### TOWN WARRANT STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lempster, in the County of Sullivan, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall, said Lempster, on Tuesday, the 2nd day of March at ten o'clock, in the forenoon, to open the polls for voting for candidates, and at one o'clock in the afternoon for the discussion of the Articles of the Warrant.

- Art 1. To choose All necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing, and to vote on the following question, "Shall the provision of Chapter 171A of the revised Laws relative to playing Beano be adopted in the Town?"
- Art. 2. To receive all reports and act thereon.
- Art 3. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purpose for the ensuing year.

- Art. 4 To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 5 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for the Capital Highway Reserve Fund.
- Art 6. To see what action the Town will vote to continue the Town Forest Committee and to take any necessary action thereto.
- Art. 7. To see if the Town will accept \$200.00 as bequeathed in the will of the late E. Lee Kelso for the perpetual care of the John Cumberland Cemetery Lot.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$825.62 for the T.R.A.; the State will contribute \$5,504.11.

- Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to transfer \$40,000.00 from Town Forest Committee Funds, now being carried as a liability against the Town of Lempster to a Trust Fund. Said Trust Fund to be deposited into a bank as other trusts are, and the interest each year, of said Trust Fund to be turned over to the Town to help defray expenses. The balance to remain in the Town Treasurery, as it has in the past.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$500.00 for the bicentennial committee.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the Fire Department's annual expenses.
- Art 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to purchase Insurance for the Town and raise \$3,500.00 to cover expense thereof.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,200.00 for the Town's share of Social Security for its employees.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$534.48 for the Newport Area Home Health Agency.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$77.00 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town together with the other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association.
- Art. 16; To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to allow 3% discount of taxes, if paid on or before September 1st, based on 80% of last year's taxes and 2% discount on taxes if paid on or before October 1st using the same basis.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will raise \$796.00 to help maintain the Newport Ambulance Service and assure the Town of Ambulance Service.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will appropriate \$1,270.60 for the third payment on the Loader and Backhoe.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will appropriate \$175.00 for Dog catching.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to continue membership of the Regional Planning Commission, now organized and named the Upper Valley Lake Sunapee Council, and to appropriate the sum of \$274.00 as the Town's share of the annual operating expenses of the Regional Planning Commission to be used in conjunction with other State and Federal Funds available for planning purposes.
- Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to seal blacktops.
- Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$1,000.00 to reduce the Town deficit.

- Art. 23. To see if the Town will accept Nutmeg Lane on Long Pond as town road and maintain thereon.
- Art. 24. To see if the Townwill appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the Planning Board.
- Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to exclude from the plan service in any class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remumeration paid for each services is less than \$50.00.
- Art. 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$176.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- Art. 27. To see if the Town will raise \$10,600.00 for a new truck.
- Art. 28. To see if the Town will vote to use the sum of \$3,500.00 from the Capital Highway Reserve Fund for a down payment on the new truck.
- Art. 29. To see if the Town will vote to hold Annual Town Meetings at nights for discussion of the articles in the Warrant.
- Art. 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise an adequate sum for interest on notes.
- Art. 31. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# Statutory Changes Affecting Publication of Annual Reports of Trustees:

the care of cemeteries and burial lots have been amended by enactment of Chapter 78, Section I, of the Laws of the 1975 Legislature Revenue Administration of N.H. the detailed reports of trust funds required by the Commissioner of Revenue Administration. In The statutory requirements pertaining to the publication of the annual report of trustees of trust funds with respect to trusts created for Accordingly, in connection with the publication of the Annual Town Report for 1975 and subsequent fiscal years, the trustees "shall not print in such report, the reports of trusts created for the care of cemeteries and burial lots except that in the year in which the town accepts the gifts, legacies and devises for such purposes, the trustees and auditor shall print the names of the donors and the value of such gifts, legacies and devises at the time of the donation." It should be clearly understood, however, that Trustees of Trust Funds are still obligated to file with the appropriate agencies, namely the Attorney General of N.H. and Municipal Services Division, Dept. of addition, the trustees must publish in detail, a report of all other trusts and capital reserve funds in their custody

Mrs. Arline Tatro who was appointed to the Bicentennial commit tee at the town meeting of 1975 resigned because of health reasons. Rachel Tirrell and Laura Strout were named Co-Chairmen of Youth Activities Committee. Sue Hamilton was named as Chairman of the Quilt Committee.

