2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the district will vote to support the school board in petitioning the Court for authority to close the High School and transport the pupils to Conway.

7. To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to borrow an amount not to exceed \$3500 to buy a bus. 8. To see if the District wishes to close the Silver Lake School and the Madison Corner School and consolidate grades 1 through 8 in the present High School building as a 3 room school.

9. To choose committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

10. To see if the District will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the district as determined by the school board in its annual report.

11. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for needed equipment.

12. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to be used for major building repairs.

13. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for insurance.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Madison:

Probably at no time in the history of this country has the attention of the people been focused so sharply on the problems of education. Seldom, if ever, have these problems been so acute. Competent authorities report that during the past five or six years 350,000 men and women have left the teaching profession. Marked increases in the cost of supplies and in teachers' salaries have increased the cost of school operation to a serious degree. The tremendous problems of the war years we met and solved. The problems of peace are of no less magnitude. Careful appraisal of the adequacy of the American schools to meet the needs of children and the welfare of the nation is a continuing year by year responsibility of American citizens. We made immeasurable sacrifices of life, strength, and wealth to defend the basic tenet of the American way of life — the dignity and worth of the individual. We must still defend this tenet against hostile political must still defend that tenet against hostile political faiths both from within and without. That defense

American children have an assignment with destiny that is not optional. They will live in a world of incredible complexity, or racial and class tensions, of international frictions, and of inevitable change. They must find their way in this world and must have the education which will help them do so.

During the year 1945-46 the high school suffered from interruptions from various causes, most serious of which was a change of headmasters in the middle of the year. Mr. Harry E. Kenney became headmaster on January 1 and through strenuous effort and the splendid cooperation of the Assistant, Mrs. Twombley and the pupils succeeded in completing the work of the year. Teachers for the present year are: Headmaster Harry E. Kenney Ass't. Mrs. Faith Twombley Junior High Mrs. Erma Lyman Corner Mrs. Manora Clayton Silver Lake Mrs. Martha Kelley School Nurse Mrs. A. H. Rowland, R.N., of Chocorua.

Lack of vocational training presents a serious handicap in the training of high school pupils. Through academic subjects they may be trained adequately for college entrance, but those who go directly into employment after graduation have little to offer in the way of salable skills. To provide for this to some degree the high school has provided correspondence courses in typing and mechanical drawing to a few pupils interested in these subjects. Provision of such subjects is necessarily limited and the expense would be prohibitive should a majority of the pupils require them. I most strongly recommend that the citizens of Madison explore every possibility of providing vocational training for the boys and girls in the high school.

The very helpful cooperation of the members of the School Board, the teachers, and citizens is most sincerely appreciated.

The pupils were weighed and measured. Vision tests were done with the telebinocular and individual ispections were made when it seemed necessary. A dental clinic was held at the high school on May 9 with Dr. Denault in attendance. Eeighteen pupils were examined and treated. The total number of operations was 52.

Toxoid clinics were held in May and June for the pupils in the first five grades and the pre-school children. Dr. Wiggin was the physician, assisted by Mrs. Jo Anne Carter, of the State Board of Health, and the school nurse.
