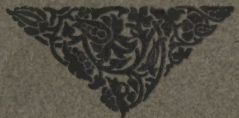

## THE WARRANT.

---

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Sutton in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs;

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Sutton, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 2d. To choose three Selectmen for the ensuing year.
- 3d. To choose one or more road agents for the ensuing year.
- 4th. To choose a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5th. To choose a Tax Collector for the ensuing year.
- 6th. To choose one Trust fund Trustee for three years.
- 7th. To choose a Trustee for the town Library and all other town officers.
- 8th. To elect a delegate to the Constitutional convention.
- 9th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 10th. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise to repair highways and bridges and make appropriations for same.
- 11th. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 12th. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for maintenance of State Highways.
- 13th. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

- 14th. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to raise and appropriate whatever sum of money they may think necessary to reimburse the draftees from the town of Sutton; the expenses paid out by them when called for examination at Franklin, N. H.
- 15th. To see what action the town will take in regard to the bequest of the late John M. Pressey.
- 16th. To see what action the town will take in regard to installing extra lights.
- 17th. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
