

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$87.00 for the Monadnock Region Association or take any action relating thereto.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to provide supervision at the bathing beach, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate an adequate sum of money for Workmen's Compensation and Public Liability Insurance, or take any action relating thereto.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,317.00 for State Aid construction, to be held for future use on the Forest Road, the State to contribute \$2,334.00, or take any action relating thereto.
- 7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$651.34 for town road aid, the state to contribute \$2,605.37, or take any action relating thereto.
- 8. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 to purchase a blade snow plow, or take any action relating thereto.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to instruct the road agent to repair the road from the end of the black road at the mill to Margaret Perry's, or take any action relating thereto.
- 10. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day and Old Home Week, or take any action relating thereto.

- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry Department, or take any action relating thereto.
- 12. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department, or take any action relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to extend its electric lighting system, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to close the road, subject to gates and bars, from the Dodge place to the Forest road, or take any action relating thereto.
- 15. To see what the town will do in regard to enlarging the cemetery, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Capitol Reserve Fund to be used for enlargement of cemetery, or take any action relating thereto.
- 17. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in re-appraising the taxable property in the town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to extend its water system in order to avoid the chlorination of the present supply, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$650.00 for the use of the Library or take any action relating thereto.
- 21. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any action relating thereto.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of one percent on property taxes paid on or before August 15, 1947, or take any action relating thereto.

- 23. To see if the town will vote to appoint a committee to make plans and recommendations for the construction of a tool house, or take any action relating thereto.
- 24. To see if the town will vote to accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the use of the town, or take any action relating thereto.
- 25. To hear reports of Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and take any action relating thereto.
- 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE ELECTRIC LIGHT COMMITTEE

The total revenue for the year from the electric lighting system was \$6,657.10.

New services were run to the residences of Carrol Dow, H. L. Shafer, Clarence Tenney, Waldemar Stahl (new house), and Reginald Hubbard, also Patricia Holsaert's shop, Elizabeth Sprague's cottage, Joseph Quinn's fruit and vegetable stand and the new Fire House. A short line was run on the property of Richard Hensly and two new meters were added.

We were able to secure the services of an independent contractor to supplement the work of the Public Service Co. of New Hampshire and our wires have been changed over to all the new poles set in 1943-44 except the poles on which there are transformers.

We spent more than \$1,000 in trimming and cutting brush on our lines during the past year and much more should be done. We intend to continue this work as it is apparent that trees coming in contact with wires are the most frequent cause of interruption of service in a rural system such as ours.

The Public Service Co. of New Hampshire is building a main transmission line from Hillsboro to Peterboro which passes through our town. This will give two sources of power to our main line but there will still be a chance of our town being without service as the main line runs through a heavily wooded section and while we intend to keep it well trimmed, there is considerable chance of damage by ice and heavy snow or wind storms. We have been in touch with officials of the Public Service Co. of New Hampshire relative to installing a sub-station on the new line at some point near the village, probably on the Greenfield road. We hope to have some proposition for consideration at the 1948 town meeting.

B. Administrative Problems

In this report no effort is made to give other than statistical information regarding schools prior to July 1, 1946, the date of the change in superintendents. The two major problems facing the school board and superintendent in this Supervisory Union this present school year were, and still are: (1) the procurement of competent teachers to fill vacancies, and (2) the immediate and long term improvement of badly deteriorated school buildings and equipment. Problems of slightly less magnitude but of grave importance that have already received much careful attention and need much further study are: (1) guidance of teachers lacking experience and/or training toward more efficient instructional procedures, (2) the development as a cooperative effort of teachers, superintendent, interested laymen, and school boards of a more wisely planned educational program, (3) the procurement of properly selected instructional material. (4) the improvement of war-time deteriorated pupil transportation facilities, (5) improvement of pupil records and accounting, (6) the development of a less time consuming and more easily understood financial accounting system, and (7) the development of a better informed public opinion regarding local educational problems and conditions. Some of these problems will be discussed under the appropriate sections of this report.

In Part I of this report it was stated that the procurement of competent teachers is one of the major problems of the school administration this year. The vacancy caused by Mrs. Black's resignation last spring was not filled, in spite of continuous effort, until at least a week after schools would have opened in September had opening not been delayed because of polio. It is safe to say that the vacancy would not have been filled as soon as it was if it had not been for the fact that a good boarding place was available at a reasonable price and near the school. If Hancock is fortunate enough to get good teachers during the next few years, it is likely that it will be because the following factors are provided: (1) reasonable salaries—not at a mere cost-of-living level, (2) decent living and employment conditions, (3) liberal sick leave provisions, and (4) suitable instructional materials and equipment.

