

Lisbon Village District Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Lisbon Village District in said state, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on Friday, the 26th day of March, 1943, at 7.30 o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot a moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose by ballot a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose by ballot a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 4. To choose by ballot a commissioner for the ensuing three years.
- 5. To choose by ballot a commissioner for the ensuing one year.
- 6. To choose by ballot a water commissioner for the ensuing three years.
 - 7. To choose by ballot an auditor for the ensuing year.
- 8. To act upon the reports of the commissioners, treasurer, water commissioners, and committees heretofore chosen.
- 9. To raise and appropriate five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for payment of water bonds, and thirteen hundred fifty dollars (\$1,350) interest on same.

- 10. To raise and appropriate three hundred dollars (\$300) for the mnintenance and improvement of the swimming pool and appurtenances on the Parker Meadow, so-called, and to empower the moderator to appoint a committee of three to direct the expenditures of said fund.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 12. To transact any other business that may properly and legally come before said meeting.
