

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the Eleventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriations for the same.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid to be expended on the Robie Road so-called, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,499.00 for the same, the State contributing \$2,499.00.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Class V roads.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300.00 to paint New Hampton's half of the lower New Hampton-Bristol bridge.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to replank New Hampton's half of the lower New Hampton-Bristol bridge.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of road leading to Harold Donkin's, formerly the Dixon place.

- 9. By request. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the tarring of road leading from Plaisted School road toward the Dean Babbitt place.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of old cemeteries.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of the New Hampton Village Cemetery.
- 15. By request. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$166.00 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 16. By request. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$29.00 to the Newfound Region Association to aid in advertising and other activities for the benefit of the Town, in cooperation with other towns of the Newfound region.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.

- 19. By request. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the Town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the Town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.
- 20. By request. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such an audit.
- 21. By request. To see if the Town will vote a sum of money for the support of the Laconia Hospital, and make appropriation for the same.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen, on behalf of the Town, to enter into and execute a stipulation in the proposed condemnation proceedings by the United States of America to acquire a flowage easement over the Central Bridge, between Bristol and New Hampton, and those sections of the approach road to the said Central Bridge; River Road; and the Blake Brook Road, within the Franklin Falls Dam and Reservoir Area, which roads and bridges are more particularly described as follows:
 - a. The approach road to Central Bridge and Central Bridge, from the 395-foot contour line westerly to the Bristol town line, a distance of approximately 470 feet.
 - b. The River Road, from the approach road to Central Bridge in a general southerly direction to the 395-foot contour line, a distance of approximately 9700 feet.
 - c. The Blake Brook Road, from the River Road

in an easterly direction to the 395-foot contour line, a distance of approximately 1300 feet.

The said stipulation to provide for the payment of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to the Town of New Hampton by the United States of America as full and just compensation for the acquisition of said flowage easements and the release of the United States of America from all claims for damages to the roads and bridges of the Town of New Hampton as a result of the construction, operation and maintenance of the Franklin Falls Dam and Reservoir.

- 23. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue as a public highway, the lower road, so-called, along the Pemigewasset River, from its intersection with the River Road, approximately 2470 feet southerly of Blake Brook, in a general southerly and easterly direction for a distance of about 8800 feet, through land of the United States of America, to the easterly boundary of said land of the United States, formerly of the Globe Realty Company.
- 24. To transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

I respectfully submit my second annual report as Superintendent of Schools for the Town of New Hampton. This report covers the calendar year ending December 31, 1946.

At the close of school in June Mrs. Maude E. Weare resigned as teacher at the Fiske School. Mrs. Anna Adams, for a number of years Supervisor of Music in the schools of New Hampton, resigned in June, and it has not been possible to find a person to take her place.

An effort has been made during this year to evaluate and standardize the instructional program. In the areas of language and number skills, basic programs for all schools have been introduced. Many text book replacements will be in order for the new year. A basic reading system should be introduced and improved texts in the social studies area are a necessity.

It is a privilege and pleasure to work with the New Hampton School Board and teachers in the promotion of the educational welfare of your boys and girls.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

School visits, 75

Pupils inspected, 95

The pupils were weighed and measured twice during the year. Vision tests were taken with the Telebinocular and hearing tests with the Audiometer. Individual inspections were made whenever it seemed necessary.

Result of the physical examinations

Defective vision, 11 Defective tonsils, 4

Defective teeth, 23 Skin conditions, 6

Of the eleven pupils who have defective vision, ten are being corrected with glasses. Six pupils had their dental work done; two have had their tonsils removed; seven were taken to the T. B. clinic for a thorough checkup, chest examinations and x-ray pictures—reports were all negative.

Toxoid clinics were held in April and May for the pupils in the first five grades and for pre-school children. Dr. Turley was the physician in attendance, assisted by Mrs. Joanne Carter of the Board of Health and the School Nurse.

The First Aid Kits which had been used at the First Aid Stations during the war were placed in the schools. This was a great improvement on the previous kits.

The Red Cross Committee voted to have cod liver oil tablets in the schools, but due to the scarcity of cod liver oil we were unable to procure them.

I wish to express my appreciation to all who assisted in carrying out the health program.
