Report of the Forest Fire Warden and District Chief

LEST WE FORGET — IT CAN HAPPEN HERE

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar-holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947 nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand - a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them **dead out** when leaving.
4. **Most important** - instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year - 1971 was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.

SERVICE REPORT — WINCHESTER

During the 12 month period from October 1, 1970 through September 30, 1971, 19 families were referred to Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service from Winchester.

Services provided involved 27 adults and 7 children and included marital counselling, individual treatment, family treatment including group therapy and psychological evaluation. More than 156 hours of direct treatment were provided by professional staff, exclusive of consultation services and services of a general community nature.

Estimated cost of services provided to Winchester residents exceeds \$3,120. Families paid a total of \$112 for services based on ability to pay. During this year, allocations voted at annual town meetings in 1971, Community Mental Health grant from the State of New Hampshire, and voluntary contributions and fees based on ability to pay provided the total increase necessary for the provision of services to Winchester residents.

In 1972, the Agency received \$60,000 as a State grant for Mental Health services. This was made possible through the provision of local matching funds in the form of city and town allocations and voluntary contributions. Continuing local contributions as a matching requirement are a prerequisite for increased State aid for our services.

REPORT FOR YEAR 1971

1. The year 1971 was by far the most active year we have ever had. Many new programs were put into operation as you will see in the report below.
2. The summer day camp program as very popular and some 60 children received swimming awards. I wish to thank the staff, the senior citizens who sponsored material for the ceramic program, and Mrs. Ruth Coffin who helped in many ways besides direct the craft and ceramic programs.
3. Many thanks to the coaches of the boys baseball teams, Mr. Guilmette, Mr. LaPoint, Mr. Vaine and Mr. Polk.
4. The highway, police, and fire depts. were very helpful.
5. The winter program included adult bowling leagues as well as high school and grammar school leagues, the senior citizens met every Wednesday for cards, ceramics, etc., an adult ceramic class was held on Monday nights, the house wives again bowled on Tuesday mornings, A teen canteen was opened on Mon., Wed., and Thurs. nights offering pool, ping pong, cards, chess, checkers and rap sessions of interest, also on Wed., and Thurs. nights boxing and wrestling was held downstairs using a new gym mat, showers were installed for this program. The teen canteen is supervised by a teen age boy who has been trained by the recreation director and his salary is paid for by the government (neighborhood youth corps). We had good skating after Christmas that was destroyed by the children, the ice has been repaired after some two weeks delay due to the weather.
6. Free bowling is given to the grammar school once a week and is under the supervision and instruction of a school teacher.
7. The senior citizens had a bus trip to Keene to see the Xmas lights and they had dinner at the Red Roof.
8. The inside of the large hall was painted by teen age boys and the neighborhood youth corps. A government funded program paid their wages.
9. Set up with the neighborhood youth corps, a program for boys in need, both for those in school and also for the drop out. Many hours were spent in helping our youth with their problems.
10. Many thanks to Mr. McNamara and Mr. Lindgren for their help and co-operation, it helped make our programs successful.
11. Thanks to the generosity of Mr. Harris we were able to transport our children to various programs.
12. The board of trustees at the center have a real progressive approach to recreation and this has made many of our new programs possible.

Report of Conservation Commission

To the Selectmen and the Voters of the Town of Winchester, N. H.

The voters at the Annual Town Meeting in March 1971 Voted to establish a Conservation Commission and the Selectmen were authorized to appoint (7) seven persons to this Commission, Members were appointed for various terms from one to three years. The following were appointed Harry Edmend, William Byrne, George Brusio, Richard Dockham, Harold Nowill, Dorothy Doolittle, and Carol Nicholson.

Mr. Edmend was elected Chairman and Mrs. Nicholson Secretary, Mr. Edmend resigned in the middle of the Summer and Mr. Richard Dockman became acting Chairman.