Since March 1975 the Bicentennial Committee has sponsored or activated many projects - Old Time Fiddlers dance - Hand-sewn quilt - participated in Old Home Day and Fair Day Activities - Horse Show - Four H, tree planting project - Community church circle - designed a plate of East Lempster Church - The Friends of the Library donated \$50.00 worth of books appropriate for the Bicentennial to the Lempster Library - Commemorative Bicentennial medals of Lempster were sponsored by the committee.

Lempster was designated a Bicentennial Community and an official ceremony for the presentation of the Bicentennial flag was held at Union Hall. Over 200 people were in attendance - flower planting project started in 1975 to continue in spring of "'76" - Town hall renovation and park area started on the old barn site. Received \$500 matching grant from A.R.B.A. which was used to buy materials for the Town Hall project. Free labor is needed to finish this project.

In the state of N.H. only 100 grants were available. At this time only 38 communities have qualified.

Due to the fact that we received the grant to restore the old hall, N.H. Historical Society has offered to nominate the Union Hall Building to be designated as a historical site.

On Old Home Day, August 21, 1976, the die for the commemorative medals will be broken. Numbers 1 - 2 - 3 of the silver medals will be auctioned off.

We wish to thank all the people in Lempster who have helped to make our projects so successful.

The Bicentennial Committee has many activities planned for 1976. We hope the citizens of Lempster will continue to take part in celebrating our country's 200th anniversary.

#### REPORT OF UPPER VALLEY-LAKE SUNAPEE COUNCIL

The Council - until three years ago known as the Upper Valley Planning and Development Commission - has been undergoing a period of rapid growth and change. From what originated as an economic development association, it has become a comprehensive regional planning agency. And, where it originally served just six towns, it now serves thirty-one communities. The Council operates on an annual budget of about \$100,000. It is under the direction of a 47 member board of directors composed of two directors from each of its 31 member communities. The membership dues from local communities (Lempster's share for the coming year, figured on a per capita basis will be just \$274.00) account for only 30 percent of the Council's total revenue. The remainder, 70 percent, comes from various state and federal sources. Many programs have been undertaken with that money. There are large-scale regional studies which benefit residents of all member towns. Last year, a major emphasis was on solid waste, to help towns meet the state-mandated deadline for closing dumps. This year, there have been studies on area transportation needs and on housing and land use needs, which will help towns qualify for various federal-aid programs. In addition, staff assistance is available to most communities via a popular technical services program with help given in such diverse areas as subdivision regulations, land use maps, new zoning ordinances, planning for new municipal facilities and the many technical and graphic needs inherent in these programs, services small communities cannot afford. The technical assistance that Lempster's planning board received in putting together subdivision regulations this year came as a direct result of belonging to this council.

#### PLANNING BOARD REPORT OF LEMPSTER

By authority granted June 23, 1975 at Special Town Meeting, the Lempster Planning Board was established and given authority to administer the floor plain areas of the town, as provided by the federal Flood Insurance Program, as well as to adopt subdivision regulations for the town. The fivemember board was appointed by Selectmen and held its first official meetings on July 31st. Since that time, seven public meetings were held for the purpose of reviewing various subdivision plans in order to prepare a plan for the town. On February 9, 1976, and after holding a Public Hearing on that date, the board voted to adopt regulations based on a model plan prepared in conjunction with the Office of State Planning and the Upper Valley Lake Sunapee Council. The reasons for adopting this plan are threefold: first, to definitely meet the state and federal requirements for Lempster's participation in the Flood Insurance Program; second, to provide an adequate and comprehensive plan for orderly and positive subdivision growth in the town and, third, to coordinate Lempster's efforts with those of other towns in the region who have adopted similar, longreaching plans.

In addition, the board has taken action on several requests for Flood Hazard building permits and has begun, voluntarily, the additional project of up-grading the town flood hazard map in conjunction with the Soil Conservation Service and the Sugar River Watershed agencies.

Planning Board meetings are scheduled for the first Monday of each month at 7:30 p.m. in the Selectmen's office in East Lempster and all interested persons are welcome to attend. Copies of the Subdivision Regulations are available from the Town Clerk or from any member of the board.

# NEWPORT AREA HOME HEALTH AGENCY 87 Sunapee Street Newport, New Hampshire 03774

January 17, 1976

The Newport Area Home Health Agency services are available to all participating towns for the following treatments ordered by a doctor: blood pressure readings, injections, dressings, baths, enemas, diabetic instruction, diet teaching, rehabilitation, health supervision and our second service is Physical Therapy.

Also our nurses provide instruction and guidance to expectant mothers, new mothers and babies, family planning, handicapped children and adults.

