To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lincoln in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

9. How much money will be raised for Cemeteries.
10. How much money will be raised for Public Library.
11. How much money will be raised for Support of Town Poor.

12. How much money will be raised for Old Age Assistance.

13. How much money will be raised for Maintenance of Water Department.

14. How much money will be raised for White Mt. Regions Assoc.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,000.00 and Interest to take up Water Bonds due July 1, 1953.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$2,000.00, to be set aside as a Reserve Fund for the purchase of a new snowplow in the future.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$59.84 for T. R. A. work, the State to contribute the sum of \$398.90.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$600.00 for a 4th of July Celebration.

20. To see what action the town will take in regard to the spraying of the town against insects and appropriate money for same.

21. To see if the Town will vote to allow the collector of taxes additional compensation for his services in collecting the state head tax and to fix the amount thereof.

22. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Lincoln for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Scope of Audit

Included in the audit and examination were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Municipal Court.

Financial Statements

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1951 and December 31, 1952, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$2,401.20 in 1952.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits C & D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$3,885.00, less a net revenue surplus of \$3,204.12, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$680.88.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures:

(Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1952, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance, as of December 31, 1952, is indicated in Exhibit F.

Statement of Bonded Debt: (Exhibit M)

A statement of bonded indebtedness as of December 31, 1952, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit M.

Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

General Comments

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased from \$2,558.82 to \$2,960.02 during 1952 as shown by the following statement:

Purchase of Highway Equipment:

It will be noted that the comparative statement of appropriations and expenditures indicates an overdraft of \$6,446.50 on account of the purchase of new highway equipment.

In explanation of this transaction it may be stated that the town meeting of March 1952 made an appropriation of \$6,300.00 for the purchase of highway equipment. However, due to the fact that the budget committee did not include this item in its recom-

TOWN OF LINCOLN

mended budget, and furthermore because no specific article relative thereto was contained in the town warrant, the Tax Commission ruled that the \$6,300.00 appropriation could not legally be raised by taxation in the 1952 assessment.

Because of the fact, however, that the Town closed the fiscal year of 1952 with a current surplus of \$2,960.02, as heretofore noted, there appears to be no necessity for raising the \$6,300.00 by taxation.

Capital Reserve Fund:

The town meeting of March 1952 voted "to raise \$2,000.00 to be set aside as a Reserve Fund for the purchase of a new snowplow in the future." This amount should be transferred from the general fund of the town to the custody of the trustees of trust funds in accordance with the law relative to capital reserve funds. (Laws of 1943, Chapter 160, Section 8.)

Conclusion:

The accounts and records of the town officials which we examined were found in good condition and the accounting and financial procedure, with exceptions as herein noted, conform to the uniform system prescribed by this Division.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual report.