The Committee choose as its Prime Target way to clean up the pollution in Forest Lake, Samples were taken weekly at the lake and were evaluated at the Public Health Center in Keene.

Surveys at the lake showed that the largest contributor to pollution in the lake was the brook that flows along the toe of the Town Dump and into the lake near Secord's Beach.

The State Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission was asked to make a survey of this area and make recommendations on how this could be combated.

The State Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission recomended that a Sand Berm be built along the toe of the Dump so that any water running off the face of the Dump would be filtered before it entered the Brook this being a temporary measure, some method should be found to

better eliminate this pollution.

The disposal of solid waste seems to be the only way that pollution can be eliminated from getting into the lake.

In Sept. three members of the Commission visited the experimental Solid Waste disposal unit in Conway. This Unit is a Rural Incinerator sponsored by the Federal Government, State of New Hampshire and University of New Hampshire. The demonstration of this unit proved to those attending that pollution could be eliminated by this method without acquiring additional land and that waste that now has to go to Keene for treatment could be taken care of by this unit. The cost of this unit is quite low and could be borne by the Town. The incinerator is capable of handling the waste from a population of excess of 25,000 persons and the residue from this disposal system is less than 10% of the volume received.

A point to remember is the requirement by the Federal Government for towns our size to eliminate open burning at our town dump by 1974. This must be done by incineration, land-fill or re-cycling our solid waste. This committee regards this deadline to be our number one priority at this time.

The Commission also investigated the possibility of getting a soil map for the Town. These maps would be made by the Soil Conservation Office in Keene with 50% of the cost coming from the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture and from the Ford Foundation 50% of the remainder Plus \$750.00 leaving the Town's share of the total cost \$2,080.00. These maps will show the type of soil, the water table and those areas where building should not take place. These maps will show where residential development should be, where industrial development should be and such land that is not suitable for either until a sewer system has been built.

Administrators' Report

The school principal and superintendent, as in the past, are combining their efforts to produce a single report in order to avoid duplication and verbosity. This report will attempt to summarize certain relevant educational matters, but the administration does not pretend to be infallible in discriminating between what is significant and what is not.

During the past year, financial problems have grown with the rise in local property taxes, the increasing costs of education, the reduction in state support, and a lagging economy that has placed increased burdens on the family pocketbook. This has, in many cases, brought about a feeling of futility by people in our community as well as elsewhere. Concepts like relevance, accountability, local control, and the like are challenging our school system. Critics are saying that schools are political organizations and that schooling as a social system serves political ends. Although educators resist this suggestion, the question remains, why have we reached this critical impasse?

In theory, public schools should be equal in every way. However, this is not the case. School systems reflect the financial resources and social values of the community which supports them. The disparity among schools is found not only among communities, but also is found from state to state. Parents and students are becoming aware of these inequities and are attempting to redress their grievances by active political intervention. Public schools on the other hand, have maintained their present structures because they are essentially subdivisions of local governments and therefore reflect the expectations of these sources of power. It seems clear that as long as the property tax remains as the principal revenue producer, local community influence will continue to exert power and direction over educational policy in our schools and the frustration over inequalities in educational opportunity will continue.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

ENROLLMENT

The Winchester Elementary School opened its doors this year on the seventh of September, and proudly ushered in a new era in the town. With an opening enrollment of 476 pupils at the new school, the town has undertaken the operation of one of the largest elementary schools in the state.

STAFF

Our staff has grown in correlation with large increase in the students and now numbers a full-time teaching staff of twenty-one teachers. They are as follows: Mrs. Mary D. Mr. William T. Konzal, Grade 6; Mrs. Diane C. Murphy, Grade 5; Mrs. Marjory E. Newell, Grade 3; Mr. Henry A. L. Parkhurst, Special Education; Mrs. Ruby E. Perrin, Grade 2; Miss Joan C. Pickering, Grade 2; Mrs. Kathleen Rokes, Grade 3; Mr. Edwin A. Stevens, Jr., Grade 6; Mrs. Rosanne T. Stevens, Grade 4; Mrs. Janet R. Stohr, Grade 1; Mrs. Marion L. Tacy, Grade 4;

The staff now includes members who have done undergraduate work in Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Connecticut, New York and California. This diversity can do much to widen the backgrounds of the children.

