STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lempster, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall, said Lempster, on Tuesday, the 4th day of March at ten o'clock, in the forenoon, to open the polls for voting for candidates, and at one o'clock in the afternoon for the discussion of the Articles of the Warrant.

Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing, and to vote on the following question, "Shall the provisions of Chapter 171A of the revised Laws relative to playing Beano be adopted in the Town?"

Art. 2. To receive all reports and act thereon.

Art. 3. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes for the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for the Town in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for the Capital Highway Reserve Fund.

Art. 6. To see what action the Town will vote to continue the Town Forest Committee and to take any necessary action thereto.

- Art. 7. To see if the Town will accept in trust, the sum of \$150.00 to be known as the Robert E. Champney Fund.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$810.85 for the T.R.A.; the State will contribute \$5,405.69.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote \$250.00 to keep the Information Booth open from June 2nd to September 2nd.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will choose a committee to organize a bicentennial celebration and raise any necessary funds.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1800.00 for the Fire Department's annual expenses.
- Art. 12. To see how much the Town wishes to appropriate to adequately insure present Town buildings.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1200.00 for the Town's share of Social Security for its employees.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$534.48 for the Newport Area Home Health Agency.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$77.36 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$500.00 for interest on notes.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$600.00 to help maintain and support the Newport Hospital.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to allow 3% discount on taxes, if paid on or before September 1st, based on 80% of last year's taxes, and 2% discount on taxes if paid on or before October 1st using the same base.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will raise \$796.00 to help maintain the Newport Ambulance Service and assure the Town of Ambulance Service.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate not more than \$175.00 for dog catching to be offset by the dog tax.
- Art. 21. To see if the Town will appropriate \$1270.60 for the second payment on the Loader and Backhoe.

- Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the regional planning commission, now organized and named the Upper Valley Lake Sunapee Council, and to appropriate the sum of \$274.00 as the Town's share of the annual operating expenses of the regional planning commission to be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.
- Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to seal Blacktops.
- Art. 24. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$1,000.00 to reduce the Town Deficit.
- Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote that any person building a structure notify the Selectmen in writing. This is only for the purpose of assessing.
- Art. 26. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to stop automatically sending Town Reports to non-residents, except that the non-resident request it and send the postage.
- Art. 27. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

NOTES FROM THE SELECTMEN:

The deficit decreased on paper this year by \$2,912.98 to give a true current deficit of \$4,772.25. We removed long term indebtedness from the liabilities which the State says should not be there. If we had not done this, there would have been an increase in deficit of \$2,169.42, due mostly to extra highway expenses.

The "Employee's Retirement & Social Security" expense was considerably over this year due to the fact that we have been entering the employee's withholding and social security under this title. Starting January 1, 1975 the employee's part will be entered under the particular expense account which it belongs, since it is the employee's part not the Town's part.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid-August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodlands closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.

Many calls were answered during the year, also many investigations on breaking and entering were covered, including traffic accidents, traffic checks, delivering messages, and assisting other Police Department, in the area.

NEWPORT AMBULANCE SERVICE

The Newport Ambulance Service answered 438 calls during 1974.

The Ambulance Service, the vehicles, and the crew members are all licensed with the state and meet all requirements above regulations. Over 90% of the members are now licensed "Emergency Medical Technicians." This represents a great many hours of training for each member.

Coverage to the area towns has continued this year. Each town that we have covered with service has helped to support the Ambulance Service with tax assistance based on population, at \$2.00 per head. The Ambulance Service hopes to continue service to all communities in our area again in 1975.

The Ambulance Service has also responded to all major fires, in all communities. This is added protection of life and limb to all concerned.

The Newport Police Department has continued to serve as our dispatcher and has proven very valuable to our service and response time. Our telephone number for emergencies is 863-2355.

NEWPORT AREA HOME HEALTH AGENCY
87 Sunapee Street

The Newport Area Home Health Agency services are available to all participating towns for the following treatments ordered by a doctor: blood pressure readings, injections, dressings, baths, enemas, diabetic instruction, diet teaching, rehabilitation, health supervision and our second service is Physical Therapy.

Also our nurses provide instruction and guidance to expectant mothers, new mothers and babies, family planning, handicapped children and adults.

The agency has preschool immunization clinics every other month and is assisted by local doctors and the New Hampshire State Department of Health and Welfare. Provided at these clinics are oral Polio vaccines, Diphtheria, Tetanus and Whooping Cough vaccines (DPT), Measles vaccines, and Mumps vaccines.

The agency also works very closely with the New Hampshire State Bureau of Communicable Disease in monitoring TB cases and contacts of TB cases, hepatitis outbreaks, measles epidemics and other communicable disease problems.

The agency has reestablished the well child clinics for low income families with Dr. Litman's help, the new pediatrician in Newport. These are held once a month.

