#### TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon, in the County of Sullivan and State of New Hampshire:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles.

- Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- Art. 2. To see if the Town will appropriate and authorize the selectmen to use the income, estimated to be \$4,068.75 from
  - a. Savings Bank Tax
  - b. Interest and Dividends Tax
  - c. Yield (Timber) Tax
  - d. Reimbursements on Account of Growing Wood and Timber
  - e. Dog Licenses
  - f. Motor Vehicle Permit Fees
  - g. Interest
  - h. Rent of Town Hall
  - i. Miscellaneous
  - j. Reimbursements, Bounties and fighting forest fires

To defray Town Charges, estimated to be \$5,522.26 Town charges to include, but not being limited to:

- a. Town Officers Salaries
- b. Town Officers Expenses
- c. Election and Registration Expenses
- e. Expenses of Town Hall and other Town Buildings
- d. Printing Town Reports
- f. Police
- g. Bounties
- h. Damage by dogs
- i. Insurance
- j. Vital Statistics
- k. Old Age Assistance
- 1. Town Poor
- m. Aid to Disabled
- n. Interest
- o. Cemeteries

- Art. 3 To see what sum of money, in addition to the sum appropriated under article 2 of this Warrant, the Town will raise and appropriate to defray said Town charges.
- Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate, to be used together with and in addition to the Class V Maintenance Allotment, for the summer maintenance of highways and bridges.
- Art. 5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the winter maintenance of highways and bridges.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$353.93 and apply for Class V Assistance T. R. A. so called, the State to furnish \$2,359.54.
- Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$345.00 for the purchase of a sander.
- Art. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the support of the fire department, and for the purchase of fire fighting equipment, and authorize the Selectmen to pay over said sum to the fire Department.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to reduce the principal amount of the note incurred for the purchase of the fire truck.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the Town Library.
- Art. 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the privilege of the use for one year of the Alstead Public Dump.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the control of white pine blister rust.

- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept a gift of money from the Langdon Community Club and appropriate said gift to pay for part of the cost of painting the exterior of the Town Hall.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will authorize the imposition of a fine of 50 cents per month for the delinquent payment of dog licenses.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate, together with the unexpended balance of '54 approp. in the hands of the Trustees of Trust Funds, for the repair and painting of South Cemetery fence.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept all Trust Funds of \$100.00 or more each, received for the perpetual care of Cemetery lots.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collectors Deed.

#### REPORT OF THE LANGDON FIRE DEPARTMENT 1954

The main thing I have to report in regard to the Fire Department in 1954 is that I wish we had more men who would turn out for fire drills.

In 1954 we had three chimney fires, 2 grass fires, one car fire, one serious farm loss, one maintenance drill, and 14 regular drills at 13 locations. At these drills certain men were outstanding in their regular attendance. Fred Hatch leads the list followed closely by Ben Porter. Bill Kemp, Royal Holmes, Dick Miller of Drewsville. Al Challoux and Joe Johnson.

The Kempton fire was a serious loss. At two fire drills held there previously, it was thought to have been established beyond doubt that our small forest fire pump was the only pump possible to use at that water supply. The pump proved wholly inadequate; and at the risk of wrecking the equipment the jeep truck was set in. If more trained personnel had been available to make the hose shift faster, 10 minutes, or a decisive period might have been gained. But the fury and speed with which this fire spread, it might not have been enough to do any good. Following this fire, the Selectmen bought us a Pacific Marine Pump with an air cooled Wisconsin engine. This is a mighty good investment for the Town.

I wish to point out that your firemen serve without charge, even at fires, and that we heartily wish there were a few more men who would be willing to drill with them. These men are mixed up in other activities, as is the nature of busy men; and it is quite possible that a fire might strike when some of them are out of Town. Constant practice is the only way that efficient service can be made reasonably certain when a fire occurs in a rural community. Too many things can go wrong with an undrilled outfit, or any outfit for that matter. A once-over is not enough. Each water supply should be visited and actually used to smooth out the procedure, To look at it means very little.

