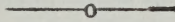

TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Warren in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Warren on Tuesday, the Ninth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To hear the reports of Selectmen and other Town officers and pass any vote relating thereto.
4. To bring forward your ballots for the election of Delegates at Large, Alternate Delegates at Large, Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the National Convention of the various political parties to be held to nominate party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.
5. To raise and appropriate money to maintain highways and bridges.
6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$261.21--The State to contribute \$1,044.85.
7. To raise and appropriate money to maintain street lights.
8. To raise and appropriate money for support of fire department.
9. To raise and appropriate money for town library purposes.
10. To raise and appropriate money for Town Poor Old Age Assistance and Soldiers' Aid.

11. To raise and appropriate money for Memorial Day and care of parks, playgrounds and cemeteries.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,666.66 as a final payment on the bridge now near completion over Baker River on the East Warren Road.

13. To see what action the Town will take in regard to construction of sidewalks and raise and appropriate or set aside money for said purpose.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate as a bonus for Dr. F. J. Kasheta.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for white pine blister rust control.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55.36 to the White Mountains Region Association.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the so called Avery lot on Beech Hill.

18. To see if the Town will vote to grant a discount on property taxes for 1948 and determine date and percentage of same.

19. To authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

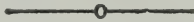

**WARREN SCHOOL WARRANT
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

To the inhabitants of the School District of Warren, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 13th day of March 1948, at **two** o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
9. To see if the district will authorize the school board and two other legal voters of the district, appointed by the moderator, to act as a special committee to consider the feasibility of forming a cooperative secondary school district and to report to the district not later than May 1 its findings including building requirements, program of studies, capital investment, operating costs of such a district and such other matters as may be deemed material.
10. If the preceding article is adopted to see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of not exceeding \$300.00 to cover the cost of preparation of the report and traveling expenses of the special committee.

Teachers and Pupils: Again the turnover of teachers in the Warren Schools was 75% of the staff.

Mrs. Elma Howard, the only remaining teacher, returned to the Glenclyff school to carry on her good work of the previous year. Mr. Howard Evans of Wentworth, was

employed as Principal of the Village School teaching in Grades 6, 7 and 8, replacing Mrs. Carole Bowker. Mrs. Barbara Pike of Warren replaced Mrs. Priscilla Colby in the Primary grades. Both Mr. Evans and Mrs. Pike graduated from Plymouth Teachers' College with a B. Ed. Degree. Mrs. Mable Cole of Walpole, N. H. replaced Miss Julia Pease who taught the intermediate grades. Mrs. Cole is a graduate of Keene Teachers' College and San Jose Teachers' College of California. Mrs. Cole has had experience in teaching in several western states as well as in New Hampshire. Mrs. Christie Goodwin of Piermont, N. H. succeeded Mr. Childs as Music Supervisor.

Buildings and Grounds: Redecorating the hallways in the Village school and the interior of the Glenduff school constituted the major items of repairs done during the summer. Book shelves and closets were installed during the winter recess, and shades for the reading room were purchased.

I would recommend strongly the repair of the playground equipment, and the purchase of special equipment for the lower grades. The theme of education today stresses the "growth of the whole child" which includes the physical and moral aspects. Good playground equipment has become an important part of the school plant. Too long have we been teaching "subjects" rather than children.

It has been a pleasure to serve the Warren School District as its Superintendent since August last. You have excellent teachers, good physical equipment, a co-operative, friendly, serious minded School Board, and are to be congratulated in your selection of the latter.

I wish to express my appreciation to you, the citizens of Warren, and to the School Board, the teachers and pupils for the cordial welcome given me as the new member of the greatest institution in New Hampshire—that of teaching children to become better citizens in their respective localities.

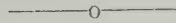