The director of the agency, Mary Gallant, also works with the Newport Hospital discharge coordinator to help patients there to plan for an easier transition to home after discharge. The agency in this way finds patients needing skilled nursing care at home after discharge from the hospital. If the agency is unable to assist possible patients, the agency refers them to the appropriate agency such as: The New Hampshire State Welfare Department, Town or County Welfare, Vocational Rehabilitation, Mental Health Centers, Planned Parenthood, Alcoholics Anonymous and Alcoholic Rehabilitation Programs, drug rehabilitation programs, Senior Citizens, Crippled Children's Services, Maternal and Child Health Services, Heart Disease Program, Special Health Services, Convulsive Disorders Clinics, Cancer Commission, Cystic Fibrosis Clinics and other Home Health agencies.

The Newport Area Home Health Agency is certified yearly thru Medicare. Medicare and Welfare patients usually receiveservices free as Medicare and Welfare reimburses the agency directly. The agency has a contract with Blue Cross/Blue Shield to provide skilled nursing care and physio-therapy to patients

in their homes in lieu of hospitalization only. Any person requiring services that the agency can provide will get care, either on a sliding scale fee or free if unable to pay. (This is paid for by town appropriation-your tax dollars)

The agency has a program of ongoing inservice education in conjunction with the New Hampshire Board of Continuing Education, New Hampshire Heart Association, New Hampshire Lung Association, New Hampshire Department of Health thru closed circuit TV programs, and other seminars put on by various health professionals.

ENROLLMENT

The present number of students totals 119 in Grades 108, served by a teaching staff of five full-time and three part-time positions.

Sixty students are attending high school: one at Keene and fifty-nine at Newport.

SCHOOL BOARD

Progress is being made in developing written policies and regulations on school operations. This is providing more uniformity and should prove a help to staff, students, and citizens.

A part of most Board meetings has included teacher presentations on curricula matters. This is aimed to provide a closer co-ordination between staff, School Board, and parents. Over-all reaction has been excellent.

BUDGET

Funds have been included to increase the services of the part-time Aide to full-time. This would provide both library service as well as assistance to the teachers - particularly the Head Teacher in the performance of teaching-supervisory duties.

Funds to provide Art instruction are included. This would be another step toward meeting Minimum Standards for Elementary Schools.

Special services for a handicapped student outside the District will require both tuition and transportation charges as required by existing state law.

CONCLUSION

Transportation, as well as custodial services, are now provided by Mr. & Mrs. Charles Newton. Mrs. Connie Hooper continues to operate a successful lunch program and is to be commended for operating within a tight budget in such a period of high food costs.

I am pleased to report that school operations are proceeding very effectively. A fine spirit of co-operation, concern, and dedication exists. Many special experiences for the students are underway - largely through the efforts and ingenuity of the staff under the leadership of the Head Teacher, David Cronin.

REPORT OF THE HEAD TEACHER

From January to June of 1974, under Mr. James Russell, Head Teacher at the Goshen-Lempster School, the growth and changes initiated by him during 1973 resulted in successful consolidation and fruition. His satisfactory achievements were: (a) a new Library Resource Center under the able guidance of Mrs. LeClair, (b) a Dental Clinic in conjunction with the Parent-Teachers Association and Mrs. Buck, the school nurse, (c) the traditional Eight Grade class trip and graduation, (d) initiation of a special reading program directed by Mr. A.J. Soucy, Teacher Consultant for Union No. 43 and implemented by Mrs. Barrett with the assistance of Mrs. Mary McCullough, Chairman, and Mrs. Constance Hooper, Co-Chairman of a Title I Advisory Committee for this cooperative special reading program, (e) the expansion of services to our school by the Sullivan County Mental Health Clinic, (f) a significant Vocational Vistas project which resulted in providing a work experience program for one of our older students, thanks to Mr. Russell's efforts, (g) an outdoor basketball court, (h) the valuable help by parents who volunteered as Aides, and, (i) many field trips and projects in learning situations.

Beginning with the new school year in September 1974, there was a sharp replacement of teaching personnel, with only Miss Jan Bradeen remaining from the previous September; Mrs. Nancy Rickard came in mid-1973, sharing the responsibility of teaching grades 1-3 with Miss Bradeen. Mrs. Connie Hooper continued as cook and Mr. and Mrs. Bud Newton as custodians.

The new staff continued many of the valuable foundations as laid by the former Head Teacher, Mr. Russell. Building upon these previous programs and then creating new patterns of learning, the teachers of grades 4-8 effected shifts in direction by the time December 1974 rolled around:

Creation of a Student Council headed by capable officers who led in the construction of a Constitution - giving the students the privilege of active participation and responsibility in effecting a stable climate of formal and informal learning.

Implementation of a Student Judiciary Committee who proved invaluable to the Head Teacher in uncovering disruptive patterns among the students and conducting fair and equitable justice to all students.

Initiation of a Physical Education and Recreation Program held twice each week in which a variety of sports were held to fit the needs and interests of all students.

