WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

March 12, 1957

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of Strafford and State of New Hampshire, Qualified to Vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday, the 12th day of March A.D. at 11 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers.

A town clerk for the ensuing year.

A selectman for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$7500. in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year.

- ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$268.34 for class V highways to match the sum of \$1788.93 to be contributed by the State.
- ARTICLE 5. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for purchase of a fire truck at a future date. Said \$500.00 to be placed in the "Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund" created in 1956 under Article 9 of the 1956 Warrant.
- ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70 for the Seacoast Regional development Association.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five (or seven) members with duties as set forth in Section 1-15, Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and Maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board members shall consist of one Selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes, Annotated, 1955.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to change the building code in part or in whole.
- ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will join the South-eastern New Hampshire Regional Planning Committee whose duty it shall be to work toward a coordinated plan for the development of the area with the view toward encouraging the appropriate use of land; the facilities of transportation and communication; the proper and economic location of public utilities and services; the promotion of good civic design; and the wise

and efficient expenditure of public funds, in accordance with the provisions of the Urban Planning Assistance Program authorized by the Housing Act of 1954, amended, and administered by the State of New Hampshire. And further, to appropriate the sum of \$200.00 as the Town's share of the two-year development program for the Southeastern New Hampshire Regional Planning Committee.

ARTICLE 10. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.

ARTICLE 11. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

RECORD OF TOWN MEETING

MARCH 13, 1956

ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

For Town Clerk: Edna P. Twombly received 45 votes and was declared elected for the ensuing year. The oath of office was administered by Moderator, Kenneth S. Morrow.

For Selectman for the ensuing three years: Joseph Cole received 48 votes and was declared elected.

For Treasurer for the ensuing year: Loretta J. Morrow received 30 votes and was declared elected.

For Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year: Dorothy S. Dugan received 43 votes and was declared elected.

For Auditors for the ensuing year: Charles Jennison had 33 votes, Merrill Huntley has 32 votes and the two were declared elected.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years: Edward Moore had 19 votes and was declared elected.

ARTICLE 2. Voted that the Selectmen appoint all other necessary town officers.

ARTICLE 3. Voted to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$7500 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the ensuing municipal year, and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year.

- ARTICLE 4. Voted that the Town shall raise \$267.07 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$1793.78 to be contributed by the State.
- ARTICLE 5. Voted to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$2062.85 for the purpose of making improvements to Class V roads within the Town, such sums to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 83, Laws of 1951 as amended by Chapter 31, Laws of 1953, and any amendments thereto, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Madbury.
- ARTICLE 6. Voted to table a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.
- ARTICLE 7. Voted to raise the sum of \$300 to reimburse Joseph Cole for damage to his truck on the Drew Bridge.
- ARTICLE 8. Voted to increase the salary of the Treasurer from \$50 to \$100 a year and approve a total budget of \$18,604.07.
- ARTICLE 9. Voted to appropriate the sum of \$500 to be set aside as a fund to purchase a new fire truck. A like sum to be appropriated each year for five years if the Town so desires.
- ARTICLE 10. Voted to accept the incinerator ordinance as printed in the Town Report.

ARTICLE 11. To hear reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Mr. John S. Elliott presented the report of the Water Commission.

ARTICLE 12. Voted to appropriate \$7000 for replacing the Drew Bridge, \$5000 this year, \$1000 on the bond issue payable in 1957 and \$1000 on the bond issue payable in 1958.

ARTICLE 13. Voted to adopt the building code with amendments, the name to be changed from building ordinance to building code, and the code to be accepted for use this year as written. The selectmen were empowered to appoint a board of three directors as constituted in the code. The directors were to be requested to prepare a more detailed ordinance to be considered at the next annual meeting. All trailers moved into town shall conform as to safety, convenience and welfare of the Town of Madbury and under the directors of the building code.

ARTICLE 14. Voted that the Town, through the board of Selectmen and the Town Clerk, register our dissatisfaction with conditions at the bridge on the Durham Road over the B. & M. Railroad to the State Highway Department and the B. & M. Railroad.

Voted to extend voting on primary ballots to 6:00 P.M.

Personally appeared the officers elected under Article 1 and took the oath of office as prescribed by law before Edna P. Twombly, Town Clerk.

REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Madbury:

The year 1956 brought a minimum of fires in Madbury with little property damage. One building was damaged by fire, and on September 30 the Madbury Church was damaged by smoke from a faulty oil burner. The remaining fires were accidental with two causes unknown.

The fire equipment in general is in good condition. Several lengths of hose were found defective when tested last fall. Some can be repaired. Replacement is not recommended at this time.

In the first year under our incinerator ordinance permits were issued to those who applied for them. The number was very low. Join this group and have your incinerator safe.

There are two areas in which our department should be improved. Our communications should be improved so as to get enough men to operate efficiently at fires.

To use modern fire fighting tactics at building fires a minimum of eight men is needed to operate efficiently. In 1956 we had an average of four and six tenths men respond to each alarm.

For Forest Fires we have enough equipment on our truck for twenty-five men. There are five men who can fully operate all of our pumping equipment. The fire protection for Madbury, and the fulfillment of our Mutual Aid agreement rests on these five men.

The money we appropriate each year is lost without manpower. Have you done your part?

I wish to thank all who have faithfully cooperated with us. May I urge all of you to renew your interest in your Fire Department so that when the calls come we can respond with assurance of reasonable success.
