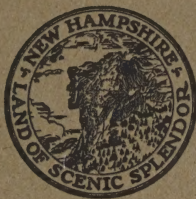

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madison, in the county of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Madison:

Probably at no time in the history of this country has the attention of the people been focused so sharply on the problems of education. Seldom, if ever, have these problems been so acute. Competent authorities report that during the past five or six years 350,000 men and women have left the teaching profession. Marked increases in the cost of supplies and in teachers' salaries have increased the cost of school operation to a serious degree. The tremendous problems of the war years we met and solved. The problems of peace are of no less magnitude. Careful appraisal of the adequacy of the American schools to meet the needs of children and the welfare of the nation is a continuing year by year responsibility of American citizens. We made immeasurable sacrifices of life, strength, and wealth to defend the basic tenet of the American way of life — the dignity and worth of the individual. We must still defend this tenet against hostile political faiths both from within and without. That defense

American children have an assignment with destiny that is not optional. They will live in a world of incredible complexity, or racial and class tensions, of international frictions, and of inevitable change. They must find their way in this world and must have the education which will help them do so.

During the year 1945-46 the high school suffered from interruptions from various causes, most serious of which was a change of headmasters in the middle of the year. Mr. Harry E. Kenney became headmaster on January 1 and through strenuous effort and the splendid cooperation of the Assistant, Mrs. Twombly and the pupils succeeded in completing the work of the year.

Lack of vocational training presents a serious handicap in the training of high school pupils. Through academic subjects they may be trained adequately for college entrance, but those who go directly into employment after graduation have little to offer in the way of salable skills. To provide for this to some degree the high school has provided correspondence courses in typing and mechanical drawing to a few pupils interested in these subjects. Provision of such subjects is necessarily limited and the expense would be prohibitive should a majority of the pupils require them. I most strongly recommend that the citizens of Madison explore every possibility of providing vocational training for the boys and girls in the high school.

The very helpful cooperation of the members of the School Board, the teachers, and citizens is most sincerely appreciated.

A dental clinic was held at the high school on May 9 with Dr. Denault in attendance. Eighteen pupils were examined and treated. The total number of operations was 52.

Toxoid clinics were held in May and June for the pupils in the first five grades and the pre-school children. Dr. Wiggin was the physician, assisted by Mrs. Jo Anne Carter, of the State Board of Health, and the school nurse.