KINDERGARTEN

Included in the above list are two teachers charged with the responsibility of initiating our kindergarten program. Although the public kindergarten is a new idea of Winchester, we feel that we have developed one which can look to with great pride. The positive educational benefits that can be accrued from participation in these classes will be a real influence in the development of our youngsters.

LEARNING CENTER

In addition to the twenty teachers in our school, we have on hand a full-time teacher in charge of the Learning Center. The role of this fellow has changed considerably since last year, and we feel we are utilizing his talents in a much more positive manner than last year. The Learning Center no longer carries any stigma and the Center can be and is utilized by children from all the classrooms within the school. Children can be either sent or referred to the Center by teachers for any number of reasons. We feel that we have upgraded this program tremendously in the past year.

PSYCHOLOGY SERVICES

In conjunction with our school psychologist, Dr. Howard Buss, we have reorganized our approach to his services and are now operating with what we call the "Psychological Team". The elementary school has his services for three afternoons a month in which we discuss children who are referred for recommendations. The team consists of the psychologist, nurse, special education teacher, classroom teacher and the principal. With a more diversified group to lend their expertise to a discussion, we feel that more valid recommendations can be made and better follow-up accomplished. So far this year we have dealt with 23 children and additionally have carried out 5 related parent conferences.

SPEECH AND LANGUAGE THERAPY

Miss Donna Jacobs, a speech therapist comes to us twice each week to provide the children of Winchester who need help in speech development, with the direction needed to overcome their handicap. She works with 23 of our children presently, and only lack of time prohibits her from seeing

more of our youngsters. Her program is further assisted by a teacher-aide who works directly under her guidance and whose salary is provided for by the Federal Government under Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. This aide, Miss Karen Moon, is a certificated teacher, a graduate of North Adams State, and lends an invaluable input into the program.

Mrs. Nancy Pindell is another aide who has been hired with Federal funds under the same provision. Her primary responsibility has been in the field of language development and her efforts have gone far beyond the expected duties. A graduate of Penn. State University as a psychology major, she has worked with the children in many capacities. Under her direction some sixth grade children wrote and presented a play to the entire student body.

HEALTH SERVICES

The elementary school is also fortunate to have the services of a Registered Nurse, Mrs. Carol H. Parkman, on the premises who shares her time with the high school. The need for her services is very great indeed, for she has averaged 225 visits to the health office per month. In addition to her duties as school nurse, she has worked closely with local officials in helping out with clinics, etc.

CHRISTMAS PROGRAM

On Wednesday, December 22, 1971 the Thayer High School band and chorus, under the direction of Charles Rosoff, gave their annual Christmas program in the auditorium of our elementary school. Approximately 250 of the townspeople came to the production and heard selections by both groups.

OPEN HOUSE

On Sunday, November 14, 1971 an open house was held at the new Winchester Elementary School. The school was officially dedicated and was opened to the townspeople for their inspection. The ceremony was successful beyond our expectations and it is estimated that over a thousand people seized upon the opportunity to inspect the school. Robert Brunelle, Deputy

Commissioner in the State Department of Education, was the keynote speaker.

Townspeople, parents, and students are to be thanked and commended for helping to make the opening of a new educational enterprise a smooth and successful endeavor.

Mr. Irvin Gordon has taken over the mathematics vacancy. Mr. Stephen Gray has been added to the science department and Mrs. Ernest Lind has been assigned to teach English. Mrs. Charles Lincoln was hired to fill the vacancy as secretary, made by Mrs. Walter Harrison.