The agency has preschool immunization clinics every other month and is assisted by local doctors and the New Hampshire State Department of Health and Welfare. Provided at these clinics are oral Polio vaccines, Diphtheria, Tetanus and Whooping Cough vaccines (DPT), Measles vaccines, and Mumps vaccines.

The agency also works very closely with the New Hampshire State Bureau of Communicable Disease in monitoring TB cases and contacts of TB cases, hepatitis outbreaks, measles epidemics and other communicable disease problems.

The agency has reestablished the well child clinics for low income families with Dr. Litman's help, the new pediatrician in Newport. These are held once a month.

The director of the agency, Mary Gallant, also works with the Newport Hospital discharge coordinator to help patients there to plan for an easier transition to home after discharge. The agency in this way finds patients needing skilled nursing care at home after discharge from the hospital. If the agency is unable to assist possible patients, the agency refers them to the appropriate agency such as: The New Hampshire State Welfare Department, Town or County Welfare, Vocational Rehabilitation, Mental Health Centers, Planned Parenthood, Alcoholics Anonymous and Alcoholic Rehabilitation Programs, drug rehabilitation programs, Senior Citizens, Crippled Children's Services, Maternal and Child Health Services, Heart Disease Program, Special Health Services, Convulsive Disorders Clinics, Cancer Commission, Cystic Fibrosis Clinics and other Home Health agencies.

The Newport Area Home Health Agency is certified yearly thru Medicare. Medicare and Welfare patients usually receive services free as Medicare and Welfare reimburse the agency directly. The agency has a contract with Blue Cross/Blue Shield to provide skilled nursing care and physio-therapy to patients in their homes in lieu of hospitalization only. Any person requiring services that the agency can provide will get care, either on a sliding scale fee or fre hospitalization only. Any person requiring services that the agency can provide will get care, either on a sliding scale fee if unable to pay. (This is paid for by town appropriation-your tax dollars.)

The agency has a program of ongoing inservice education in conjunction with the New Hampshire Board of Continuing Education, New Hampshire Heart Association, New Hampshire Lung Association, New Hampshire Department of Health thru closed circuit TV programs, and other seminars put on by various health professionals.

Total number of SNV for 1975 in Lempster = 111.

#### NEWPORT AMBULANCE SERVICE

The Newport Ambulance Service answered 438 calls during 1975.

The Ambulance Service, the vehicles, and the crew members are all licensed with the state and meet all requirements above regulations. Over 90% of the members are now licensed "Emergency Medical Technicians." This represents a great many hours of training for each member.

Coverage to the area towns has continued this year. Each town that we have covered with service has helped to support the Ambulance Service with tax assistance based on population, at \$2.00 per head. The Ambulance Service hopes to continue service to all communities in our area again in 1975.

The Ambulance Service has also responded to all major fires, in all communities. This is added protection of life and limb to all concerned.

The Newport Police Department has continued to serve as our dispatcher and has proven very valuable to our service and response time. Our telephone number for emergencies is 863-2355.

#### REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Upon the recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey Bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.

#### FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

1975 was a busy year with chimney fires, drills, training, musters, meetings, and fund raising.

The record shows six chimney fires (four of them in the Spring), one dump fire and two brush fires. With wood coming back as a heating fuel, chimney fires have increased over the one or two of previous years.

During the year we entered into competition with Goshen and Unity at three different musters. Much valuable training went into two of these musters. With the use of a preconnected line, installed after 1974's Fall Training, four men can get water from a pond in less than a minute. This preconnected line also makes it possible for one trained man to hold a fire until more help arrives.

In addition to local training, several of the members went to State Fire Schools on Basic Fire Ground Command, Forest Fire Training, Pump Training and Service Testing, Flammable Liquid Fire Fighting, and LP Gas Fires. The full fire gear, which we have purchased, has been invaluable for the protection of the members and was required for some of these courses.

This has been a year of change for the Department. A fire during the March meeting and the resulting delay in getting out fire equipment prompted the installation of a phone in the fire house. Having Special Information Services answer the fire phone has been very successful.

Letters were sent to all the members in April stating that no response from them would remove their name from the membership list. Sixteen members did not respond and, therefore, their names were removed. As of the April meeting, new members are taken in on a six month probationary period. Four have sought membership under this new by-law. One of the women and one of the men have been taken in as members. One resigned after six months and the other is on his six month probation.

During the year, approximately 453 man hours have been put in by members of the Department in meetings and training. This excludes fires and the enormous amount of time spent maintaining, improving and repairing equipment.

### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District:

### ENROLLMENT ...

The present number of students totals 133 in Grades 1-8.

Fifty-three students are attending high school: one at Keene, two at Claremont, and fifty at Newport.