The Keene Mutual Aid set-up is now a going concern. Alstead and Walpole now belong to this group.

We take pride in reporting that 3 new water holes have been added this year and another one improved. One that we had not known about was brought to our attention. This sort of installation is a splendid insurance. Improvement of approaches to water holes is an important detail of this business. Two or three loads of gravel might save a building.

#### FOREST FIRE REPORT

Another year has gone by with only a very small item for Forest Fire expense. There were two small grass fires; but neither was chargeable to public funds. The only expense was for routine training and twenty dollars for shovels and lights. It was, of course, not a dangerous fire year; but even so, such a record could not be achieved without nearly 100% public support. In this connecction it cannot be too strongly emphasized that permits for any sort of outdoor fire must be obtained from the Fire Warden. except when the ground is covered with snow. This does not release the landowner from responsibility if the fire gets away; but it does give the warden an idea of the situation when a smoke is reported; and a chance to protect the landowner from expense if the conditions are dangerous.

Three of your local forest fire force are District Special Deputies. This is a good record for a small town, there being only

12 Special Deputies in the District.

At the risk of saying the same thing too many times, I wish to point out in no uncertain terms that a large fire, like one that could occur on Fall Mountain in a dry year, is a staggering expense. It could raise taxes a lot and involve expenditures in the thousands of dollars. The Success, Ossipee, and Grantham fires were in the \$100,000 class. The tax payer's vigilance and cooperation has gone a long way toward preventing this sort of thing in our town; but we cannot afford to relax. Accidents, like lightening strikes, can always happen.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Langdon, I herewith submit my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

Mrs. Margaret Finley was hired to replace Mr. Francis Usher who is now teaching in Putney, Vermont. Mrs. Finley, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, had one year of teaching experience. It was necessary to find a replacement for Mr. Finley as of January 3rd. Miss Mildred Stearns of Charlestown, who has had many years of teaching experience, was employed to complete the year.

Due to the enrollment, it was necessary to transfer some of the third grade into the intermediate room thus giving this teacher four grades with twenty-eight pupils. There are twenty-nine pupils in the primary room. The predicted enrollment for 1955-56 indicates that it will still be necessary to split the third grade again and each teacher will have approximately thirty pupils.

Miss Florence MacIver, school nurse, carries on a health program and she not only informs parents of the need for medical and mental treatment, but also prevents the spread of communicable diseases by isolating and promptly reporting those pupils who may be exposed.

Miss Duncan is again acting as principal and teaching very effectively. I wish to express my appreciation to Mrs. Pauline Durling and Mrs. Leon Newton for substituting when teachers have been absent due to illness. Their willingness to honor a request on short notice is most appreciated by the school board and pupils.

The increase in the budget is due to salary increases and tuition costs.

I wish to express my appreciation to the school board members for their cooperation and guidance, and to the citizens for their support of education.

The possibility of financial assistance in the form of general aid, flat grant, building aid and transportation costs from the state level would do much to relieve the real estate tax burden in Langdon.

### SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

In 1833 a law was passed in France requiring school committees of towns and cities to keep school houses clean. From this very simple but necessary beginning, stem our present day school health services.

What are school health services?

School health services are procedures established: (a) to appraise the health status of pupils; (b) to advise pupils, parents and others of the appraisal findings; (c) to encourage correction of remediable defects; (d) to assist in the identification and education of handicapped children; (e) to help prevent and control disease; (f) to provide necessary emergency service for injury or sudden illness.

Our modern school deals with the physical, mental, emotional and social development of each pupil. Gone is the day when the school was primarily concerned with the facts a child memorized. The desire now is health, happiness and foundation for a useful life.

Certain health services help parents and school personnel to become acquainted with the health problems of children, and provide a means of helping children obtain solutions for their problems. For example, vision and hearing tests assist in determining the degree to which a child may benefit from his school experiences. As child health is improved, other aspects of school endeavor are more successful. To learn effectively, children need good health.
