To the inhabitants of the Town of Windsor in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Windsor on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, 1988, the Town Meeting to open at 6:30 P.M. Polls open to 8:30 P.M. to act upon the following subjects.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To see if the Town will vote to accept RSA 80:87, the tax lien process.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations of the same.

4. To hear reports of Auditors and Agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,500.00 for highways and bridges.

6. To see if the Town will vote to accept and use Highway Block Grants and other monies that may be forthcoming to the Town for Highway purposes.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,500.00 for Police and Fire expenses.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$750.00 for repairs and upkeep of the Town House.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$110.00 for Street Lighting.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for the upkeep of the Town Cemeteries.

11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 to donate to the Hillsboro Rescue Squad.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,500.00 to be paid to the Town of Hillsboro for the use of the septage treatment plant and the public sanitary receiving station in Hillsboro, N. H.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for the annual membership fee in the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and Planning Board expenses.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for legal expenses.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 to support the Fuller Library in Hillsboro, N. H.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund established in 1985.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 for evaluating the Town.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 to be added to the Town Hall Capital Reserve Fund.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 to be paid to St. Joseph Community Services, Inc.

21. To see if the Town will vote to purchase liability insurance for the Town and to raise and appropriate monies for the same.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN & FOREST RANGER REPORT

Between July 1986 and June 1987, we experienced fewer fires than normal. The three leading causes of forest fires were again children, fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden and debris burning. All causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest tax law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden, or Concord Forest Protection Headquarters at (603) 271-2217.

If you own forest land, you became responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.

MINUTES OF SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

March 10, 1987

The meeting was called to order at 6:33 by Moderator William McNamee.

Article 1 was postponed to the end of the meeting.

Article 2. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and truant officer, and fix compensation of any other officers or agents of the District. Ronnie Houghton moved and Polly Wilton seconded to raise the salaries of the School Board by \$100.00 each. This motion was passed unanimously, with thanks offered by the delighted members of the School Board.

Article 3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant. Pat Hines moved and Ronnie Houghton seconded to accept this article as read. It was unanimously voted.

Article 4. To choose agents and/or committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant. Linda McNamee moved and Pat Hines seconded that the article be accepted as read. All were in favor.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District. Ronnie Houghton moved and Pat Hines seconded that we vote to raise and appropriae \$36,964.00 (reflecting the \$300.00 increase for School Board salaries). All were in favor. Article 6. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to apply for, accept and expend, without further action of the School District meeting, money from any source which becomes available during the fiscal year upon the following conditions:

A. The money must be used for legal purposes for which the School District can appropriate money.

B. The School Board must hold a public hearing in connection with any proposed expenditure of funds.

C. It shall not require the expenditure of additional School District funds.

Millie Houghton moved and Ronnie Houghton seconded that this article be approved as read. All were in favor.

Article 7. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Gary Kofinas reported to the town that School Administrative Unit #24 is presently Hillsboro, Washington, Henniker, Hopkinton, Deering and Stoddard. The State of New Hampshire decided to split the S.A.U. and create a new S.A.U., #34, which will be Hillsboro, Washington, Deering and Windsor. Although the Windsor School Board was NOT in favor of this split, the Board has worked hard to help establish the new S.A.U. and is able to look at the positive side of the split. A new Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Milton Chodack, was hired. A new office, housed over the Bank of New Hampshire, was rented. A new computer system is being purchased. The advantage to Windsor is that now it has more of a "voice" in school affairs. The cost to the town of Windsor will be approximately \$2,500.00 more. Billie McGuire thanked Don Jones, Assistant Superintendent of Schools for S.A.U. #24, for his help in the transition. Pat Hines moved and Joe Sweeney seconded that Article 7 be accepted. All were in favor.