Emergence of a package of formal mini-courses, each led by very dedicated volunteers and professionals from the Goshen-Lempster community: Mondays - sewing - Mrs. Barbara Killoran; Tuesdays - cooking - Mrs. Connie Hooper; Monday through Wednesday - guitar instruction - Mr. Gilbert Pinckney; Thursdays - instrumental instruction - Mrs. Kathy Merrill; and Fridays - Crafts, beginning with Waist Loom Weaving - Mr. Robert Nelson.

An Industrial Arts and Art Program on a daily basis which provided the students with an outlet to develop manual skills and to work at their own speed and capabilities in a controlled and supervised milieu.

Formation of a planned Task Force of faster-learners who established tutorials by taking slower-learning students on a one-to-one basis and giving their peers the benefit of a more personal teaching experience.

Establishing contracts with individual students in an effort to construct a more diversified learning climate and forming circles of learning in which students of different degrees of competence studied a problem collectively.

Engaging in student-centered projects:

- (a) A heritage newspaper produced by the 6th graders in line with their study of our American heritage.
- (b) A school newspaper produced periodically by the 8th grade with appropriate learning sessions on the fundamentals of journalism.
- (c) Planning and practice of two separate plays by the 4th and 5th graders which will be presented to the community during February 1975 and sponsored by the P.T.A.
- (d) A serious science fiction stage play, "The Veldt," by Ray Bradbury, to be presented by the 7th graders, and a mock radio soap opera comedy based on a spoof of one of our learning units in ancient western culture; this old-time radio skit, "Our Gal Cleo," will be presented in March 1975 and sponsored by the P.T.A.

Assemblies, such as: (a) a Christmas music festival of student readings and songs, conducted under Miss Schroeder, (b) invitations to guest speakers, as Mr. Stan Williamson who lectured on the three branches of our New Hampshire State Government (c) demonstrations by Fire Chief Ed Baker and his colleagues on safety precautions.

Field trips with intensive orientation before each venture and post-analysis to: (a) Concord, where the students had guided tours of the State Capitol and State Museum, (b) Newport Library at which competent personnel instructed our students in such items as the physical use of the Readers Guide To Periodical Literature, and (c) a planned trip to Dartmouth College Campus and Museum with tours arranged by Mrs. Dorcus Chaffee.

A daily program of indoor games administered by the 7th graders as part of their Game Club.

Formation of various clubs (Chess, Athletic, etc.) which met periodically and practiced parliamentary procedure.

School dances held under strict supervision, with student planning committees such as Rules, Refreshment, and Program Committees, all under the auspices of the 8th graders and the Student Council.

The use of socio-dramas to vividly engage in such bread and butter experiences as face-to-face relationships between employer and applicant seeking employment - within the trauma of current retrenchment and unemployment.

Providing the use of the cafetorium for community needs, such as Brownie meetings under Mrs. Wheeler, Cub Scouts under Mrs. Joan Leslie, and the impressive kindergarten experiences administered by Mrs. Towne as she has done in past years.

P.T.A. activities, suppers and other related school functions.

A close liason with Mrs. Karr of the Argus-Champion and Mrs. Downing of the **Claremont Daily Eagle** in order to publicize the constructive activities of our students.

Regular periodical meetings with Mr. Maynard of the Sullivan County Mental Health clinic to discuss ways to help some of our youngsters.

A successful and firm program of cutting down on absenteeism by engaging the aid of our Truant Officer, Chief Ed Bruno who has been invaluable in helping us adhere to New Hampshire State school laws.

A projected Adult Education evening course of continuous education in modern mathematics and the metric system, instructed by Mr. John Bonfiglio.

Close cooperation with specialists, such as our school nurse, Mrs. Buck, Mr. Herb Williams, Newport Guidance Counselor, and Mrs. Carolyn Fellows of Newport High School, in coping with future needs of our students.

A mutual sincere attempt by our faculty and our local Board of Education to work together and form firm communication links with the Goshen-Lempster community by such methods as monthly reports by each faculty member with invitations to attend extended to all parents.

Beginning a local Honor Society with elected officers and the construction of a constitution whose prime goal is to act as **ahelp** agency to those in need of mental and physical comfort. For example, we have a projected arrangement with the personnel at the Claremont General Hospital to send our young members as voluntters to cheer our "shut-ins" located in various areas of our communities; the youngsters will read to elderly people, tell them of their work at school, etc., in order to give them solace and dispell dispair in loneliness.

Working with both our local 4H personnel and with Mr. Ivan Head, director at Claremont, in presenting practical activities to our young people.

Meetings of the R2R (Right To Read) Committees, supervised by our Union No. 43 Director Mr. Al Soucy who has been the prime motivator in our needs assessment program for our students.

In conclusion, looking back these past four months, there are so many people who have given so freely of their time and energy without any ulterior motives or attempting to set up a personality cult. However, the focus of our thanks must be directed to our student body of over one hundred strong. It is **they** who have given **us** our motivation to act constructively. They have kept us young and forward-looking; we will continue in the pursuit of tapping the potential of each youngster in a relentless effort to develop their potential and varied skills, and, above all - to give them their dignity and self-worth as human beings. That is what our country is all about.