B. Instructional Materials

At the beginning of the present school year, careful study and discussion by the teachers and superintendent resulted in a decision to inaugurate a plan for modernizing the reading system and related activities. New basal reading books, with correlated workbooks, charts and cards, new arithmetics, new science books, new social studies books, and some new health books have been obtained for the lower and intermediate grades. These new materials have proven very helpful in stimulating pupil interest and further progress should be made next year in bringing the instructional materials up to a higher standard.

The largest item in any school budget is teachers' salaries. The \$4,335.00 for this item in the budget for next year should do much toward making it possible to have good teachers in the elementary school. Because of the expectation that the State can no longer furnish as many cadet teachers for the high school as it has in the past, the items for elementary tuition and for high school tuition have been increased to normal amounts to make it possible for the Hancock Educational Association to continue to operate the local school. It is reasonable to expect there will be twenty pupils in grades 7 and 8 next year and figuring on a reasonable tuition rate of \$75 per pupil \$1,500 will be needed for the item of elementary tuitions. For the estimated 36 in grades 9 to 12 at a tuition rate of \$100 the high school tuition item will amount to \$3,600.

Another item about which there may be some questions is the \$1,250 requested for minor repairs. This estimate is based on the accomplishment of a major part of the following: (1) exterior and interior painting for appearance and preservation of the property, (2) installation of cold air returns to the furnace from the classrooms for more economical and comfortable heating, (3) transfer of the inadequate and unsanitary toilets from the basement to attractive modern facilities on the first floor for better supervision and improved sanitation, and (4) provision of a combination teachers' and nurse's room and toilet on the first floor. Scale drawings are now being prepared for these

proposed toilet changes.

PART V. SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

Sept., 1946 — Jan., 1947

Ola M. Myhaver, R. N.

Since Sept., 1946 all students at the Hancock High School and all but three who were absent at the Hancock Primary School have been examined by the school medical inspector, Dr. Fredricka Mone. Vision tests and hearing tests have been conducted by the school nurse. The latter tests will be checked by the audiometer in the near future.

All students have been weighed and measured. Notices of defects found have been sent to the parents. Home visits

have been made when necessary.

Defective teeth and defective breathing are two of the chief defects.

One dental clinic, sponsored by the local American Red Cross and conducted by Dr. Lawrence, has been held and another is scheduled for March. We hope to have a clinic to see about the defective breathing, soon. This, if necessary, will be sponsored by the local American Red Cross. Special attention was given to the report on chest X-rays from the Tuberculosis Association by the medical inspector. Through the cooperation of the State Board of Health, the Tuberculosis Association and the Board of Education (local and state) skin tests were made and X-rays taken under the direction of Mrs. Aiken, assisted by X-ray technician and the school nurse during the first part of the school year for 1946.

A "hot dish" lunch is served during the winter months, at the elementary school sponsored by the Hancock Women's Club, assisted by the local American Red Cross. About fifty children are planned for daily. There is also a "hot dish" lunch served at the high school building under the direction of Miss Manchester and the junior and senior high school

girls.

The first aid cabinet has been refitted. Accidents re-

quiring first aid have been cared for.

The medical inspection department has complied with the regulations of the State Board of Health in regard to exclusions on account of communicable diseases. We have had some communicable diseases such as chicken pox, pediculosis and skin eruptions.

At the beginning of school, parents were asked to fill out a disease census card for children entering school for the first time. This was recorded on the health card, filed

for each child at the school by the school nurse.

At this time the medical inspection department wishes to thank the Superintendent of Schools and Board of Education, the dentist, principals, teachers, doctors and others for their assistance and to express appreciation to all organizations assisting in the health program.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the eleventh day of March 1947, at one thirty o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
- 9. To see if the district will elect and approve the inclusion of its officers and employees (other than those eligible under the Teachers' Retirement System) in the Employees' Retirement System of the State of New Hampshire, which system is provided for by Chapter 27-A of the Revised Laws, as inserted by Chapter 183 of the Laws of 1945, and as provided by Chapter 201 of the Laws of 1945 and any subsequent amendments thereto.
- 10. If the district votes in the affirmative on the preceding article, to see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.) for the purpose of providing funds for the district's contribution to said retirement system for the coming year.



To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred twelve and fifty one-hundredths dollars (\$512.50) so that the School Board may increase by two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) the compensation of each teacher in proportion to her time employed during the school year beginning July 1, 1946 and ending June 30, 1947.


