

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Canaan in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Canaan on Tuesday, the Nninth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of tax revenues.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey by quitclaim deed all property acquired by tax deed, or to take any other action thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to continue the present policy of joint cooperation with the State of New Hampshire in the construction of bridges and to hire the the necessary funds to provide the Town's share in any construction authorized and undertaken in the year ensuing.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for town bridge construction or to take any other action thereto.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to receive partial payments from any person, firm or corporation owning taxable property and before tax bills of the amount of taxes assessed against said property for the year has been received. Such sums shall be divisable by ten but not less than ten dollars, and the Tax Collector shall receive such payments and give a receipt therefor and credit the amount toward the amount of taxes eventually assessed against said property.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts, and/or Federal or State Aid in the name of the Town of Canaan.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$400.00 for the Lebanon Regional Airport, as requested by them, or take any other action.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote that for the annual town meeting to be held in 1972 that the polls will be opened at ten o'clock in the forenoon to cast votes for the election of town officers and to act on all other articles in the warrant beginning at seven o'clock in the evening (the polls will be opened at ten o'clock and will close after the consideration of the other articles.)
- 11. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the town will establish a town Conservation Commission as set forth in R.S.A. 36-a and that the Selectmen appoint said Commission within 30 days from the date of the annual meeting and that a temporary chairman be appointed to call the first meeting of the Commission.
- 12. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its dis-

cretion new subdivisions and plants thereof showing streets, or the widening thereof, or parks, and upon adoption of this article, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Registry of Deeds of the County of Grafton a certificate or notice showing that the said Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of authorization, as provided in Section 19, and Sections 19-29 inclusive, Chapter 36 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. If this article is adopted, it shall further be the duty of the Town Clerk to issue all certificates of failure when the Planning Board shall fail to take action as provided in Chapter 36: Sections 19 and 19-29 inclusive, as amended.

- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars, and authorize the Selectmen to make application for and receive in the name of the Town gifts, advances, grants-in-aid or other funds from the United States, the State of New Hampshire and the Governor's Commission On Crime And Delinquency, in order to create and establish a full time police department and equip the same; said sum of Two Thousand Dollars shall not be expended by the Selectmen unless funds are obtained from the Governor's Commission On Crime And Delinquency for that purpose.
- 14. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to have the Chief of Police on a full time basis with a salary not to exceed \$5,200.00 a year to start.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the action taken at a previous town meeting that permanent police officers shall be elected by ballot; and commencing with the 1972 annual meeting and thereafter special police officers and the chief of police shall be appointed by the

Selectmen in accordance with provisions of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated Chapter 105.

16. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or any other officers heretofor chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

During this past year, the public has shown a great deal of cooperation in the prevention of fires. We wish to express our thanks for a job well done.

Your forest fire warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the state laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires, a synopsis of these laws follows.

Fire Permits

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning (such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M.).

An air Pollution regulation forbids the burning of household waste in towns where such rubbish is collected by the town.

Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed under normal conditions with permission of the District Fire Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On anothers' property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

The elevation of William Gee to the Board of Selectmen necessitated the resignation of Walter King. A few other resignations and appointments occurred and resulted in our present membership as listed below.

Our major concern for the first six months was the sewerage problem. We consulted various engineering firms and state offices. Although the Planning Board still considers this an urgent problem we feel that more time is needed to study it thoroughly and to take action when economic conditions are now stable.

The Planning Board requested the N. H. Department of Resources and Economic Development to update and redraft a town-wide base map with insets of Canaan Village and Canaan Street. We are reviewing and editing these maps at the present time and will use them as our basic planning tool. The Planning Board expended \$132.30 for reproduction costs as the Town's share of preparing these maps:

SUMMARY OF SERVICES FOR TOWN REPORT Mascoma Area Health Council

January 1, through December 31, 1970

The Mascoma Area Health Council, a non-profit visiting nurse association, covering the town of Grafton, Orange, Canaan and Enfield is now in its second year of operation. Ellen Williams, R.N., the pioneer of our organization, resigned in November to spend more time with her family. Gertrude Clark, R.N. who has been with us almost since the beginning is now taking Ellen's place. During the Summer the Council was fortunate to have Thelma (Webster) Smith's professional services while Ellen was on leave. Mrs. Smith left in the Fall to take a full time position and Carolyn Shattuck, R.N. of Hanover was hired. The two nurses, Trudy and Cory work 40 hours a week from 8 A.M. to 4 P.M. having the central office in the M.V.R.H.S. with their own private phone (632-7234). By sharing the work load these two part-time nurses give the towns the equivalent of one full time nurse. One nurse is funded by the towns and the other through a State Grant.

During the past year the nurses made approximately 1374 visits to patients in our surrounding towns. These visits include the new mother, well child or infant, mentally disturbed patient, cancer patient, handicapped patient, diabetic patient and many health promotion visits. During the Spring a series of immunization clinics was held in Enfield and in the Fall in Canaan for all the pre-school children of the towns covered. The Council is now planning a vision and hearing clinic for pre-school children (4-6) in the Spring and also more immunization clinics.

The nurses are involved in many things as well as visiting patients. They are willing to do as much as they are professionally able to help our small community and its citizens.

As you requested, we are auditing the Trust Funds of the town. It has been our aim to have our audit completed before your Town Report was printed so that it could be included in the Report. We find that the audit is taking longer than we had anticipated and we regret that we are not in a position to issue our report in time for printing.

Our examination has been hindered by a lack of conventional accounting methods for the Funds since their inception which has made it extremely difficult for us to determine without extensive tests what investments should be in the Trust Funds and to determine the proper designation of the Funds as principal or unexpended income.

It is our intention to have our report available before Town Meeting.
