## TOWN WARRANT

-----

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bedford in the County of Hillsborough, in said state, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To bring forward your ballots for the necessary Town officers for the ensuing year and the ensuing three years.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for same.

Article 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor, and assistance to the aged.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500 for the maintenance of highways and bridges and for any other necessary expenses of the Town.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes up to the sum of \$15,000 if needed.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the Town Library.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15.00 for the care of the clock on the Church.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$225.00 for the care of the New Cemetery and pumping water for same; \$50.00 for the care of Joppa Cemetery; \$10.00 for the care of the Old Cemetery on the Back River Road; and \$7.00 for the care of the Beals Cemetery.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$803.12 for the construction of Class V. Highways, the State to contribute \$3,212.49.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for the tarring of Class V. roads, under the direction of the Selectmen.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$100.00, in trust, from Mrs. William E. Felch, the interest from which to be expended for the care of Lot No. 196, in the New Cemetery.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$100.00, in trust, from Mrs. James Dunnington, the interest from which to be expended for the care of Lot No. 185 in the New Cemetery.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$100.00, in trust, from Helen and Gillis French, the interest from which to be expended for the care of Lots No. 205, and No. 206 in the New Cemetery.

Article 14. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and of other officers heretofore chosen, and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal, this twenty-third day of February in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and forty two.
