen the library, with the splendid cooperation of its staff, meeting most effectively the countless demands made upon it. Its main function continues to be the furnishing of aid and counsel as well as books to those who wish to read for pleasure or profit. adult and juvenile borrowers have had a great variety of new books from which to choose. The budget has been planned to give especial attention also to the needs of the students and teachers of the community, who depend upon the library to supply much of their required reading. The reference, magazine and newspaper rooms have been unusually well patronized.

Library Hall is used regularly by the Historical Society of Cheshire County, and by the Council of the Parent-Teachers' Association and its Study and Pre-School groups. The Garden Department of the Keene Woman's Club has met there occasionally, and the club room has been used for various committee

meetings.

With profound sorrow, the Board of Trustees records the death of one of its most valued members, Mary A. A. Prentiss. As secretary of the board for thirty-six years, Mrs. Prentiss gave ever wise and untiring service in the interest of the library.

Early in the year, the permanent board elected Mrs. Walter H. Lacey and Mr. Winfield M. Chaplin to fill the two vacancies then existing on that board.

The library statistics and details of the work are covered in the librarian's report hereby appended.

## REPORT OF LIBRARIAN

To the Trustees of the Keene Public Library: The report for the year 1934-1935 is herewith presented.

#### REFERENCE DEPARTMENT

Exact statistics are not kept of the number of people using the reading and reference rooms, or of the questions and telephone calls answered, but undoubtedly such a record would equal if not excel that of any year. The demand for help from books indicates that the public has found the advantage of the public library and turns to it in all kinds of problems. This places upon us the necessity for an adequate supply of up-to-date material in books, pamphlets and magazines. The single text-book no longer suffices with the modern methods of teaching and the library must supplement it with many and varied sources.

#### CIRCULATION

The records show that the total number of books borrowed is 98,178, from which we may judge that business and employment are in better condition than two years ago when the library experienced such a large increase both in number of borrowers and books circulated. Almost all libraries felt that gain and few, very few, have kept up to that peak. Of the volumes loaned, fiction is a little more than three fourths of the whole, or 70,900. Literature, travel, periodicals, bibography and social sciences stand next in favor.

#### OUR BORROWERS

There have been 865 borrowers registered and re-registered, of whom 408 were adult, 322 juvenile and 135 re-registrants. The whole number of borrowers' applications now on file dating from September, 1930 is 9,608. The registration period is six years. A new enumeration should begin next September.

### CHILDREN'S DEPARTMENT

The circulation of books in this department is about 19% of the total circulation and six times the number of volumes in the department. 8 storyhours were given, the largest attendance being 150, with an average of 96. Book Week which was observed in a variety of interesting ways, as you have seen from the accounts in the local paper, brought a very large number of young people to the librbary each day of the week and an extra assistant was required from three to six o'clock. We feel that the effort expended on making this week an attractive one is well worth while from the new interest awakened, not alone among the youthful patrons, but among parents and teachers. The circulation this year amounted to 18,316; of this number of books, 4,609 were non-fiction. 1,998 were loaned from the deposit at the Symonds School. 162 volumes were loaned to schools and 202 were circulated by the teachers for home use.

#### THE BOOK COLLECTION

The number of books added this year is 1,044, of which 206 were gifts. 819 volumes were withdrawn, which leaves a net gain of 225 and brings the book stock to 30,021, not including several hundred pamphlets. We were favored in receiving a special gift of sixteen volumes from the Yale University Press, made possible through the generosity of "A graduate of Yale."

#### SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

Classes from the Symonds Junior High School have been continued, book notes and articels on library work and conditions sent to the Keene Evening Sentinel—we are grateful for the space given us—and certain sections of the library have been re-classified to conform to modern library usage. The librarian and children's librarian have spoken before P. T. Associations and visited libraries, the librarian has attended two regional conferences, and an assistant has attended one.

This reduction in the number of tax abatement suits pending against the City puts the City in a better position in respect to this type of suit than it has been for a number of years.