Mention should be made of the increase in enrollment since September 1975. The September figure of 121 has now risen to 133 - an increase of 12 students - or 10%.

### STAFF...

There are no changes this year in regular staff positions. An expansion of services was provided by employing an Art instructor for one day per week.

Increased federal funding under E.S.E.A. Title I has made it possible to employ a specialist in Learning Disabilities on a two-day per week basis and a full-time Aide to assist in working daily with the students identified for this help.

These added instructional services should aid immensely in up-grading the training in the early years of schooling and make for a better adjustment to secondary school for some students.

With 154 school districts in New Hampshire operating elementary schools, 126 had a higher per-pupil cost and 27 had a lower per-pupil cost in 1974-75.

### BUDGET ...

An attempt has been made by the School Board to keep the expenditures within reasonable limits in spite of continued rising prices and especially in light of the substantial increase in enrollment. This has caused the re-arrangement of bus schedules and the addition of a third route.

The greatest increase (\$14,500) comes in high school tuition charges. An increase over last year of ten students in Grade 8 (14 to 24) makes it necessary to provide the funds for this large group to enter Grade 9 next fall. This is coupled with an increase in tuition charges at each of the receiving high schools. Rates per students for 1976-77 are as follows:

### CONCLUSION ...

Auxiliary services are being provided in a very satisfactory manner — transportation and custodial services by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Newton. The Lunch Program is now managed by Mrs. Janie Miller and is operating within the limits of a tight food budget.

The school program includes many worthwhile projects and activities which are detailed in the Principal's Report. I am pleased to commend the staff for both the interest and time devoted to many "extras" that go to enrich the school experience of the students.

### REPORT OF TEACHING PRINCIPAL

In a continuing effort to provide for individual differences among students, the pattern of organization in curriculum offerings was expanded to accommodate a more flexible grouping situation dealing with reading abilities of students. Each faculty member engaged in a broader teaching load involving a level capability program. This involved the placing of students (grades 4-8) in various subject matter categories according to their reading comprehension levels. Significant success was noted in this first-year trial organization. Teachers were assigned as follows:

- Nancy Richard 1st and 2nd grade
- Jan Bradeen 2nd and 3rd grade, and including a 4th grade group in Social Studies
- Ann Schroeder 4th grade in Language Arts, Math, Science, Reading; 5th grade in all subjects, and 6th grade in English.
- John Bonfiglio 6th, 7th, and 8th grade science and math, but working in groups spanning a wide level capabilities of students
- David Cronin 6th, 7th, and 8th grade Social Studies and English, also working in groups spanning a wide level capabilities of students.

Within each subject level were a number of students either from a lower or higher grade, based on individual difference of learning ability.

The availability of additional funds through TITLE I, ESEA made possible the employment of a special Learning Disabilities Teacher, Mrs. Therese Kramer through a cooperative arrangement with Newport. Under Mrs. Kramer's direction, a full-time Aide, Mr. Ronald Purmort, was added to assist Mrs. Kramer in activities dealing with math, reading, and other learning disabilities.

Betty Lohman returned to her duties as Library Aide, but this year's full-time employment included duties as receptionist, and Aide to the Principal and to other staff members as directed by Mr. Cronin.

With the addition of an Art Teacher, Jan Struble and a music teacher, Alan Peterson, we came close to realizing the N. H. Minimum Standards for Elementary Schools. Each comes to the school once a week to work at all grade levels.

Mrs. Jane Miller replaced Mrs. Hooper as cook for the hot lunch program and continues to provide delicious and nutritious meals.

In addition to serving lunches, our Cafetorium is used for peer tutors, music and art activities, sewing, supervised student meetings for projects, and recess periods when indoor activities are in order. During these inclement days, ping-pong equipment is provided.

In class and during activity periods, students were involved in Fire Prevention Week, Honor Society Programs for the Newport Nursing Home, and participation in such programs as the Lempster Bicentennial at which a 7th and 8th grade play was presented.

Among the field trips scheduled included (1) the Newport Library (expanding our Library Science offering). (2) visits to book displays in the area by Mrs. Lohman and her library students, (3) the traditional Eighth Grade Class Trip - last year an educational tour of New York City, and (4) a trip to Squam Lake Science Exhibition by Mr. Bonfiglio's class.

I would like to express my thanks and appreciation to the faculty and auxiliary teaching staff and aides for their work in helping to create a good student-learning climate. Sincere gratitude goes out to parents, guardians, and friends of the Goshen-Lempster community, as well as to the school board and administration for their support in providing good education for all our children.
