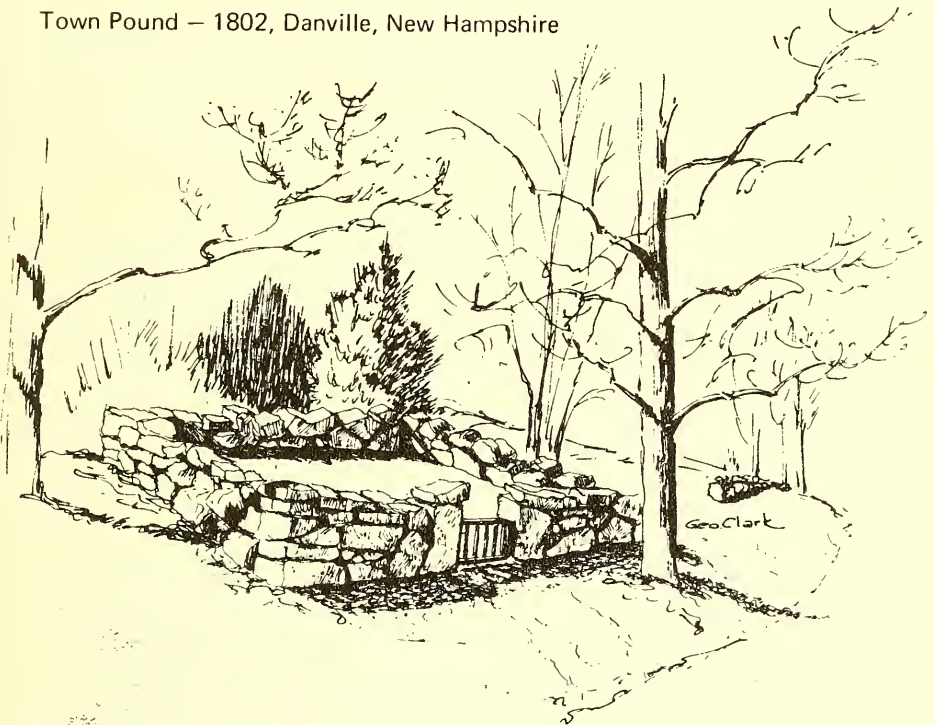

## TOWN MEETING MARCH 5, 1974

Due to a vacancy in the office of Moderator, the meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Town Clerk Rosemary Caldwell, who read the warrant and called for nominations for Moderator Pro-Tem. Mr. Roland Marmen was elected by voice vote. After Selectman John Carr read a petition concerning the zoning amendments into the record, a motion carried to postpone consideration of Articles 2-15 and 24 until the Business Meeting on March 8, 8:00 p.m. at the Danville Elementary School. Mr. Marmen then declared the polls open for voting on Articles 1 and 16-23.

Article 1. Voted to choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. Voted to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. The budget was accepted as written, with the exception of the special Recreation articles being changed from \$1,250.00 to \$1,150.00.

Article 3. Voted to spend the interest of the Parsonage Fund for preaching for the ensuing year.

Article 4. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

Article 5. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Title property, provided said property be sold by public auction.

Article 6. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to convey to Public Service Company of New Hampshire an easement of 280 feet wide across land or lands owned by the Town.

Article 7. Voted to raise and appropriate \$957.00 for nursing services supplied by the Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association, Inc. for the period March 8, 1974 to March 7, 1975.

Article 8. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to apply and contract for and to accept aid relative to natural disasters from the Federal Disaster Assistance Administration in Washington.

Article 9. Voted to amend the Salary Committee report accepted at the March 6, 1973 Town Meeting as follows: "TOWN CLERK: \$125.00 Annual Salary plus all fees as set by statute."

Article 10. Voted to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for grading and other related work at Kenneth R. Day Memorial Field.



Article 11. Voted to raise and appropriate \$400.00 to help support the Danville Little League teams.

Article 12. Voted to accept and maintain four specified groups of law enforcement equipment previously owned by L. E. A. D.

Article 13. Voted to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 as a partial cost for reappraisal of property and preliminary tax mapping by the N. H. Department of Revenue Administration, with the remainder of the cost to be appropriated in 1975.

Article 14. Voted to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund for use as set-offs against budgeted appropriations for the following priority purposes, not to exceed a total amount of \$4,000.00: Fire, Police and Highway.

Article 15. Voted to establish a Sanitary Land Fill Committee of three members appointed by the Selectmen to investigate the possibility of establishing a sanitary land fill area in the Town and/or to investigate alternate methods of disposing of solid waste for the purpose of conforming with N. H. regulations.

Article 16. Voted against the proposed amendment to Article II, Section B of the Danville Zoning Ordinances, pertaining to the excavation of earth and other materials.

Article 17. Voted to amend Article V, Section A.4 of the Danville Zoning Ordinances, pertaining to the requirements for foundations for mobile homes.

Article 18. Voted to amend Article V, Section A.5 of the Danville Zoning Ordinances, pertaining to permits for mobile homes.

Article 19. Voted against the proposed amendment to Article XV, Section 2 of the Danville Zoning Ordinances, pertaining to the change in lot size for camps and summer dwellings.

Article 20. Voted to amend Article XV, Section 4 of the Danville Zoning Ordinances, pertaining to the conversion of summer dwellings to permanent dwellings.

Article 21. Voted to amend Article XVI, Section B of the Danville Zoning Ordinances, pertaining to the grade for drainage from the building.

Article 22. Voted to amend Article XVI, Section F of the Danville Zoning Ordinances pertaining to the acres set aside for recreation for multiple-unit dwelling complexes.