In the matter of the suit brought by the City of Keene vs. Ida Tatleman et als, there has been considerable comment during the past year among those

who possess a facility for destructive criticism relative to the time which it is taking to settle this case. I think therefore that it should be stated that the attitude of the defendants in this action is not one of opposing the City of Keene but one of willingness to cooperate so far as they are financially able. There is no question but what this so-called "automobile grave yard" case is a clear violation of our zoning law. The difficulty however lies in the fact that the matter has been allowed to continue for so many years that the cost of removing the junk now on the premises amounts to considerably more than the value of the land itself and amounts also to a sum which it is impossible for the defendants in this action to pay. Your Solicitor has had numerous conferences with the attorney for the defendants and an attempt is being made to work out some arrangement which will improve the appearance of this property but which at the same time will not impose an impossible heavy financial burden on the defendants. In the meantime the defendants have definitely agreed to add no more junk to the present collection. It is the opinion of your Solicitor that the strictly legal rights of the City in this case should be tempered with a certain amount of common sense. Acting on this basis I am proceeding with an attempt to reach some compromise in this case which will at least partially effect the purpose desired by you and at the same time be a financial possibility for the defendants.

The action of Waldemar Christopherson vs. City of Keene is brought for a determination by the court of the damages which should be paid to Mr. Christopherson for certain land taken by the City of Keene in connection with the Sewage Disposal Project. In connection with this matter the Mayor and Board of Aldermen took the land by eminent domain under our statutes. After due deliberation they awarded to Mr. Christopherson the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200), which sum has been tendered by your Solicitor to Mr. Christopherson but refused by him. It is probable that this action will be disposed of either by trial or by settlement during the coming year.

During the year 1935 there has continued to be considerable legal work concerning the so-called Sewage Disposal Project undertaken by the City of Keene under the direction of the Federal Administration of Public Works. Your Solicitor has cooperated in every way with other offices of the City to secure a speedy completion of this work.

Under your direction the City Solicitor has undertaken a new compilation of the City Ordinances. This represents a considerable amount of work which he has had to carry on evenings to avoid interruptions. The work is practically finished and your Solicitor expects to submit the new ordinances for your approval at the second meeting of the City Councils in December 1935.

- C. Organized game groups,
  - The children were divided into age groups.
    - 7 years and under were under the supervision of Miss Spaulding and Miss Gooch.
    - Girls between 8 and 10 were under the supervision of Miss Callahan and Miss Thompson.
    - Boys between 8 and 10 were supervised by Miss Whitcomb.
    - Girls 11 years and over were under the supervision of Miss Kingsbury and Miss Newman.
    - Boys 11 years and over were supervised by Mr. Wyman.
  - Many and varied games were taught the children by their supervisors for an hour each day,
- D. Other Activities.
  - 1. Painting.
    - Painting was introduced by Miss Walstrome who endeavored to teach the fundamentals of painting, as most of the children had never had lessons in paints.
    - Scenes and forms were painted aiming for perfection in the fundamentals.
    - This activity was introduced for the first time this year and was found to be very successful.

- 2. Story Telling-The stories of "The Adventures of Nils" and "Grim's Fairy Tales" were told half an hour each day.
- 3. Tumbling—Various forms and positions were taught in tumbling.

  4. Singing—The singing of popular and well known songs accompanied by a piano was an activity which came three days a week.
- 5. Walks-Many walks in the neighboring woods were takekn which were in the form of nature studies.
- 6. Tournaments—Tournaments were held and completed in the games of horseshoe, deck tennis, soft ball, croquet, and obstacle races.
- 7. Park soft ball team-Many games were played with neighboring playgrounds and other organized teams in soft ball. This team was a new feature of the playground introduced by Mr. Wyman.

8. Swimming Lessons.

Two instructors from the playground taught swimming at the Reservoir each afternoon. These lessons were only for the playground children.

Notes signed by the parents were first brought before any child was admitted into the group.

E. Special Activities.

- 1. Future Fearless Fire Fighters—The duties of these firemen were to keep the park clean, to watch for and report fires, and to fight any fires. They had their own apparatus and fire hose.
- 2. Park Police Patrol-Six police, new ones chosen each day, helped the instructors to keep order and cleanline in the park.

V. Special Features.

A. Cage of monkeys on exhibition.

The children dressed and made up as monkeys were driven into the park in a truck escorted by a motorcycle cop. They were exhibited on the junglegym.

B. Doll parade.

The contestants filed across a platform where they were judged. Prizes were awarded.

C. Track Meet.

The children were divided into four groups according to age and weight. In each group were five events. Prizes were awarded.

D. Corn Roast.

Corn, hot dogs, and soda were donated. The corn and hot dogs were roasted in a big bonfire.

E. Treasure Hunts.

Treasure hunts were planned for both mixed and divided groups.

F. Baseball and soft ball games were played with neighboring playgrounds and other organized teams.

VI. Accidents.

No serious accidents occurred during the season of the playground.