SPACE NEEDS

The space made available in the high school because of the construction of the new elementary building has made it possible to enlarge our library, art room and office space as well as giving more classrooms. We are still badly in need of more space for music, art and shop expansion. Adequate gymnasium space as well as a physical education program is rapidly becoming a very important minimum standard requirement which will have to be met very soon.

CURRICULUM

The Junior High School Industrial Arts program is continually being improved this year. The seventh and eighth grade classes are all progressing at a good rate. With the help of Mr. Michael Szot, a student teacher from Keene State College, team teaching was incorporated for the first time in the eleventh grade metals class. Mr. Szot also worked with the freshmen drawing class. An additional, used Delta Rockwell machine lathe was purchased from Keene High School last spring. It is an outstanding addition to the eleventh grade metals program. Three students from the twelfth grade electricity class and one student from the tenth grade woodworking class attended the Vocational Opportunities Exposition held in Boston, January 8, 1972. All classes on the High School and Junior High School level are progressing well, and we should have an outstanding year.

This year the band has performed in the Keene Firemen's Muster and for the Halloween and Freshmen Orientation parades. It played for the Open House Dedication of the new Elementary School. Two concerts were given at the elementary school for the students, one in October and the other before the Christmas Concert. Assembly performances included the pep-rally before the basketball season and the flag presentation by the V. F. W. to the School. The chorus presented a concert at the Community Center in December for the Winchester Senior Citizens' Club. It combined with the band for the Christmas Concert and for the Elementary School assembly.

Four members of the chorus tried out for All-State Chorus. Janice Hull, a junior, was selected for this chorus. In January, a stage band was organized to perform music arranged for school groups of this nature. The stage band meets on Thursday nights for rehearsal. The high school band has been having one additional rehearsal per week on Monday nights.

Group guidance classes are being offered to the 7th graders. Some of the topics that have been covered thus far are: orientation to junior high schedules, rules, and activities; discussion of personality and attitude; and other matters relative to a more thorough understanding of themselves as individuals and as part of society. Much of the time from September to December has been spent in counseling seniors for both educational and vocational placement after graduation. Approximately 50% of the guidance office's time is spent in individual counseling which encompasses personal, educational, and vocational areas. Students in grades 7 - 12 may avail themselves of this service. The testing program includes the following:

Administration of 8th grade testing to 40 students (Otis Lennon Mental Ability Test and Stanford Achievement Test.)

Sophomore Testing Program (School & College Ability Test, Cooperative English Tests, and Stanford Math Test) to 42 students.

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Test Battery to 24 Seniors.

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test and National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test to 9 juniors.

Scholastic Aptitude Tests to 10 seniors and 1 junior.

National Educational Development Test to 30 in grade 9 and 5 in grade 10.

FINANCES

The problem of financing our schools can be approached from many points of view. With the tight squeeze on the public's financial resources, the question of where school costs can be cut takes on added importance. Adoption of the year-round school, campus style secondary school programs, "schools without walls," postponement of construction, system construction procedures, and increased use of school aides in appropriate areas might slow rising costs somewhat, but even when all the potential has been realized from these kinds of savings, the costs of schooling will continue to rise. Inflation has not yet been controlled. Personnel costs continue to increase, although not as rapidly.

The only effective way to cut the costs of instruction is to cut the number of people involved in it, increase average class sizes, or eliminate programs. The other alternative is to increase the supply of money to pay for schools, not a pleasant prospect either. To demand more of our already over-burdened property tax payers does not seem reasonable. However, additional state support would not be unreasonable in view of the fact that New Hampshire is last among the states in the amount that it contributes towards the support of education. Therefore, increased state support of schools must be considered as one acceptable solution of the problem.

Support for our public system of education depends upon the confidence the taxpayer in the system. Recognizing that this confidence is fostered by demonstrating the effectiveness of the dollar expenditures, our schools will strive to bring about the results commensurate with dollar costs per student.
