WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon, on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations for the same.
3. To hear reports of agents and auditors heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of the highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to issue druggists' permits to any druggist who is a registered pharmacist doing business in Lisbon to sell liquor for medical use upon a physician's prescription, under the provision of Chapter 147, Sec. 14, of the Laws of 1917.
6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how the same shall be divided.
7. To see if the town will vote to discount all taxes paid on or before July 5, 1926.

8. To see if the town will vote to light the streets of Lisbon Village District all night during the entire year; Sugar Hill from the dwelling of Ozro Streeter to the Hotel Lookoff, the Baptist church through Lovers' Lane to Franconia line, from Goodnow school house to the Homestead, and from the Lisbon and Franconia town line to the dwelling of Joseph Pelletier. Sugar Hill and vicinity to be lighted the entire year until midnight and from 5 a. m. until daylight. All of the above premises to be lighted with electricity; and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the benefit of the District Nursing Association.

10. To see what action the town will take towards applying for State aid for the maintenance of the trunk line and State aid highways, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money to secure the same.

11. To see if the town will vote to apply for State aid construction, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to properly observe Old Home Day.

13. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate four hundred dollars to help destroy the White Pine blister.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars to straighten and improve the highway leading from Lyman line near the Cole place, so-called, by the residence of Gervais Richards to the line of Lisbon Precinct.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars to improve the highway leading from the residence of Dwight Parker past the Bishop farm to the Lyman road.

17. To see if the town will vote to improve the road beginning at the cement bridge over the outlet from Pearl Lake and continuing to the Landaff line, in conjunction with the State, at a cost not exceeding two thousand dollars, one-third to be borne by the town and the balance by the State, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise three hundred dollars to complete the cement sidewalk leading from the Sunset Hill House to the Homestead on Sugar Hill.

19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for lighting Barrett's station at North Lisbon.

20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars for the improvement of the road leading from the Baptist church on Sugar Hill to Peckett's.

21. To see if the town will vote to accept the state aid bridge law for cement bridges, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to oil the road from the corner at the Homestead on Sugar Hill, past the Sunset Hill House to Hotel Lookoff, and the road leading to Peckett's from its intersection with the Franconia road, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

23. To see what action the town will take towards fixing the compensation of the tax collector.

24. To see if the town will vote to appoint a Town Forest committee to investigate the merits of the town

forest proposition and report at the March meeting next year.

25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the money paid for the lot where the new library is being constructed.

26. To see if the town will authorize the tax collector to appoint deputies.

27. To see if the town will vote to heat the selectmen's rooms, court room, lockup, and fire department with steam, independent of the town hall, and to raise and appropriate the money for the same.

28. To see if the town will vote to build a suitable building, in conjunction with the Precinct, for storing tools and machinery, and to raise and appropriate the necessary funds for the same.

29. To see how much the town will vote to raise and appropriate to assist in building a receiving tomb in Grove Hill Cemetery.

30. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars for the purpose of improving the road leading from the outlet of Pearl Lake to Sugar Hill.

31. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars to improve the road leading from Hildex corner to Mallery's gate on Sugar Hill.

32. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars towards repairing and painting the scenery in the town hall.

33. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to purchase the gravel loader and conveyor purchased by the selectmen last fall.

34. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the cross road leading from the Breezy Hill farm buildings to the Georgeville road, and known as the new road.

35. To see if the town will vote to place insurance upon the Hotel Moulton under the same conditions as before the fire, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