## REPORT OF WELFARE DEPARTMENT

To His Honor the Mayor and Gentlemen of the City Councils:

I herewith submit the report of the Welfare Department for the year ending December 1st, 1935.

From Dec. 1st, 1934 to Jan. 1st, 1935 all relief was carried on under the provisions of House Bill 417 which expired Dec. 31st, 1934.

From Jan, 1st, 1935 to April 1st, 1935 the relief was handled entirely by local authorities with no outside aid or supervision.

On March 13th, 1935 the New Hampshire Legislature enacted House Bill 296 which provided for the administration of relief under State Supervision. This bill was retroactive to Jan. 1st, 1935 and provided for a fifty per cent reimbursement to the Towns and Cities for costs of direct aid. On Nov. 1st, 1935, the Welfare Department was notified by the State that we would not be reimbursed for direct relief expenditures after that date as their appropriation for that purpose was exhausted. The City will have to be prepared to carry on alone until July 1st, 1936, at which time another appropriation will become available for the reimbursement of the Cities and Towns within the State.

# REPORT OF THE CHIEF ENGINEER OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

To His Honor the Mayor, and Board of Aldermen:

I hereby submit my report for the year ending November 30, 1935.

There were 34 bell alarms, 414 still alarms, making a total of 448 alarms; of these calls were out of town

16 of these calls were out of town. The estimated value of buildings damaged by fire. \$527,100 00 Damage to buildings. 16,757 19 Insurance on said buildings, 432,000 00 Insurance paid, 16,757 19 60,290 77 Value of contents of buildings. Damage to contents. 6,073 06 Insurance on said contents. 46,427 88 Insurance paid. 6.073 06

The number of alarms the department has answewred for the year is 448; this is 31 less than that of last year. Chimney fires is the largest part of the alarms the department answers.

The fire loss for the year is what would be called a fair average, as there were no large fires during the year. There were a number that the loss would exceed \$1,000, and with the number of alarms the loss was reasonable.

The building inspections carried on during the year show that the business men in their Stores, Office rooms, Garages, Hotels and shops, keep their places in very good condition.

The Motor Fire Apparatus and its equipment are in very good condition Most of the apparatus in the department has been painted or re-finished. Engine No. 1 painted, Engine No. 2 varnished, Ladder No. 1 painted, Combination No. 1 and 2 painted, also Chief's car varnished. The department was lucky to get a painter to do the work here at the station, also his price for labor was very reasonable. There was no time that the apparatus being painted was out of commission, but that it could be used if necessary. The permanent men at the station painted Combination No. 2. This makes the apparatus look as good as new also it is much easier to take care of.

There has been added to the equipment, during the year the necessary attachments for the use of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch hose, viz: Nozzle tips so that the small hose can be connected to the end of the large stream, also a two-way siamese so that one  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch hose line will supply two  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch hose lines, also reducers from  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch for hydrant connections direct to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch hose, 1,000 feet of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch hose was purchased for this purpose, 100 feet is carried on each pumping engine to be used as leader lines.

A good many fire departments throughout the country are placing this small hose equipment in their departments, as the water loss is much smaller and it is very much easier to handle, and also a good number of fires in the residential sections can be handled with these small lines of hose.

The department has on hand 9,900 feet of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch double jacket rubber lined hose, and 200 feet of unserviceable hose, also about 1,200 feet of linen unlined hose in hose house at South Keene, and 1,000 feet of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch single jacket rubber hose.

There has been turned over to the Water Department 100 feet of unserviceable hose.

The Fire Alarm System is in very good condition.

There has been purchased this year a new set of battery for the fire alarm, this purchase did not require only half as many cells of battery as before on account of the rectifiers which were installed last year and takes the place of one set of battery.

There have also been purchased two fire alarm boxes for replacement, No. 41 Middle Street cor. Center, and 113 Railroad Street cor. 93rd.

#### DEATHS

Three deaths occurred in the department during the year. Associate Engineer Fred W. Towne died January 1, 1935. Private Harry V. Roache, Deluge Hose Company, died April 17, 1935. Assistant Engineer Dennis J. Foley, died August 10, 1935.

The Board of Engineers recommend the purchase of 1,000 feet of fire hose, two fire alarm boxes, and a booster pump for Combination No. 2. There will also have to be purchased some new tires for some of the apparatus during the year.

To His Honor the Mayor, Members of the City Government, Joint Standing Committee on Fire Department, Officers and members of the Fire Department, and to the Police Department, I extend my sincere thanks and appreciation for the aid and support rendered me during the year.