Article 23. Voted against the proposed new Article XVII of the Danville Zoning Ordinances, pertaining to percolation tests.

Article 24. Voted to accept a grandfather's clock, the gift of Mrs. Edna Hicks, and to express the Town's appreciation for the gift. Voted against considering a motion on the oil refinery question. Voted approval of a resolution expressing gratitude to all who united to keep the Timberlane District Schools in operation. Discussed the vote on Zoning Amendments and read into the record a petition on the same. Expressed thanks to Mr. David Morse for his excellent job as Moderator.

On March 5, the polls closed at approximately 6:45 p. m. , with the results of the voting announced by the Moderator Pro-Tem at 9:15 p. m. On March 8, the Business Meeting was called to order at 8:00 p. m. by Moderator David Morse, who opened the Meeting by listing and explaining the rules and procedures by which the Meeting would be governed. The Business Meeting adjourned at approximately 10:15 p. m.

# TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danville in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Danville Town Hall in said Danville on Tuesday, the Fourth (4th) day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much of the Parsonage Fund the Town will vote to spend for preaching for the ensuing year.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Title Property.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, and accept aid relative to natural disasters from the Federal Government from the Federal Disaster Assistance Administration in Washington.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$950.00 to purchase Visiting Nurse Services for the inhabitants of Danville from the Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association, Inc.

8. To see if the Town will vote to sponsor the Bicentennial Commission for the purchase of a Commemorative Plate in the amount of \$1,250.00, and raise and appropriate said amount.

9. To hear the Report of the Salary Committee appointed by the Selectmen in 1975 to review the "Report on Wages, Salary and Fringe Benefit Recommendations for the Town of Danville", as approved in 1973 and amended in 1974 at the annual Town Meetings, and to act upon the same.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budgeted appropriations for the following priority purposes, not to exceed a total amount of \$4,000.00: Fire, Health, Highway and Police.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 as a partial cost for reappraisal of property and preliminary tax mapping by the New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration, and to defer the remainder of the cost until 1976.

12. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Mosquito Control Commission, consisting of three members to be appointed by the Selectmen. (BY PETITION)

13. To hear the Report of the Sanitary Land Fill Committee established by the 1974 Town Meeting, and to act upon the same.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a Contract with the Selectmen of Kingston, New Hampshire for the use of the Kingston Dump, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,882.40 to fund such action.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to enter into a Contract with a Carrier for a weekly pick-up disposal service, and to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$10,000.00 for this purpose.

16. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$8,500.00 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town: Inv. #51, Colby Road, 0+00 to 32+00, 0.61 mile, Surface, and Inv. #67, Back

Road, 0+00 to 4+00, 0.08 mile, Surface; such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Danville.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for fill for the Back Road Project, as projected in Warrant Article 16 preceding, and to authorize the Selectmen to sell Serial Notes for the same.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,000.00 for the purchase of the field of approximately ten acres adjacent to the north side of Town Hall, and to authorize the Selectmen to sell Serial Notes for the same.

19. To see if the Town will vote to accept monies from the New Hampshire Department of Resources and Economic Development, under the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965 as administered by the Federal Bureau of Out-Door Recreation, for use in the purchase and development of the land referenced in Warrant Article 18 preceding, with particular reference to Recreation.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to use the monies derived from the New Hampshire Public Service Company for the easement conveyed across Town lands, as a credit toward expenditures for the current (1975) year.

21. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the amendment to the existing Danville Zoning Ordinances and Land Subdivision Control Regulations, as proposed by the Danville Planning Board, as follows: Article V, Section A, Mobile Homes, pertaining to Hunt Road and Johnson Road, so-called.

22. To see if the Town will vote to add a new article to the existing Danville Zoning Ordinances and Land Subdivision Control Regulations, as proposed by the Danville Planning Board, as follows: Article XVII, Area Zoning.

23. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the amendment to the existing Danville Zoning Ordinances and Land Subdivision Control Regulations, as proposed by the Danville Planning Board, as follows: the amendment of Article III, pertaining to business permits and new businesses.

24. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the amendment to the existing Danville Zoning Ordinances and Land Subdivision Control Regulations, as proposed by the Danville Planning Board, as follows: the amendment of Article XIV, Definitions, Section M, pertaining to electrical wiring codes.

25. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the amendment to the existing Danville Zoning Ordinances and Land Subdivision Control Regulations, as proposed by the Danville Planning Board, as follows: the amendment of Article VIII, Enforcement, Section 3, pertaining to estimated construction costs to be used to determine Building Permit Fees.

26. To transact any other business that may legally come before the Meeting.

# REPORT OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

The job of a policeman in our society is by far one of the most frustrating and distressing, and the least rewarding of any municipal function. Without community cooperation, the job of reducing crime is virtually impossible. Action by private citizens is at the heart of crime prevention in the community and only if members of the public take an active role by providing information, can this be accomplished. This Department extends thanks to all those who assisted in any way during the past year.

We were disappointed to see a decline in attendance of the Law Enforcement Association of Danville (L. E. A. D.) and hope this worthwhile group will again become active.

Monthly police meetings were held in an effort to keep all members of the Department informed and delegate duty for scheduled activities. In reviewing needs of the Department, it was decided to purchase raincoats for the members.

As in previous years, Sunday School duty and duty for youth and other non-profit functions was donated by the officers of our Department.

This Department handled over 1500 calls, of which over 150 were in regard to dogs. A partial breakdown follows:

# REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

## AND DISTRICT CHIEF

All open burning, when the ground is not covered with snow, is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire, then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 a. m. and 5 p. m., unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid-August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties, and a complete woodlands closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Bamstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our state, no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.
