# TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Landaff, in the county of Grafton and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Landaff on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects :

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations of the same.

Art. 3. To see if the town will accept State Aid for highways, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

Art. 4. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

Art. 5. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote a discount on such part of taxes as are paid on or before July 15, 1939.

Art. 7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$31.00 for the aid of the White Mountains Regions Association.

Art. 8. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the purchase of fire-fighting tools.

Art. 9. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of white pine blister rust.

Art. 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD AND CITIZENS OF LANDAFF:

The total enrollment of your schools last year was 63, compared to a total of 54 the previous year. The average membership was 55.37 and the percent of attendance 93.22. There were 14 pupils attending Lisbon High school and one pupil attending the Swiftwater school.

This year your total enrollment is 52, distributed as follows: Blue school 19, Ireland 14, and Scotland 19. There are 9 pupils attending Lisbon High school.

Your teaching staff this year is an entirely new one. Miss Bernice Ruddy of Concord is teaching at the Scotland school, Miss Florence Callahan of Manchester at Ireland, and Miss Patricia Mack of Derry at the Blue school. All of these teachers graduated from the three-year elementary curriculum of Plymouth Normal school last June.

When the Scotland school was reopened seven years ago, the school was so small that a partition was put across the school room. This made a room large enough to seat about 12 or 15 pupils comfortably. Since we had an expected enrollment last fall of at least 23 pupils, it was necessary to take out the partition and have one large room for the school. When this was done, the room was painted and papered and the ceiling patched and whitened. This has made a much more attractive room and also a more satisfactory one for school activities. It, however, presented a heating problem which was solved by moving the jacketed heater from the Center school.

The amount recommended by your school board to finance next year's budget has been reduced to \$2,400—\$300 less than the appropriation for this year.
