

## Town Warrant

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jackson in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vole in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Jackson on Tuesday the 12th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. Maintenance of summer highways and bridges.

4. Snow removal from highways, salting and sanding highways.

5. Streetlights.

6. Old Age Assistance and Poor Relief.

7. Maintenance of Cemeteries.

8. Memorial Day Exercises.

9. Town Library.

10. Fire Protection.

11. Police Protection.

12. Memorial Hospital.

13. Jackson Resort Association and White Mountain Region Association.

14. Social Security.

15. Civilian Defense.

16. Town Dump.

17. Skating Rink.

18. Swimming Program.

19. Sidewalk resurfacing.

20. The sum of \$273.71 for T.R.A. State will contribute \$1,821.38.

21. The sum of \$1,000.00 for State Bridge Aid for reconstruction of Gill Bridge to be added to appropriation of 1962. This 1963 allotment to be used to raise the bridge level to approximate level of Carter Notch Road.

22. The sum of \$1,000.00 for State Aid Reconstruction for Five Mile Drive.

23. The sum of \$1,200.00 for retarring Class Five roads.

24. A sum of money for new highway equipment.

25. The sum of \$500.00 for assessing of property by State Assessor.

26. The sum of \$200.00 for interest on borrowing in anticipation of taxes.

27. To authorize selectmen to borrow in anticipation of taxes.

28. The sum of \$2,791.68 to rehabilitate the Town Treasury.

29. A sum of money to be used for an addition on town garage.

30. To see if the Town will vote to accept Red Barn Road and Ridge Road to become a town road Class V, the same being inspected and approved by the selectmen for acceptance.

31. To see if the town will vote to accept road leading from 16A known as Dinsmore Road approximately 3/10 mile to small garage northwest of Robinwood Inn the same being transferred to the Town of Jackson and becoming a recorded road on Town and County records, the same if ever being discontinued will revert back to present land owners or heirs or future owners. Petition Warren Doerfler and others.

32. We the undersigned wish to file a petition to have the road known as Old Jackson Road along which five homes are built accepted as a town road by the Town of Jackson. They have recently graded and tarred this road and it is in good condition. Petition by J. Arthur Doucette and others. 33. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following roads:

a. Road from Route 16 to the home of Mr. and Mrs. William Magoon.

b. Road from Route 16 toward the home of Lawrence Flint the point of termination being clarified at this meeting.

Also both roads, if so voted to become town roads, must have at least 32 foot right of way deeded to Town of Jackson so as not to encumber Town with property damage due to winter plowing, all rights being recorded on Town and County records.

34. To see if the Town will vote to accept the land directly behind Jackson Town Garage offered by J. Holland Beal as a gift.

35. The sum of \$600.00 for Eastern Slope Airport maintenance.

36. To impose summons of \$.20 on poll taxes uncollected after October 15, 1963.

37. That if when greyhound racing for public exhibition, at which pari mutual pools are to be sold, is legalized by the New Hampshire General Court, to see what action the Town of Jackson will take relative to approving and authorizing the location, construction and operation of a greyhound race track for holding racing meetings in said Town of Bethlehem,  $N_{\bullet}H_{\bullet}$ 

33. To authorize selectmen to distribute inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.

To act on any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

### Librarian's Report

The JACKSON PUBLIC LIBRARY open for two hours, 2 to 4 P.M. on Thursdays circulated some 2260 books and magazines during the year. From late June to early September the Library operated on a summer schedule - 2-4 P.M. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

We found books and answered questions for people of all ages and backgrounds, including school children from primary grades thru High School. The Jackson grade school classes attended in a body every week.

The Extension Division of the State Library continues to send us the Bookmobile 6 times a year, roughly every 2 months, with fiction, non-fiction, and children's books.

The Library has benefited in recent years by closer cooperation with the State Library's increased services. Neighborhood, trustees' and librarian's meetings have been especially helpful. Exhibitions of new books have helped us in buying.

Our circulating magazines include: Atlantic, Field and Stream, Good Housekeeping, Holiday, Jack and Jill, Ladies Home Journal, Life, McCalls, Redbook, Readers' Digest and Saturday Evening Post.

We thank Mrs. J. Arthur Doucette for magazines and books, Bertha M. Rogers for Readers' Digest Condensed Books and the Mursells for the good and popular Detective Club triple volumes.

The Library is being used more than formerly, and we hope to maintain, or even improve the services in the future. Those who now use the Library appreciate it. We hope others will learn to use it. 185 books have been added in the past year through purchase and gifts.

#### REPORT OF EASTERN SLOPE AIRPORT AUTHORITY

The year 1962 has seen further progress at Eastern Slope Regional Airport, but only through the generous donations of time and effort of interested persons, institutions and municipalities. Only the eight towns of Bartlett, Bridgton, Brownfield, Fryeburg, Jackson, Lovell, Stow and Sweden contributed to operation expense, and without private donations the condition of the Authority would have been very poor.

An administration building has been erected at an expense exceeding \$7,500.00, half of which was paid by the State and the other half of which was obtained by donations and borrowing.

A modern gasoline installation has been made with both 80 and 100 octane gas.

A start has been made on industrial promotion, in cooperation with the Fryeburg Chamber of Commerce. Although details may not yet be made public, the Maine Department of Economic Development is even now working on a prospective industry for location at or near the airport.

It has for some months been evident to yourdirectors that no operator could be obtained for the airport unless hangar and workshop facilities were erected. A grant in December 1962 from the County of Oxford will make this possible by the summer of 1963.

Traffic has increased at the airport markedly as word gets about that it is lighted and plowed year 'round. Over 600 aircraft landed at the airport in 1962. The directors feel that the airport is on the verge of proving itself a success for the area, if support will be continued for a few more years.

### Report of Forest Fire Wardens

Preventing Forest Fires is Our Responsibility

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In The same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.

2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.

3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry, windy weather and preferrably burning late in the day.

4. Have something to keep the fire under control - pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.

5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.

6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to install in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.
